

Being "Uncommon"

I have great admiration for Tony Dungy. Not because he coached the Indianapolis Colts to victory at Super Bowl XLI – even though I was a huge Colts fan when Johnny Unitas played for them in Baltimore – but because of the way he lives his life. If you have not read his books Quiet Strength, Uncommon, The Mentor Leader: Secrets to Building People and Teams that Win Consistently and The One Year Uncommon Life Daily Challenge, please put them on your to list to read.

"Success is uncommon, therefore not to be enjoyed by the common man. I'm looking for uncommon people."

When Coach Cal Stoll spoke these words to Dungy and the rest of the freshman football team at the University of Minnesota, Stoll had no idea how they would be remembered. However, Dungy carried them with him through his days as a student, as an NFL player and as the first African-American coach to win the Super Bowl.

Uncommon is a great description for the members of National Swine Registry. These people have made the commitment to be involved in the production of purebred Duroc, Hampshire, Landrace or Yorkshire swine and work diligently to improve these genetic lines. NSR is blessed with some of the industry's greatest minds in livestock breeding, who accept the challenges and disappointments that take place.

They do the uncommon things like ear notching within seven days of birth, collecting birth and weaning weights, sending in litter registrations and then following up by transferring animals sold to junior members for their projects or to other senior members for use in their respective breeding programs. Of course, all this

takes place after they've selected gilts to be retained as replacements or purchased new elite females from outside their herd and chosen a sire (whether it is a sire they bred or a boar from one of the AI studs).

They do a lot of research and development. They drive miles and miles to locate a potential herdsire, to evaluate a set of pigs out of a specific boar or to look at boars at a particular stud. They spend time on the phone talking about hogs. They study the lineage of animals in their respective breed population.

All of these activities are uncommon, and I can relate to the disappointment experienced when a 'can't miss' mating of a

they expected and for less. It takes an uncommon person to do this over and over again (especially when they do not experience the results they were anticipating).

Our breeders are willing to share their knowledge and experience with newcomers into our industry – talk about uncommon! How many mainstays in other industries are willing to share their knowledge, experiences and ideas to help another person or organization be successful?

They are willing to step up and serve as leaders for their respective breeds or for National Swine Registry. In this issue, there are several of these uncommon


Plans are funny things. Most of the time when we make them, we aren't really the ones who control their outcome. It's no surprise that I'm not a high school agri-science teacher living

I would spend countless hours reading articles about the industry, talking to animal science professors and visiting with producers. I even focused my graduate research on U.S. beef producers' use of social media and ran a marathon as part of Kansas "Team Beef." It was also during that time that I started following Amanda Radke's

Baker inducted into National Barrow Show[®] Hall of Fame



Dan Baker was inducted into the National Barrow Show Hall of Fame during the 66th Annivesary of the event held Sept. 8-12 in Austin, Minn. Mike Paul (I), president of the National Association of Swine Records, and Amanda Tiedmann (r) of Hormel Foods presented Baker with the award.

Dan Baker of West Lafayette, Ind., was inducted into the Hall of Fame at the 66th National Barrow Show* held Sept. 8-12 in Austin, Minn.

Baker's enthusiasm for pigs and the auction business both began at an early age and only grew stronger throughout his life. By sharing this passion, Baker placed the purebred swine industry in a better position, the National Barrow Show® included.

Baker became a field representative for the National Spotted Swine Record in 1964, which was just the beginning of his involvement in the purebred swine industry. In 1967, Wilbur Plager hired Baker as the assistant executive secretary and managing editor of the Yorkshire Journal. Plager wrote of Baker, 'The Yorkshire business is not a one man show. It has not been for some time, but to hire the kind of man that I want and you want to represent Yorkshires are not plentiful, and when you do find them, they are not easy to hire. Dan Baker is a fine young man interested in better hogs, and you can be proud that is he is working for you."

In 1975, Baker left the American Yorkshire Club to follow his dream of becoming a full-time auctioneer in the purebred swine industry. Baker estimates he has sold over 3,500 auctions and worked the ring in 1,000 more. He was the auctioneer for the all-time record-selling boar at \$220,000, which happened to be the Yorkshire boar called CEO.

The NSR staff would like to thank Dan for his years of service to the purebred swine industry, and congratulate him on being named the 2012 Hall Of Fame inductee.

Baas Presented with National Barrow Show[®] Distinguished Service Award

Dr. Tom Baas of Ames, Iowa, was presented the Distinguished Service Award at the 66th National Barrow Show* in Austin, Minn.

Over the years, Baas has contributed his talents in many different arenas at the NBS*. He first attended the "World Series of Swine Shows" as a member of his family's purebred swine operation, Lester Baas and Sons, in the 1960s. He returned the the event in 1971 as a member of the Iowa State livestock judging team.

While attending Iowa State University (ISU) in Ames, Baas served as the Block and Bridle President and was recognized as the outstanding senior in the animal science program. In 1972, he was hired as the Southwest field representative for the United Duroc Swine Registry. While serving in this position, Baas increased breeder participation from his region of the United States. In 1974, he was promoted to associate editor of the *Duroc News*, where he encouraged breeder participation in the NBS°.

Baas moved back to Iowa in 1976, but he remained involved in the purebred Duroc business and exhibited animals at NBS°. In the early '80s, he returned to ISU to pursue his doctoral degree. He then became a professor at the University of Tennessee in Knoxville until the United Duroc Swine Registry announced him as the executive secretary in 1992. While serving in this role, Baas assisted in the formation of the National Swine Registry. Once that merger was complete, Baas returned to his alma mater as a professor in the animal science department.

The Iowa Test Station became home to the NBS® Progeny Test in 2003, and Baas has overseen this testing program since that time. He coordinates the collection of data, making many trips to the cooler at Hormel. Baas is also active in scoring the judging contest at the NBS® and serves as a moderator for the shows.



Red Hogs, The Pursuit Happiness By Katie Maupin

Guy Jackson of Warren, Ind., is known as the patriarch of J Genetics. With more than half a century's experience raising red hogs, he's a familiar face in the purebred circles. Jackson is a man known for his quick smile, as much as he is the quality red gilts that he and his family have built for years. One thing is certain, few things mean as much to Jackson as good red hogs and his family.

uy Jackson has stood the test of time. He is not a hobbyist – he has created both a life and a living for his family by breeding Duroc hogs," says fellow Duroc breeder Dave Stewart. "Anyone who knows Guy Jackson knows that his ultimate love is his family – breeding hogs and his family. A lot of people give lip service to that, but Guy Jackson is living it."

Through decades of industry changes, Jackson has proven his commitment to the Duroc breed time and time again, as he carved out a living for his family and built a legacy to pass on to future generations.

The beginning

Every successful operation has to start somewhere, and Jackson's began in 1956 with the purchase of a Grand and Reserve Champion boar and gilt and a stroke of luck. After turning the two in a pen together with a self feeder, the first litter of Jackson-bred red hogs was born.

A lot has changed in the purebred swine industry since 1956, but Jackson's genetics have stood the test of time and proven their worth in 10 different countries. From the days when his boar sales alone fed his family, while his herdsire prospects proved themselves at test stations, to today where showpig projects drive most of his sales, Jackson's goals have remained constant.

"Structural soundness, a good underline and productivity – we just try not to lose sight of that. And if we can add muscle, we do it," he explained. "But putting the family back into the operation was always a long-term goal of ours here."

From just Jackson to JJ Genetics

Anyone who has ever brought family into a farming operation knows it can be as challenging as it is rewarding. But for Jackson, it came together in 1999, almost as easily as the name 'JJ Genetics.'

The name JJ Genetics comes from 'Jackson' and 'Johnson,' his son-in-law Mike's last name. But it is also the initials of Guy's two grandchildren, Jackson and Jada.

If you ask the whole family how

Although Jackson and JJ Genetics have long been known for their quality Duroc females, they were recognized in 2011 when their boar was placed on Hog College® Row. Their BEBO GRUS Hoosier 1-6 son made the trip from Warren, Ind., to serve as an ambassador for his breed before finding a new home with Shipley Swine Genetics, Ohio.

they've learned to work so well together, they'll likely chuckle.

"Well, Mike had never seen a pig before he married Karen, so he had a lot of learning to do," jokes Jackson.

Mike laughs, saying they'll discuss that comment later, while adding that they all learn from each other every day.

"There's not a day that goes by that you don't learn something new," Mike says.

His children, Jackson and

Jada, can attest to that.

Jackson explains raising and showing hogs with the JJ Genetics herdmark isn't always a walk in the park, since you're expected to do your very best. But it's an enjoyable experience that has taught him much more about the industry than purchasing a prospect and feeding it for four months.

Jada agrees. "I enjoy it. There's a lot more responsibility that goes with it than just buying them."

Although the Jackson family may tease each other, Dan Baker, past National Swine Registry employee and long-time auctioneer, admires their relationship.

Jackson's advertisement in a 1973 edition of *Duroc News* showcased two of the breed changing boars that he raised: Big Bear and Columbus. At the time, these two individuals were thought to push the envelope, and they would go on to influence the pedigrees of many red hogs.

"I've seen lots of families hand down operations from generation to generation, and some work really well and others just don't. They seem to mix real well there." he says. "I admire someone like Guy who has been successful - very successful – and still lets the next generations make their own decisions, like handing over the reins, so to speak."

Baker, who is known to have a bit of a sense of humor himself, points out that the family's ability to laugh and smile together helps make

their relationship stronger.


"They're a very dedicated family, but they never take themselves so seriously that they couldn't laugh," he says. "No matter what happens, they've always been able to pick themselves up and smile."

The JJ Genetics crew has also been able to supply Baker with some information he used in some of his famous pranks. Although according to Baker – it's best for people to just ask him about that in person.

The swing vote

Perhaps it's the eternal optimist in Jackson and his never-fail attitude that made him the prime candidate to help the United Duroc Swine Registry through troubled times as the board president.

Although most Duroc enthusiasts can pick Jackson out of a crowd, or at least recognize him as a familiar face at NSR events, perhaps not all of them know that the future of the National Swine Registry and the Duroc breed once landed squarely on Jackson's shoulders.

When making the decision to remain independent or join the American Yorkshire Club and the Hampshire Swine Registry as part of the National Swine Registry, Jackson held the final vote. As the president of the board, he was the official tiebreaker – and the ultimate decider.

Before even calling for the vote, Jackson's intuition told him that there would likely be a tie, so he wrote down his decision on a piece of paper before the meeting.

"It was a stressful day, but you look back, and I think it is one of the best things to ever happen," he says.

Those who know Jackson best know, he's not afraid to take a stand for what is right, or make sacrifices for what he believes in.

Stewart, who served on the Duroc board with Jackson, recalls a time when both he and Jackson went to the bank to secure a loan for the Duroc registry during hard financial times.

Dr. Tom Baas was serving as the Duroc registry executive secretary when Jackson made that final vote to join

the NSR. Baas says Jackson's leadership was instrumental to the changes that happened, and his caring attitude helped steer the breed in the right direction.

"One thing I admire about Guy Jackson and his family the most is their honesty and integrity, and the way they run their business. They're doing things the right way. They're always kind and friendly to everybody. And if you want to sum it up, Guy is just a good guy," Baas says. "He's someone that I've always had a tremendous amount of respect for, just because he treats people so well."

A foundation with integrity

In many ways, it isn't only his knack for breeding hogs that Jackson is passing onto his family, but also the reputation of a firm built upon good values and honesty.

"This business is not an easy business. Guy's ability to breed hogs that breed on is certainly a strong point, but the strongest is his reputation," Baker says. "Once they earned their good reputation, they never lost it."

Stewart says that Jackson and his family's commitment to improving the Duroc breed continuously sets them apart.

"Ultimately, I think the greatest key to his success is his absolute love for Duroc hogs. Other than his family, it has been the absolute focus of his life ever since I've known him," he says. "He's not a guy who sits in a tavern and talks about breeding hogs, he's the guy who does it, and loves it. He gives his total being and thought process to making a better hog."

This constant quest for better breeding stock is emphasized in

the bottom side of JJ Genetics pedigrees.

"I think one of the best parts is his emphasis on making better Duroc females," Baas says. "Guy was always known for having very good females. When he brought one to a show,

you could bank on the fact that they would be very good and very competitive. Jackson females are just very good."

True to their roots, the second and third generations at JJ Genetics also focus on making good females.

"We've always kept the structure, soundness, thickness and frame size right where we wanted it," Mike says.

Jackson adds, "We keep our sow herd in the middle, and reach out with the boars. At the same time, we always breed some females to boars that will make good gilts."

And as Mike will tell you, if you look through prospects at JJ Genetics, you'll often hear the dam's side of the pedigree first.

"We just keep striving to get better," Jackson says. "We are never going to have the perfect hog, but that's not going to keep us from trying."

For generations to come

Today, the third generation of JJ Genetics is old enough to start making future plans. Jackson will attend a junior college to judge livestock this fall – a passion attributed to his time showing pigs and one run in with Al Snedegar

The youngest member of JJ Genetics, Jada Johnson, lent a helping hand at the 2012 World Pork Expo auction. It also gave her a front seat to the action. when he was 4 years old. Although he doesn't know where his future will take him, one thing is sure – he will stay involved in the agricultural industry.


Jada, although younger, has a very definite set of goals, which includes carrying on her family's tradition on their century old farm for years and years to come.


"I either want to live here at Grandpa's house or in my house, and keep this farm going for another 100 years," she says with determination.



Understanding

In today's world of swine production,

"flu" is a word that is somewhat
taboo. A disease outbreak - of
any kind - can cause damage to
the reputation of pork producers,
put a halt to exhibiting pigs
at local or national shows and
send an already volatile export
market into a downward spiral.

But, as with many hot topic issues in agriculture, producers can help bridge the gap between misperception and reality

for consumers and the public. Whether it's keeping your herd healthy, protecting public health or knowing what to say about the flu to a fair-goer, arming yourself with information

in disaster prevention.

is the first step

What is Influenza?

Influenza, or the flu, is a contagious respiratory illness caused by the influenza virus that infects the nose, throat and lungs. This virus has circulated in both humans and animals for centuries. Because the influenza virus is very adaptable and has the ability to swap gene components to create new viruses, public health professionals must continually assess current viruses to properly manage the flu within the human population.

How does the flu virus get passed from pigs to people and vice versa?

"Flu viruses, in general, are constantly changing in both the human and animal populations, and movement of these viruses is not unexpected between animals and humans," says Dr. Jennifer Koeman, director of producer and public health for the Pork Checkoff.

According to the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), flu viruses spread primarily by droplets emitted when an infected person or animal coughs or sneezes. If these droplets land on the nose or mouth of another individual, that person or animal can become infected. The virus can also be spread if it gets on an individual's hands, and that person then touches his or her eyes, nose or mouth.

Why were there several cases of the flu this summer reported from swine shows?

This summer, there were several cases of influenza reportedly contracted from pigs at fairs and swine exhibitions across the country. Investigations revealed that this particular strain of the flu virus, H3N2v, circulates in the U.S. swine population, but can also be transmitted to people who have prolonged exposure to pigs, according to the CDC.

"From what we're seeing, these cases are occurring mostly in children who are exhibiting pigs and have close contact with those animals over a relatively long period of time," Koeman says. "These H3N2v influenza cases have exhibited the same sort of symptoms as the seasonal flu, with no sustained human-to-human transmission."

Children have been more susceptible because they have little preexisting immunity to the virus.

What do I call the flu when it's passed between pigs and people?

Swine producers, in both the commercial and showpig sectors, remember all too well the negative impact the term "swine flu" had on the pork industry in 2009. This term generated both fear and misunderstanding among the public that pork and pork products may not be safe.

"Sometimes people get confused about what they should call influenza viruses that occur in both people and pigs," Koeman says.

To prevent another such misnomer, in 2011 the World Health Organization announced a standardized naming convention for influenza.

A flu virus that normally circulates in the pig population but may cross over and infect a human is referred to as a variant influenza virus.

"It's called 'variant' because it varies from infecting only the species that is its usual host," Koeman explains. This is the case with the most recent H3N2v virus.

"The bottom line is, influenza is not in the meat – it is a respiratory disease," Koeman says. "So, pork and pork products are safe to handle and eat."

What is the difference between H1N1, H3N2 and other forms of the influenza virus?

There are three main types of influenza viruses – A, B and C. Of these, only type A viruses are a concern for the health of pigs and transmission between pigs and people. Within type A influenza, there are several subtypes, which are defined and named by two main proteins: hemagglutinin (the H portion) and neuraminidase (the N portion). These subtypes are distinguished by differences in their genetic sequence.

These genes are carried on segments of nucleic acid (RNA). Dr. Lisa Becton, Pork Checkoff's director of swine health information and research, explains that this makes mutation of the virus extremely easy and allows components of human, swine and avian

genes to mix and form an entirely new virus sequence. The severity of each virus and its ability to be transmitted between species is dependent upon that specific gene sequence.

"Not all influenzas act the same. We have to test for the full sequencing of the virus to know what we're dealing with," Becton says.

How do I identify the flu in myself or in my pigs?

Becton says that with the flu, whether in people or in pigs, there are going to be clear signs of infection. In both the porcine and human populations, signs of influenza include coughing, increased respiratory rate, fever and mucus discharge from the nose.

For humans, symptoms of an H3N2v infection are similar to those of the seasonal flu, and for that reason will often go undiagnosed.

Who is at risk?

Anyone can get the flu, but as with many other illnesses, there are certain groups at higher risk including children younger than 5, adults 65 years of age and older, women who are pregnant and those with certain chronic medical conditions. What can I do to keep myself, my family and my animals safe and healthy?

"Influenza is one of those diseases that does not discriminate between how a pig is raised – it will affect all types of pigs equally," Becton says. And although some people are at higher risk than others, people can have varying levels of immunity and still become infected. Below are some "common sense" tips for keeping you, your family and your herd healthy:

- 1. Get the seasonal flu vaccine. The CDC recommends that everyone, especially those considered high risk, get the flu vaccine each year. Komen also recommends that all swine producers, workers and their families get vaccinated. Although this won't prevent all strains of the influenza virus from being transmitted between you and your herd, it will reduce the risk of transmitting the human viruses you may carry into your herd. "This can affect herd health and, as we've seen, can mix and create new viruses. So you're protecting your herd health, but also protecting public health through preventing that transmission."
- 2. Don't take sick pigs to fairs or livestock exhibitions. If you are already at a show and notice your pig is sick, notify the vet at the event to determine the proper actions that should be taken.
- 3. When you come home from a show, isolate the pigs returning to the farm and disinfect your trailer and equipment. You should also do this when you purchase pigs and bring them home from another farm.
- 4. If you find a pig on your farm that is showing signs of influenza, separate it from the healthy animals. Ideally, sick animals should be kept in a completely isolated area, but that is not always possible, depending on your facilities. "Even if you can put a barrier between the pig that's sick and the ones that are not a board or some plastic anything that will prevent nose-to-nose contact and reduce the direct transfer of those respiratory droplets," says Becton. "We know that it is possible for the virus to travel by air, but we also know that some strains don't transmit as easily through the air. They transmit more in mucus and respiratory secretions."
- 5. If you have flu-like symptoms or become ill, it is best to stay out of the barns completely and have someone else take care of your pigs, even if it's just for a few days. "Typically, flu will shed within the first several days of infection," Becton explains. If having someone else help out is not an option, wearing a respiratory mask and gloves can help prevent shed. Becton also explains that less is more in terms of time spent in the barn when you're feeling a little under the weather. "A lot of times people will go in and spend a fair amount of time observing their pigs, washing them and brushing them. When you're feeling sick, spend a minimum amount of time in the barn and just do what you need to make sure your animals are ok then get back out."

- 6. Consider vaccinating your pigs. Several upcoming shows and events will require the influenza vaccination for any pigs being exhibited. Check the rules and regulations of events you plan to attend, and work with your herd veterinarian to determine appropriate vaccinations for your pigs.
- 7. Participate in the USDA's Swine Influenza Virus (SIV) Surveillance Program. "This allows us, as an industry, to understand how the viruses are changing and what's going on in the national swine herd," Koeman says. She adds that this information allows us to develop better vaccines, better disease diagnostics and put in place preventative measures to reduce the transmission of viruses between the swine and human populations. This demonstrates the pork industry's proactive approach in protecting both human and animal health to the public.

"It comes down to monitoring animal health, monitoring human health, and then taking those preventative measures to reduce disease transmission," Koeman says.

Becton echoes her colleague. "Many of these things may not prevent disease, but they can reduce the shed and spread of the virus – and that's where the rubber meets the road."



Implementing proper biosecurity on your farm is the best way to protect your herd from any type of disease, including influenza. Below are just a few tips to follow to keep you and your herd healthy.

- Clean and disinfect all farm equipment on a regular basis to reduce the number of pathogens that could be transmitted via the dirt and manure on the equipment. This is especially important when returning from a show or another farm where pathogens from outside animals could have been picked up.
- When purchasing pigs, make sure that the farm you are purchasing from is
 free from disease. Also be sure to isolate any new incoming pigs from the
 rest of your herd for a period of time for observation. Direct contact between
 infected and uninfected pigs is the easiest way to spread disease.
- Decrease the amount of traffic on your farm, both of vehicles and people walking through the swine barns. More traffic means more potential to spread pathogens and disease.
- Wear farm-specific clothing and shoes when working with your animals.
 Leave a pair of boots at the barn that you can slip on and off as you come and go.



The nominating committees have made their selections, and the 2013 NSR boards of directors candidates are ready to serve. Don't miss the chance to cast your vote. Ballots will be mailed Nov. 1 and should be returned to the NSR office by Nov. 29.

ELECTION-VOTING PROCEDURE

As a result of the uniform By-Laws created by the Long-Range Strategic Planning process, all four breed associations have adopted the following procedure for the upcoming election. If you are an active senior member of the American Yorkshire Club, the United Duroc Swine Registry, the Hampshire Swine Registry or the American Landrace Association, you will receive a ballot in November.

ARTICLE 6: BOARD OF DIRECTORS.

- 6.1 Number. A board of directors consisting of seven (7) members shall manage the affairs of the AYC, UDSR, HSR and ALA. One director should be elected from each of the three districts, with four directors serving as at-large representatives. The boundaries of each district will be based on membership, recordings and geography, and will be established by the NSR Executive Committee. District boundaries will be reviewed every three years thereafter, and after such review, the NSR Executive Committee shall revise the boundaries as it deems appropriate. At no time shall more than three directors be elected in the same year. No more than two members of one state can serve on the board at one time.
- 6.2 Tenure and Qualifications. Directors shall serve a term of three years or until their successors are elected or are appointed. The members of the board of directors must be active members of the AYC, UDSR, HSR or ALA, in good standing. No director shall serve a term of more than two consecutive three-year terms and must be off the board for three years before being re-elected to the board.
- 6.3 Nominations and Voting Procedure. The president and vice president will select a nominating committee. The committee will be made up of the following:
 - The president of the AYC, UDSR, HSR or ALA
 - The vice president of the AYC, UDSR, HSR or ALA
 - One member appointed by the president and vice president, from each district that has a vacancy occurring that year.
- a) The nominating committee must select nominees for the board in time for their names to be published in an official NSR publication prior to mailing of ballots. All eligible voting members will vote for all candidates in all districts, and the candidates at-large.
- b) There will be space provided on the official ballot for write-in candidates.
- c) Ballots will be mailed to all eligible active members.
- d) In order to vote in the election, an active member must have registered a litter during the fiscal year and must have paid their maintenance fee for the same period.
- e) Ballots will be mailed first class from the headquarters of the NSR. Prior to each election, the NSR Executive Committee shall set a date for the mailing of ballots to members, and a reasonable deadline for the return ballots. Only those ballots postmarked by the required date, and received at the NSR office, will be counted in the election.
- f) The candidate receiving the highest number of votes shall be elected as director.
- g) Newly elected directors' term will take effect following the first annual meeting after the election.





AT HOME

5. GOOD BARN-KEEPING

Keep your pens clean and dry to promote healthy skin and hair on your prospect.

4. GET SOME FRESH AIR

Don't just walk your pigs inside. Head out into the great outdoors as well.

3. CLEANLINESS IS NEXT TO GODLINESS

Keep your pigs clean. Wash and rinse them at home to work toward the best show ring look.

2. HEALTHY & HAPPY

Make sure your swine are feeling fine. If your project is healthy at home, they'll be less likely to get sick from the stress of being on the road and in a new environment.

1. WALK IT OUT

Walk your projects at home longer than what they will need to drive in a class. This will build stamina and decrease the chance that your entry will tire in the middle of a champion drive.

AT THE SHOW 5. A NEW HAIRCUT

Have your pigs clipped to increase their attractiveness. But before you wait to do this at the show, check the rules. Some shows do not allow clipping in the barns and others require the hair to be clipped to a certain length.

4. CLEAN BEDDING

Supply your pig with plenty of dry, clean bedding at shows. Your project will stay much cleaner and more comfortable.

3. CONDITION


Use a spray-on conditioner at shows to keep the skin and hair looking good. Talk to your local show supply company to get their suggestions.

The 2012 Hampshire Hog College® Boar was from Peter Farms of Mendon, Ill. This young prospect was sired by DMP0 Frozen In Time 31-2 and was a littermate to the 2012 Hampshire Hog College® Gilt. He sold to Kent Bargfrede of Alpha, Minn., for \$700.

Another very popular hog was the Earl L. Cain boar from Chariton, Iowa. This boar was heavy boned with a big rib and extra mass. He was sired by EC0 My Turn 84-5, and sold to Scott and Jayme Sieren of Keota, Iowa, for \$2,500.

Devin Goehring of Lowell, Wis., brought a pair of unique littermates to Austin. They were wide, top and bottom, and had a lot of muscle. This pair was sired by RASM8 Greeter 81-2. Shaffer's Gold Rush bought this pair for \$3,250 and \$13,000. These boars need to be sampled.

The 2012 Hampshire Hog College® Gilt led off the gilt sale. This DMP0 Frozen In Time 31-2 daughter was level made and good hipped with a bold rib and a high head carriage. The way she took a long stride coupled with her feminine yet powerful look should make her a foundation female at the Boerger Family Farm in Marysville, Ohio, for \$4,200.

The Champion Hampshire Gilt was from Jake and Kaylee Keppy of Durant, Iowa. She and her littermate stood one and two in Class 3. This was a really nice pair out of SJSF0 Tulsa 5-5. They sold for \$4,250 each to Dick and Zack Howell of Maroa, Ill. That's the way to buy foundation sows!

A HH0 Home Boy 100-3 daughter was named the Reserve Champion Hampshire Gilt from Kenneth Lane of Spragueville, Iowa. She was really sound and extra-pretty fronted. This gilt had a good chest and a wide, square hip. This balanced female sold to the Gibson Girls of Circleville, Ohio. She brought \$2,100.







The second week in September is always a busy time of year for our industry – boar studs are swamped trying to fill orders, and breeders are home trying to settle sows and harvest crops. But it's also a special time for many of our members because the "World Series of Swine Shows" has rolled around, and it's time to attend the National Barrow Show® in Austin, Minn. This year's event was no different. We were greeted with great weather and an amazing set of breeders and hogs. Mike McCoy of Bloomingburg, Ohio, sorted the Yorkshire ring at this prestigious event. Mike always takes a no-nonsense approach to sorting hogs and does a great job! Mike, thanks for your time and effort.

The Premier Yorkshire Sire was awarded to RWG0 Net Worth 233-1, owned by Chuck and Ben Olson of Irene, S.D., RW Genetics of Lometa, Texas, and Grimm Purebreds of Maynard, Iowa. The Reserve Premier Yorkshire Sire honors were presented to Purple Power Boar Stud, Chalmer, Ind., and Jack Rodibaugh and Sons of Rensselaer, Ind., for TBRO0 WOW 53-4. Congratulations to these firms on an excellent set of hogs.

This year's Champion Yorkshire Boar has got me fired up – he is a flat good one! Congratulations to Nelson Brothers Durocs of Wakonda, S.D., for letting this son of RWG0 Turn Table 234-1 go. This is one big-footed, heavy-structured Yorkshire boar. He is square at the ground, wide in his chest and has a massive shoulder that opens into a huge rib cage. He is square and correct in his hock and has the ideal frame and muscle for making barrows. Plus, he should have the ability to make the next generation of females better. If you are serious about breeding better Yorkshires, give Swine Genetics International of Cambridge, Iowa, a call to book semen. They bid \$21,000 to take this high-selling Yorkshire boar home.

I would describe the Reserve Champion Yorkshire Boar as

a potential barrow sire. He was exhibited by Western Illinois University-Ag Department. This son of TBRO0 WOW 53-4 has great show ring appeal from the side. He is tall fronted, level designed and correct in his ham loin junction. He is a square-built hog that is widest through his center and lower skeleton. He tracks away with genuine base width and is sound. He sold to Haleigh and Hayden Styer of Colfax, Wis., for \$600.

Next to the ring was the 2012 Yorkshire Hog College® Boar. Thank you to AJ DeOrnellas and Family for letting us have this son of JGR0 Bootlegger 210-6 to put on Hog College® Row. This boar offers a lot of good to the breed. He is tall fronted, really correct in his top line and ideal in his frame and length of body for making breeding hogs. This guy has a great shape to his rib; he is square at his knee and great in the angles to his hip, hock and rear pastern. He is a sound-moving boar that can really flex out of his hip. He sold to Lockman Genetics of Dighton, Kan., for \$3,000.

The youngest class-winning boar made his way to the ring next; he is an April 8 farrowed boar sired by CDO1 Spike 59-10 and shown by Thompson Brothers Genetics of Pleasantville, Ohio. Broc's boar looks like a young Yorkshire herd sire should; he reads to be a later-maturing hog as you study him. His toes all point in the same direction, and he hits the surface with a big, square toe. He is heavy structured for his age, has a square turn to the base of his rib cage and is open through his center. He has a square muscular turn down his top and a big muscular hip. Joe Coyne of Pontiac, Ill., bid \$3,000 to take this young prospect home.

The gilt sale began with a great female and we are thankful that Thompson Brothers Genetics allowed this gilt to represent the Yorkshire breed on Hog College® Row. Sired by LAK1 Double D 6-5, this gilt is stout and durable in her

structure and big ribbed. When you let this girl out of the pen, she floats around the ring. She is sound and flexible. She's about right from a muscle standpoint, and still very correct in terms of balance. She looks like a maternal female should. She will make the next generation of Yorkshire hogs better for Joe Coyne for \$2,000.

Jack Rodibaugh and Sons drove this year's Champion Yorkshire Female at the NBS°. This daughter of HOL1 Everyday 11-7 looks like a lady. Complete, correctly balanced, feminine, great-underline and sound – she is really hard to pick a hole in. Just like you would expect from a firm like the Rodibaugh's. She sold to Randy Morris of Albert Lee, Minn., for the price of \$1,200.

The Reserve Champion Gilt placed behind the champion in a deep set in Class 4. She is sired by CRSH1 Heavy Metal 13-3. Congratulations to Gunderson Farms of Raymond, Minn., for their Reserve Champion Female. This gilt looks like a brood sow – deep centered, ribbed, and sound. She is feminine in her build and has a great look from the profile. Krieger Brothers of Kerhoven, Minn., bid \$1,000 so they could load her on their trailer.

The next gilt in the ring won the oldest class of the day; she is sired by WIU1 Scratch N Sniff 5-9. Kyle and Carter Schulte's gilt is square and genuine underneath, heavy structured and durable in her look. She will make a nice addition to Toni and Sydney Chicos' herd. They paid \$600 to take her

back to Alden, Minn.

McGrew Showpigs of Good Hope, Ill., were next up with their winning entry from Class 2. This daughter of RWG0 Net Worth 233-1 can best be described as a show gilt. She has a killer look from the side; she is square built and is what some people would describe as "ideal" in her frame for making barrows. Toni and Sydney Chicos also purchased this female for the price of \$550.

The winning entry from Class 5 was next in the ring. Tom Thompson of Thompson, Iowa, exhibited this correctly designed, tall-fronted, sound-moving daughter of BRJL1 The Solution 3-4. She, too, was loaded on Toni and Sydney Chicos' trailer. She sold for \$300.

The youngest class-winning gilt was a little farther down in the sale order. Exhibited by Torpedo Farms of Pueblo, Colo., this daughter of HFYF0 Transmission 89-2 is heavy muscled. She has a big square top and huge hip. If you were looking to have muscle from the female side, then this was the gilt for you. She sold to Schroht Show Pigs of Owatonna, Minn., for \$300.

This year's gilt show was loaded with a functional set of gilts. A huge and special thank you to Dan Baker of West Lafayette, Ind., for another great job on the block. Thank you to all of the ring help. We could not do it without you! See you all at Duncan!



2013 Rules & Regulations

General Information

Entry fees must accompany the entry form and all late entries will be charged double the regular fee. The NSR reserves the right to close entries because of pen space limitations any time after the printed deadline. All entry fees are non-refundable. Entries must be postmarked by Dec. 14, 2012.

All hogs entered at the WTC must have been owned by Dec. 1, 2012, by the exhibitor.

CROSSBRED BOARS: Stress status of your entry will be placed in the show and sale catalog (this is a show and sale requirement). A documented stress test must be presented at check in.

All entries must be earnotched using the NSR system. All entries must be recorded by Jan. 18, 2013. After that date, exhibitors will be charged a rush fee. All exhibitors must be junior or senior NSR members.

No entry or substitute entry will be allowed to show or sell without a registration certificate. Entries will be divided into classes by farrowing date. All hogs must be at the fairgrounds by noon, Feb. 1, 2013.

No clipping is allowed in the barns.

Exhibitors & Eligibility

Exhibitors must be an active member of the NSR, or they will be required to pay the

Entries are limited to two boars and three open gilts per breed (Duroc, Hampshire, Landrace, Yorkshire, crossbred) per exhibitor (NJSA Southeast Regional Landrace gilts only). All entries must be farrowed on or after June 1, 2012, and must have at least six teats on each side.

All entries must meet their respective breed requirements. Entries that do not meet these requirements will not be allowed to show or sell at the conference.

<u>Breeding Animal Sale</u>

A minimum of 60 percent of the number of each sex (boars and gilts) shown will be selected for the sale. These animals will be selected by the judge with no set number selling from any single class. Exhibitors with animals not selected for the sale may consign their animals to the sale for \$20 per head. If the animal sells, the fee will be applied toward the sale commission. If the animal does not sell, the fee is forfeited.

All animals selected and cataloged for the sale must go through the auction. Sale commission will be 15 percent for all animals. If an animal that is selected and cataloged for the sale does not go through the sale ring, the exhibitor will be banned from exhibiting at NSR events for one year and will be charged 15% of the average selling price of their respective breed sale. This amount must be paid before reinstatement will be allowed. The exception to this rule will be if the animal has become injured or ill and the animal is inspected by a NSR staff member prior to the sale.

The NSR acts only as the agent between the buyer and seller. If proper payment is made by the buyer in a timely manner, the NSR will make settlement with the seller in approximately 30 days after the sale.

If an exhibitor has an account that is past due, funds from the sale of their animals will be applied to their NSR account.

Special Breed Requirements

By entering any animal in this conference, the owner warrants that the animal meets specific breed requirements.

Such warranty is, however, solely that of the seller and not that of the American Landrace Association, American Yorkshire Club, Hampshire Swine Registry or United Duroc Swine Registry, and the ALA, AYC, HSR, and UDSR assumes no responsibility or liability in connection with such warranty by the seller.

If any animal sold at this conference is found to be a carrier of the color gene after being tested through the procedures approved by the HSR, UDSR, ALA and AYC, the seller agrees that he will promptly refund the full purchase price to the buyer.

There will be no refund of NSR commission from animals that are carriers of the color gene.

DNA Stress Statement

No known stress-positive or stress-carrier animals will be allowed to be exhibited or sold at any

Such warranty is, however, solely that of the seller and not that of the American Landrace Association, American Yorkshire Club, Hampshire Swine Registry or United **Duroc Swine Registry.**

The American Landrace Association, American Yorkshire Club, Hampshire Swine Registry and United Duroc Swine Registry assume no responsibility or liability in connection with such warranty by the seller.

If any animal sold at this conference is found to be a carrier of the stress gene, the purchaser has the right to receive full refund of the purchase price from the seller.

DNA testing for the stress gene must be done within 60 days of the date of sale and all cost associated with the testing for the stress gene must be paid by the purchaser. The seller has the right to review the test results and the right to re-test the animal at a laboratory of his choice.

Cost associated with re-test by the seller is at the seller's expense. There will be no refund of NSR commission from stress-carrier animals.

Health Regulations

- 1. Each hog must be accompanied by **TWO COPIES** of an official interstate health certificate issued by a licensed, accredited vet. Certificate must show name and address of consignor; consigned to the Winter Type Conference or NJSA Southeast Regional, Perry, Ga.; official identification of hog; and health status of hog, including dates and laboratory location of required tests and vaccinations. All swine must have individual health certificates and a duplicate of each certificate. Remember, only one hog per certificate. Crossbred animals must be identified by a federally recognized numbered ear tag. Include your vet's cell phone number on health certificates.
- 2. All certificates must be issued after Jan. 4, 2013, with the following information:
 - A. All hogs must be tested for pseudorabies (PRV) and brucellosis after Jan. 4, 2013, unless they come from a PRV-qualified and brucellosis-validated herd. Swine tested for PRV and brucellosis must show the date blood sample was drawn. Either the Elisa, PCFIA, ALA or S/N tests are acceptable. Differentiable Elisa test will not be accepted. If the herd of origin is PRV qualified and brucellosis validated, individual testing will not be required. In this case, the PRV qualification and brucellosis validation numbers must appear on the certificate and complete date must be stated.
 - B. All breeding swine coming to the show MUST be vaccinated against influenza and leptospirosis (6-way) including bratislava and erysipelas. The complete date of vaccination MUST be listed on the health certificate. Market animals should not be vaccinated.
 - C. All health certificates must carry the following statements: Farm or origin of the swine has not had pseudorabies or swine dysentery in the last 12 months, has not had TGE in the last 60 days, feeds no garbage, uses no PRV vaccine, and is not under quarantine for any disease condition; also that vesicular stomatitus has not been diagnosed within 10 miles of the farm of origin within the last 30 days.
- 3. A permit number is required on each shipment of swine entering Georgia and must be recorded on the health certificate. Please have your vet obtain the permit by calling 404.656.3667. All crossbred animals must be identified on the health paper by a state-recognized tag.

REMEMBER:

- Your driver's license number must be included on your health papers.
- A premises ID number will be required to exhibit.

BLAST FROM THE

The U.S. Department of Agriculture Farmer's Bulletin No. 1263 chronicled popular breeds of swine in the United States in the 1920s. Originally published in 1922 and revised in July 1924, the bulletin explains the two type of hogs in the '20s – lard types and bacon types.

"The lard type is preferred in this country; consequently the majority of feeders produce rapidly fattening, heavily fleshed lard type," wrote E.Z. Russell, Animal Husbandman and author. "The bacon type is raised extensively in those countries where the feed of the hog is more varied where corn is not relied upon as the principle grain for hogs."

Left to Right: The Duroc, or Duroc-Jersey as it was called at the time, was known as a 'lard type.' The breed originated in New York and New Jersey. Hampshires were originally known as 'Thin Rind' hogs and classified among the 'bacon breeds.' However, in the '20s they were known as a 'lard breed,' after rapidly gaining popularity in the early 1900s. Yorkshires were a 'bacon breed.' The females were known for being prolific sows.


