

Unsung heroes

After the 25th World Pork Expo, I reflected on what contributed to the success and growth of this event. Starting in 1980, the Iowa Hampshire Breeders Association Board of Directors, made a somewhat unpopular decision to hold an off-season breeding show and sale known as the Midwest Hampshire Meat Hog Conference at the Iowa State Fairgrounds in Des Moines, Iowa. The group of men responsible for creating the event included: Earl Cain, Jerry Brink, Tim Anderson, Charlie Baas, Marlyn Paul, Verle McGraw, A.W. Martin, Don Wallace, Robert Warrick, Dick Swenson, and the past HSR executive, Bob Naylor. The Iowa Hampshire membership felt this event was an opportunity for Hampshire breeders across the nation to come together. Nearly 350 people participated in the type discussion and judging contest at this inaugural event and more than 100 head of Hampshires sold.

The United Duroc Swine Registry became part of this event at the 3rd Annual Midwest Conference and the Spots joined the 5th Midwest Conference. As other breeds joined this event, new and innovative ideas, such as the "Peoples' Choice" and the "Tested Best Boar Sale," were incorporated into the conference.

Eight years after the inaugural event, National Pork Producers Council (NPPC) came to the breed associations asking to couple the Midwest Conference with a national trade show for pork producers, and the World Pork Expo was born. The first Expo was held at the Iowa State Fairgrounds, in 1988. A member of the NPPC staff, Ernie Barnes was named with everything from reading notches to manager of the event. No one can appreciate the hours Ernie spent on the phone gathering up support to make this event come together, from getting all the trade show exhibitors into booth spaces, to lining up different pork producer groups to cook at the "Big Grill." A former Yorkshire fieldman and Landrace breed executive. Ernie worked with our purebred breed shows and sales, as well, and we can't thank him enough for his efforts.

Due to the economic conditions in the pork industry, by the early 2000s the participation in the WPX was dwindling, when the idea of incorporating a junior event was discussed. In 2003, the first WPX Junior National took place, and over the years, the event has grown into one of the premier junior shows in the country.

I want to thank all of the NSR and NJSA staff for their contributions that make this event come together. Cally Hass, Torie Schwartz and the NJSA intern, Gavin Livingston, spent countless hours working to put the junior portion together. Robin Lucas, Lisa Kennedy, Rhonda Eller, Jessica Goyette-Blankenship, Whitney Hosier and pedigree intern, Amanda Oldfield, worked many hours processing entries, providing pedigrees for exhibitors, faxing corrections and putting the show and sale catalogs together. Adam Dian developed the online entry forms. Brian Arnold and his crew of Brian Anderson, Ralph Doak, Michael Lackey and the field staff intern, Blaine Evans, assisted

taking bids on Saturday. Katie Maupin, Steve Weintraut and the marketing and communications intern, Jacee May, promptly reported the results. Dr. Justin Fix and Dr. Doug Newcom contributed to the trade show with the America's Best Genetics booth, helping to promote the use of purebred genetics abroad. The NJSA Board of Directors helped pen and check-in hogs, in addition to working all of the junior events.

There are not enough words to express my appreciation to the NSR and NJSA team for their efforts during this monster event. The staff and board went to bed late and rose early each morning, yet they worked hard each day. They're troopers!

I'd also like to thank everyone else who helped this event come together. Ryan Orrick, Jon Althaus and the Lake Land judging team penned hogs in the shows, manned the judging contest and assisted with the sales on Saturday - we couldn't do it without them! Dr. Shawn Nicholson and his crew did a great job checking health papers. Doug Fricke, Alicia Irlbeck, Neil Dierks and Pat McGonegle of NPPC and Bryn Jenssen and Dinah Peebles from the National Pork Board offered countless support and assistance throughout the week. Last but not least, my brother, John Paul, needs to be thanked for serving as my "gofer," all week.

A million questions

Miller receives NASR Lifetime Achievement Award

That National Association of Swine Records (NASR) presented the Lifetime Achievement Award to Dale Miller of Hampton, Minn.

Raised on a diversified farm in Morristown, Minn. Miller was a 10-year member of the Minnesota 4-H program, during which he exhibited many state fair winners. After high school, Miller attended the University of Minnesota. While a student at the U of M, Miller spent three summers as a field representative for the Chester White Swine Record Association and served on the editorial staff of the Chester White Journal. In December 1972, Miller graduated with a bachelor's in animal science.

National Hog Farmer (NHF), in January 1973. The National Hog Farmer is a

nationally recognized swine industry publication reporting news and production practices pertinent to the nation's pork producers. Miller was promoted to managing editor in 1977, and in 1993, he was named the magazine's editor, a position that he currently holds. Miller will retire July 15.

During his tenure with NHF, Miller has traveled throughout the U.S. and around the globe to help tell the story of the swine industry. Some of his career highlights include: surveying the National Boar Tests for 20 years, reporting the original work on sow productivity indexing (SPI), covering the research that identified the stress gene and its impact on the industry and writing about the impact of AI on America's swine herds. Miller introduced countless features to the NHF such as, NPPC's production and financial standards, inventions contests, new product tours, employer/employee surveys, the 'Blueprint series for Top Pork Producers' and the 'Environmental Stewards of the Industry.' He spearheaded the NHF 50th Anniversary edition, in 2005. The magazine traced its 50 year history and closed with thoughts of 50 producers and industry leaders. Miller followed this popular edition by introducing the 'Masters of the Pork Industry,' recognizing the personal and professional stories of people that impacted the swine industry.

Miller is a charter member of the National Association of Swine Testing Stations, later renamed the National Swine Improvement Federation (NSIF). He was heavily involved in the Major Genetic Evaluation projects, National Genetic Program Special Report, the National Genetic Maternal Line Program, the Quality Lean Modeling Project, the NBS® Progeny Test results and Genetics of Lean Efficiency. The 10 production-based posters that Miller helped develop through these projects have been translated into four different languages.

Miller has received the Distinguished Service Award by Pork Checkoff, Honorary Master Iowa Pork Producer and the Charles Stanislaw Service Award from NSIF, in addition to being recognized many times by Livestock Publication Council and Chester White Swine Record Association.

One thing was evident in Miller's writing, his love for the swine industry, as evidenced by his ability to speak plainly and directly to the swine producers and encourage them to make changes to make this industry better. He still has a small seedstock operation, raising Chester Whites, F-1 gilts and quality locker pork.



Warren Beeler is all about agriculture, and he makes no bones about it. From his time as both an American Yorkshire Club and Hampshire Swine Registry fieldman, through his decades of farming, to his current role as the Kentucky Department of Agriculture's director of ag policy, this small town Kentucky boy never forgot his humble beginnings. The oldest of six children, Beeler grew up on a dairy and tobacco farm in Caneyville, Ky. It was there that he learned about hard work. His father, Wendel, was a serious man.

"I don't think he smiled for the first 18 years of my life, but then the grandkids came along, and he thought that everything was funny," Beeler recalls. "He told me that being lazy was worse than stealing, and stealing was really, really bad, so that stuck with me."

The Beeler family might not have had much. But they worked hard for what they had, and that was a great way to grow up, according to Beeler.

On May 22, 1982, Beeler married Deborah "Dee Dee" Boone.

Ben

Beeler couldn't be more proud of his only son, Ben. At 27, Ben has already received his doctorate in nuclear engineering from Georgia Tech University and is headed to California for some post-doctoral work.

You could say that Ben gets his love for science from his father. Beeler is a firm believer in the importance of science and research to the future of this country. When he talks to young people passionate about agriculture, Beeler tries to emphasize the importance of agriculturally-related studies.

Sure, it's nice when young people become veterinarians, but the forwardthinking Beeler sees opportunities in less traditional routes such as genetics, knows that sometimes those ambassadors for agriculture working outside of it are just as important for our future.

"They may not all be hog farmers, but at least they'll be really, really good ambassadors for our industry," Beeler says.

Megan

Megan is all about agriculture, just like her dad. She works locally, so she can help run the family farm. And at 25-years-old, she already has a deep passion for the industry.

Her dedication for the pursuit of all things ag is something she comes by honestly. If anyone described Beeler as anything less than passionate for the industry, then it's clear they've never met the man.



"I married Dee Dee and brought her straight out of the city and stuck her on a farm at the end of an old dirt road," Beeler says. "My dad said she wouldn't last six weeks, and we've been married 31 years now. We're just best friends."

Together, the couple had five kids. Out of all of Beeler's accomplishments, it's obvious by the tone of his voice, that he considers his family to be the greatest.

It's in Beeler's blood to teach young people – to pass along the lessons he's learned. His mom came from a big family. He came from a big family, and he grew up in a tiny town. It was common practice for the older to mentor the younger. So, it's no surprise that each of his kids carry with them a few lessons that Beeler himself learned along the way. animal behavior and even nutrition. He believes, if it's true that American farmers will have to produce 100 percent more food by the year 2050 to feed the world's booming population, that science will be the way to do so.

"I do believe that one of the most important things is to get these young kids, who are just so smart and so passionate, involved in agriculture, so they can help us take the next steps," Beeler says. "And I hope that we build enough passion in them that they're able to go out and be leaders in the industry, be scientists in this industry and be ambassadors for it. It's the key. Good kids are key."

Beeler would be lying, if he said that he wouldn't have preferred his son to pursue a career in agriculture. But he His first job fresh out of college was with the American Yorkshire Club. He became their first Southwest fieldman. Surprising to some, may be the fact that before shaking Glenn Conatser's hand to except the position, the only swine experience he had was a two-hour, crash course from his Western Kentucky University professor Dr. Gordon Jones.

"Dr. Jones gave me that crash course, and I'll tell you that I didn't get any of it before I went and interviewed," Beeler recalls.

Beeler gives Conatser a lot of credit. He didn't ask Beeler about pigs during the interview. Instead, he quizzed him about his family, his work ethic and his character, allowing Beeler to dive headlong into the purebred swine industry.

I started, was off the charts," Beeler says.

Those first few years on the road took Beeler to more than 200 sales annually. He only spent about 15 to 20 nights in his rented apartment in Stillwater, Okla. But he learned a lot, and he loved the people. He became a hog man.

After two more years as a Hampshire fieldman, his passion for the industry was cemented. Beeler raised Hampshires in Kentucky with his family, and the Belted Breed became a part of him.

"He is a friend to the purebred industry. He and his family were once very active Hampshire breeders, and yet today is a purebred breeder at heart," Bob Naylor, past executive secretary of the Hampshire Swine Registry says. "He will always be an ambassador and advisor to the course of improved livestock production regardless of the species."

When asked about the purebred swine industry, Beeler makes his point in a straight-forward, no-nonsense way.

"I mean, I'm a purebred guy - I am," he says adamantly.

Molly, 24, is recently married. She and her husband, Luke Critchelow, farm just like Beeler and Dee Dee did. Like her father, Molly was born to teach. When she started teaching kindergarten, Beeler told her to "give them the full dose every day."

"And she does," he says. "That is just the type of passion that she has for it."

Beeler considers teachers to be some of the most important people. Dr. Gordon Jones, the professor that gave him the crash course before his Yorkshire interview, is a man that had such a profound impact on his life that Beeler says he could never repay him.

"He got me my interview with Glenn Conatser, and I think because of Dr. Jones I got the position," Beeler says. "How much more influence could you have? I became a hog man because of him, and I'm appreciative each and every day."

Jones was a man who expected a lot

> "He built a passion for the livestock industry in me that I still have to this day - I guess I'll always have it," Beeler says. "He was just one of those guys that would always set the bar slightly out of reach. You could just never satisfy him with what you got done."

Out of everything that he learned from Jones, perhaps the most important was to never stop learning.

"If you don't learn something new, then you wasted a day," Beeler says. "At 57-years-old, I'm much more open to learning now than I was at their age. I wasted a lot of years thinking that I knew

and being full of myself, and I hate that."

Beeler uses this philosophy when he judges swine shows.

"To me, it's not so much how you place the top five, but how you handle the bottom five," Beeler says. "You know, we spend a lot of time on the top five, when in fact, the progress in the program comes from time spent with those on the bottom. I've made a reputation over the years, of making sure those kids

This attitude and approach has been noted by several forces in the purebred swine industry, including Naylor.

"His way with people, especially the younger generation is most admirable. He certainly has his own views but is always open minded to the opinions of others, regardless of age or gender," he says.

Beeler is known for a lot of things due to his involvement with youth swine events such as: being the founder of the first junior swine association for the Hampshire Swine Registry in 1981, serving on the National Junior Swine Association Youth Advisory Board, judging countless swine shows looking for barrows with "Beeler butts" and being the booming voice at Louisville that announces, "You're late." But all he wants to be remembered as is a teacher.

"We all love good hogs, because good hogs are easy to look at. But to me, we're in the kid development business – putting the kids ahead, from an educational standpoint, is the right way to do it," Beeler says. "I've always preached that, and I've always tried to do it. I figure, if they come and show again, then I've done my job."

Abby is Beeler's youngest daughter, and she happens to be severely handicapped. At 21, she is much like an infant. She's unable to walk or talk and is confined to a wheelchair. Yet, she has taught her family some very important lessons: normal is what you make it and never feel sorry for yourself.

"When this first happened, we thought it was just a terrible thing. Then, we stopped feeling sorry for ourselves and realized that we have a beautiful, little red-headed girl that loves us all the time," Beeler says. "I don't have to worry about who she's running around with, and she's never sassed me. So we thought it was bad, but it turned out that we may have created the perfect child."

Beeler likes to think of himself as a glass-half-full type of person. Everyone has things happen in their life that they wish could be different, but it's the way they handle it that separates them.

"You know life's not fair, but I've been very blessed," Beeler says. "Just because life kicks you around now and then, doesn't mean that you need to give up. It's not going to stop just because something bad happened and sometimes it may be hard to get over, but at the same time, you have to go on."

Through it all, Beeler notes that the key is not to get hard – just calloused.

"Warren Beeler's attitude on life is to always give it your best shot. His keen and wholesome approach, wherever he may be, allows him to present himself in a most professional and likeable fashion," Naylor says.

Emily

Beeler's oldest daughter was fearless. Yet, the whole family's lives changed about 11 years ago, when they hugged Emily on a Sunday afternoon before sending her back to college. She didn't make it. A woman crossed the interstate, struck her head on, and then she was gone.

It's the one thing that the Beelers will never get over. But Emily taught everyone who knew her, and even some that didn't a valuable lesson: live each day to the fullest.

"She is a really, really nice example. You can just never waste a day," Beeler says. "You just have to find something that you are passionate about, in terms of work or fun. Then, you have to work really hard at it. You have to think positive, think that you can do it, be patient, learn something each day and lastly, you have to believe in yourself."

When they went to clean out her dorm room, the Beelers found a poster hanging on her wall that read, "Don't be afraid." Today, Beeler shares that message with the folks that he visits with during the 120 speeches that he gives for the Department of Ag each year.

"The best advice I can give kids is to not let their own fear stand in the way of their potential," Beeler says. "They get afraid that they can't do it, they start to doubt themselves, and then they don't work hard enough."


Faith and character

In the end, Beeler's success all comes down to faith and character. He has faith in the future of this great industry and in the youth that will one day lead it. And he hopes to instill a little dose of his character in all those that he meets.

In his words, character is not about what you should do, but rather what you do when you're not expected to do anything. That is how Beeler works, judges and lives. He just feels blessed to have made his living in this great industry.

"When they introduce me as a hog man, I take it as an award," Beeler says. "I'm proud of that."



This is Part IV of a four-part series focusing on the influence a foundation female can have, not only within a single herd, but within a breed.

Broc, Luke, Eli and their father, Bart Thompson, have a sound sow herd that serves as the foundation of Thompson Brothers Genetics in Pleasantville, Ohio. An important piece of that puzzle is a certain female – TBRO7 Miss Dasher 33-9. Known by the Thompson brothers as the '33-9 Tank sow,' her longevity and ability to breed on make her the cornerstone of their succesful breeding operation. Not only has she already raised nine elite herdsires, but her legacy continues to thrive as she raises her 12th litter.

Getting Started

The 33-9 Tank sow was born in 2007.

She is the daughter of, JGR6 Tank 9-5 and a WGW3 Big Foot 62-4 sow, who's also the dam of TBRO6 Reality Check 16-1.

When considering the top side of her pedigree, Thomp-

sons really liked the Tank boar. "Looking back within the Yorkshire

breed today, Tank is in a lot of pedigrees a couple times, if not more. He's a pretty influential sire," Broc Thompson says.

Jim Grimm, of Grimm Purebreds in Iowa, raised Tank, and brought him to the 2006 Summer Type Conference in Louisville, Ky. Ben Olsen, of Olsen Yorkshires, Irene, S.D., had the vision to see what this boar had to offer and decided to purchase him.

"Having him somewhere like Olsen's made him readily available to use on certain sows," Grimm says. "At the time, Tank was significantly different than what was out there. He was moderate in size and offered more body and flank. He presented a change that wasn't available at the time. They wanted fancier hogs then, and he wasn't that. He was a big, massive hog with a lot of muscle."

Thompsons knew they would get mass, moderation and quality out of this pairing. And when it came time to sort the good ones, keeping the 33-9 gilt was a no-brainer.

"As a pig, she really looked the part," Thompson says. "Her feet, legs and athletic ability set her apart, especially her hip and hind leg. Today, she's still moderate and easy keeping. Plus, her udder quality is always good after a litter. We have just always liked her, so we kept her."

Generating Influence

Few females can raise good herdsires or replacements. Fewer still, can do both as well as the 33-9 Tank sow. In fact, in addition to the numerous herdsires she produced, 70 of the 75 sows at Thompson Brothers have 33-9 in their pedigree.

"I mean, I don't think we would be where we are today without that sow. Her daughters, sons, granddaughters and grandsons and what they left has made

Although this sow's sons have made their impact on the industry, her daughters have proven equally as influential on the TBRO herdmark. They have retained every direct daughter out of her - 15 in total. Influential daughters include the Iron Man littermates, 33-7 and 33-10. Both sows have left a big impact on the operation. For instance, 33-10 is the dam of Head On, Buck Shot, TBRO0 Tycoon 69-4, TBRO2 Benjamin 67-4, housed at Real Hog Farms and TBRO0 PSSS Prime Cut 69-2, at Prairie State. Then, 33-7 is the mother of TBRO1 Big Timber 17-2 at Cains, the 2012 NJSS Foundation Gilt and 3D, who is at Thompsons. Thompsons just started selling

this female influential," Thompson says.

Her sons include: TBRO8 Change It Up 70-3, TBRO8 Pud 70-8, TBRO8 Samurai 70-6, TBRO9 Rondo 64-4, TBRO9 Big Splash 64-1 and TBRO0 PSSS The Factor 72-1, all of which are sires that Thompson Brothers have sold. Seven sons or grandsons have been housed at Thompson Brothers boar stud, including: TBRO2 3D 86-2, TBRO2 Big Mac 107-2, TBRO2 Buck Shot 67-5, TBRO1 Head On 47-6, TBRO0 Turn On 30-1, TBRO1 WOW 74-1 and TBRO2 Ultra 35-4.

"Her sons and grandsons have made the biggest impact on the Yorkshire breed, specifically, Rondo, Big Splash and Turn On. These boars and their sons and grandsons are doing a real good job," Thompson says.

Grimm, the very man who bred the Tank boar, had enough faith in the 33-9 sow and the genetics backing her to purchase one of her most influential sons from Thompsons – Rondo.

"Rondo did a good job siring body and flank like Tank. He's square on his feet and legs and out of his hip. Generating hogs is what speaks to Tank, as well as Rondo, and sons and daughters out of that 33-9 Tank sow," Grimm says. – Broc Thompson

daughters out of 33-9's past two litters.

"At our place, there aren't many that don't have her in their pedigree," Thompson says.

Continuing a Legacy

Today, nursing her 12th litter, 33-9 continues to raise great ones.

"She's still generating, although we haven't had a boar in three litters. She's generating gilts that are excellent in type and kind, that go out and do well, even though she's a 6-year-old sow. There's a lot of turnover in the industry, yet she's able to continue to make current hogs," Thompson says.

Her structure and ability to mother and raise consistent litters make her timeless.

"She's one of them once in a lifetime kind of sows. One you don't come by very often. One that has made her mark," Thompson says.

Whether you're going across the county or across the nation, your animals' welfare should be your primary concern when traveling to shows and sales. Iowa State University animal science professor Dr. Jodi Sterle, offers tips and tricks she's learned through her studies and experiences hauling her sons' projects across the U.S.



Maps and apps

Planning your trip, route and estimated time of arrival are just as key to your pigs' welfare as the steps you take once you're on the road. Careful planning and preparation can help you avoid headaches, in the future.

"With all the maps and apps we have now, we can avoid road construction, traffic and big cities during busy times of the day," Sterle says.

This is important because any time the trailer is at a standstill the air stops moving. This gives the pigs a chance to become hot and uncomfortable, especially on the black asphalt. Knowing your arrival time may also mean the difference between waiting in line several hours or several minutes.

"You may want to time your arrival so that you arrive first thing in the morning. You may drive all night so that it will be easier on the pigs, and you arrive during the coolest part of the day," she explains. "Or, you may simply time your arrival for when the line will be the shortest."

Either way, plotting your route and putting thought into timing should be one of the first steps you take to plan a successful trip to a show or sale.

Health matters

Of course, you should always travel with the appropriate health certificates, especially if you will be crossing state lines, but Sterle also encourages exhibitors and breeders to visit with their veterinarian about pigs' health before the event.

"Talk to your veterinarian about preventative health care, when you take them on the road," Sterle says. "They'll be less likely to get sick."

Be sure to let your vet know if

your pigs will be entering into a much different climate, such as an air conditioned barn during the heat of summer, and if they will be sharing air with many other pigs in a closed barn. This will let them help you make the best decisions for your animals.

The number one rule in herd health is to never haul an animal with symptoms.


"Sick pigs stay home – end of story," she says. "Sick kids need to stay home too. That's first and foremost."


Trailer tune-ups

No matter what type of trailer you have, whether it is a 16-foot bumper hitch or a 26-foot aluminum gooseneck with all the stops, you have to be aware of how the layout will afyou're hauling animals that haven't been raised together the pens keep them from fighting and jostling around. The pens also ensure that the animals don't lie too close together in hot weather, and make it easier to administer individual care. But pens prevent animals from moving to warmer or cooler parts of the trailer to feel more comfortable.

The key is knowing what to expect when hauling animals with your setup. If your trailer isn't equipped with pens, and you're hauling animals that haven't been raised together, load up and head out. Generally, they'll lie down, once you hit the road.

If your trailer has Plexiglas[®] strips that cover the side vents to close the air in, remove those in the summer





Sterle notes that there are places in trailers that are naturally warmer or cooler than others, depending on how the air flows through. Usually, the front of the trailer will be warmer than the back. This is important to keep in mind, especially if your trailer is separated, and you will be penning pigs in one section of the trailer for the entire ride.

As far as having pens in the trailer, Sterle says that there are both advantages and disadvantages to that system. When and install them in the winter.

A good bed

Bedding your trailer well is imperative to the comfort of your animals on the road, Sterle says.

When hauling in the summer heat, bed with shavings and wet the bedding down before you load. When hauling in the winter, bed deep enough that the pigs can huddle down into the bedding. In cold weather, all bedding should be moisture free.

"Hauling in the winter is much easier, just bed them deep, and they will burrow down," she says. "If it is draft free, and they aren't wet, then they're going to be fine."

Head 'em up - load 'em out

Just like planning and preparation can help your drive, a little work before the show will take most of the hassle and headaches out of loading.

"We go ahead and do our homework on that," Sterle says.

Her boys practice with their projects ahead of time. They set up an alleyway that leads to the trailer, wait until close to feeding time and coax the pigs onto the trailer using either their feed or a "treat," like a marshmallow. After the pigs get on the trailer, they let them exit on their own.

"We do this exercise more than once, so our pigs are comfortable going up and down either the ramp or the step," she says. "We want the trailer to be familiar and for the pigs to realize that it is not a scary place."

Sterle also encourages exhibitors to invest in a sorting board to have on hand during loading. This will prevent pigs from running back by people when trying to load. If a pig gets by once, it will be much harder to get that pig on the trailer a second time. If you're loading multiple animals, load them as a group and make sure that once an animal is on the trailer that it doesn't try to turn back. "Plenty of help and a little facility management are key," Sterle says. "Take time to set up a loading area or alleyway leading to the trailer, practice ahead of time and move pigs as a group with plenty of help."

Remember that loading your pigs should always be the last thing you do before you leave.

"You load all of your tack. You load all of your luggage. Your truck is gassed up. The house is shut up, and you've fed the dogs – or whatever you have to do," she says. "The very last thing you do is load those pigs."

Once the pigs are on the trailer, you start driving. This will get air flowing through the trailer on hot days and keep pigs that aren't used to each other from fighting, since they usually lay down once the trailer starts bouncing down the road.

Just keep driving

When you're on the road, don't stop a lot, Sterle says. This means no shopping trips or sit-down meals.

"When we stop for a tank of gas, it's like a Chinese fire drill," Sterle says. "While someone is filling up the truck, someone is in the bathroom and another person is checking on the pigs."

She recommends stopping every two to three hours to check the pigs, and is adamant that you try to pull into the shade, when you stop.

"I don't think people realize just how much reflective and radiate heat comes off of asphalt," Sterle says.

Chilled and filled

When you're on long trips it is important to make sure that you give your pigs opportunities to both eat and drink.

Stopping every two to three hours not only gives you a chance to use the rest room and stretch your legs, but it also gives the pigs an opportunity to get up and grab a drink.

Although you can offer your pigs water from a bucket, Sterle recommends having water available in the trailer. An easy and affordable way to do so is to make your own nipple waterer. *(See sidebar.)*

Since pigs don't sweat, drinking water is one way that they control their body temperatures. If they would become heat stressed and begin to pant, their bodies would lose a lot of water through their mouth that must be replaced.

If you're traveling a really long distance offer your pigs some food around their normal feeding time. Sterle recommends about a half to a third of their normal ration.

Ice, ice baby

Ice can be a quick fix to extreme heat both on the road and at the show. It's one of Sterle's go-to tricks to help her family's showpigs beat the summer heat.

Her family will dig to the bottom of the ice chest to get the bags that aren't yet broken into cubes, when they purchase ice. Then, they slice the bags open and place the whole chunk of ice in the trailer or pen. "Three things will happen," Sterle says. "One – it will melt and keep your shavings wet. Two – pigs can lie on it or near it to cool off. Three – pigs will chomp and chew on it."

At their county fair last year, the temperature topped out at 110 degrees, and the Sterle family went through 80 pounds of ice in four days.

Although, she'll admit all that ice gets the pigs and pens dirty, Sterle points out that the welfare of the animals is more important than a little extra scrubbing.

Besides ice, she recommends having a box fan and extension cord stowed away in the trailer or tack box to help keep pigs cool once they arrive at the show or sale.

Wash, disinfect, rinse, repeat

Although it may be an overlooked step, properly cleaning your trailer and everything in the tack box is vital to your pigs' health.

Sterle and her family off-load everything once they get home from the fair, and she means everything – shavings, mats, dividers, tack, whips, feeders, brushes, etc. Then, they soap, disinfect and rinse before letting everything dry in the sun.

"Cleaning is removing the dirt. Disinfecting is removing the germs, and rinsing is removing the disinfectant," Sterle says. "All three steps are very important."

Just as important is following the quarantine protocol recommended by your veterinarian, when you return from a show. Thirty days of isolation is pretty standard practice. Watch the animals that returned from the event carefully for symptoms and always feed them last.

By following these tips, you can be ensured that your animals will arrive safely, perform well and keep any pathogens they may have picked up at the show to themselves.

How to Build a Hog Waterer Out of PVC Pipe

Materials Needed:

- 6-inch diameter PVC pipe with end caps
 - Pig bite valve PVC cement

.....

.....

END CAP

PVC PIPE

• HOSE CLAMP

- Purchase a large-diameter PVC pipe; the exact size you need depends on how many pigs you have. Many pig waterers are between 6- inches to 10-inches in diameter and between 4-feet and 6-feet in height. Purchase two end caps and PVC cement.
- Cut PVC pipe to desired length.
- Paint PVC cement on the inside of the bottom PVC end cap, then slide it over one end of the PVC segment. Leave the top end cap unglued to allow you to fill the waterer. Allow the bottom end cap to dry for the duration listed on the back of the PVC cement canister.
- Measure the bite valve's diameter. Select a drill bit slightly smaller than the valve. Drill a hole 6 inches from one end of the PVC pipe. Screw the valve into the hole. Seal the edge with silicone and allow it to dry.
- Drill a hole in the top of the top end cap to allow the water to flow out of the valve.
- Use the two hose clamps to attach your waterer wherever you choose.

From the Field by Blaine Evans, NSR Field Representative Intern

If you happened to miss the 2013 World Pork Expo, all I can say is it was one for the record books. Not only was there a record number of junior hogs, but we also hosted one of the highest-grossing sales in NSR history. In addition to having a tremendous show, the cool and sometimes wet conditions allowed for a pleasant experience for exhibitors and hogs alike.

The Hampshires kicked-off the open show, and even though we didn't necessarily fill the barn with belted hogs, we still had a good show with quality throughout the line-up. This year, Jim McCoy from Ohio was asked to line up the sale order. Like always, Jim did an excellent job of not only describing the hogs that were in the ring, but also giving breeders some advice on how to use those hogs in their programs.

Before the sale started on Saturday, Mike Paul, NSR CEO, announced this year's Premier Sire for the Hampshire breed, BOLN1 Point Maker 118-3, owned by Hi Point Genetics of Chrisman, Ill. The Reserve Premier Sire award went to JLM0 TCG Augusta 24-3 owned by Rasmussen Swine Farm, Hurley, S.D., and Jerry McLemore, Ninnekah, Okla.

Col. Kevin Wendt of Irwin, Ohio had the duty to decide ownership for the Hampshire hogs offered in the sale. The first hog in the ring was the Champion Hampshire Boar, owned by Ed and Brad Mortensen of Kent City, Mich. This hog was sired by the Premier Sire, BOLN1 Point Maker 118-3, back on a GMW0 PSSS Dateline 7-3 sow. This hog was also the winner of Class 2. He had some real pieces that Hampshire breeders can use in their herds. Not only was this one huge bodied and extra-powerful up high, but what was truly impressive, is the fact, that he did all this in a tall-shouldered, good-looking package. Not to mention that Ed and Brad's boar was a clean-jointed, flexible hog with plenty of bone. Tom Kurtenbach and Family are extremely serious about breeding better Hampshires, and their \$11,000 purchase just goes to show their dedication to this breed.

The next boar in the ring came from Jake and Kaylee Keppy of Durant, Iowa. He was the Reserve Champion Hampshire Boar, sired by CDO0 Point Taken 257-3 back on a RSY9 Package 1-6 sow. Heidi Benner of Gettysburg, Pa., got an awesome deal at \$3,500 on this well-built herdsire. This guy has the kind of build that it takes to make showpigs that can survive that long drive, but just as importantly, his angles read like they will be a true asset to his daughters.

Kelly Sheets of Iowa drove his CDO0 Point Taken 257-3 son into the ring third. Kelly's boar was second to Jake and Kaylee's Reserve Champion Hampshire Boar in class, and has some incredible pieces to breed around. Many ringside labeled him as a barrow-maker. This guy opened out of his blade with tremendous turn to his loin edge and maintained this true shape back into a wide pin set and powerful hip, all while still being a well-built, functional sire. Brent Bolen of Hi Point Genetics snuck in and grabbed this unique boar for \$7,500.

We only had three classes of Hampshire gilts; but it took a good one to win a banner! Lane Dowell of Mason City, Ill., drove the Champion Hampshire Gilt. She was a daughter BOLN1 Point Maker 118-3. This gilt put so many positives together during the show. She handled her feet and legs well, and when you took her up from her lower skeleton, this gilt had an easy-doing and bold type of body that never goes out of style. What made her special was that brood sow body coupled with a show gilt look. This gilt will now call Newark, Ohio, home as she goes to work for Shipley Swine Genetics.

The Reserve Champion Hampshire Gilt was exhibited by Dustin M. Breaux of Morse, La. This gilt was sired by JL1

He's A Ten 10-10. This gilt was extremely popular in class, and for a hammer price of \$1,100, she headed off to Illinois as Joe Stover and Dan Theobald added her to their sow herd.

All in all, the Hampshire show and sale can be considered one of the highlights of the 2013 World Pork Expo. It is amazing to see the number of people who have a passion for

this breed and the hard work that they put into making it better. Thanks to Jim McCoy for giving us his thoughts on the offering, but also thanks to all the buyers and sellers.

The Yorkshire show at the World Pork Expo got off to a great start with a strong set of purebreds in the World Pork Expo Junior National. For the second year in a row, a Yorkshire barrow captured championship honors in the junior ring. My hat's off to all the junior exhibitors and Yorkshire breeders that made this show so strong.

Open breeding hogs showed Friday afternoon, and what a show we had! This was the deepest set of Yorkshires that this fieldman has seen in years! Wayne Huinker of Decorah, Iowa, stepped into the ring to judge the stock. He was assisted by Kaylee Keppy of Durant, Iowa. This pair handled the task of sorting through this incredible set of Yorkshire hogs with ease.

The Premier Yorkshire Sire went to TBRO0 Starbuck 45-3 owned by Triple B Sires of Eufaula, Okla. The Reserve Premier Yorkshire Sire was awarded to SRF2 Doc 100K 7-1 owned by Shipley Swine Genetics of Newark, Ohio, Kilmer Swine Farm, Monticello, Ind., and Sharrett Family Farms of Sabina, Ohio. There was a great set of hogs out of both of these sires!

Brinning Farms of Keota, Iowa, drove the Champion Yorkshire Boar that started the sale. This son of HACO2 TCG Untouchable 153-6 had an awesome skeleton in him; the angles to his blade, front knee and pasterns are great. The way he handled his hip and hind leg was a sight to see – this guy could flat floated across the ring. Combine this with a show ring look and plenty of muscle, and he should be able to sire some great barrows and breeding gilts. He made his way to Benedict, Neb., with A Cut Above for the price of \$70,000.

The Reserve Champion Yorkshire Boar was driven by Kristin & Kari Boyum and Zach & Katie Loppnow of BOLO Showpigs of Lake City, Minn., with their entry sired by ARK1 Final Drive 130-10. This boar is as wide through his chest floor as you can make one. He opens into a great rib cage, and leaves you square and wide from behind. He is tall fronted, level designed and looks like a breeding hog. Plus, he is thick topped and heavy muscled, and acted like a boar in the ring. He will make his new home in Chrisman, Ill., with Hi Point Genetics. They paid \$100,000 to take him home, making him the top-selling boar at the 2013 World Pork Expo.

Nathan Weisinger of Fort Madison, Iowa, drove the next boar into the sale ring. His boar won Class 2. This son of TMF2 Power Drive 84-2 is sound as a cat. He is correct in his angles, and, boy, can he handle his rear leg with authority. This guy is tall fronted and good in all the places that Yorkshires can use help. He will go to work for Crossroads Genetics of Clayton, Ind., for a price of \$10,000.

Ricker Yorkshires of Fort Jennings, Ohio, drove the boar that placed second in Class 2. This one is square built, big centered and heavy muscled. This heavy-structured breeding hog is sired by SRF2 Doc Logan 7-5. I think this guy has a bright future! Call Premium Blend Sires of Arlington, Ind., to book semen. They paid \$60,000 to load this guy on their trailer.

Kilmer Swine Farm of Monticello, Ind., hit the sale ring next with a son of SRF2 Doc 100K 7-1; their boar won the oldest class of the day. This guy is masculine, stout featured and ruggedly designed. He is big footed, huge in his center and has a big, square top and a wide hip. They decided to retain ownership of this guy and take him back home for the price of \$2,500.

The gilt sale kicked-off with the entry from Bryce Bennington of Idaville, Ind. Bryce brought us a true foundation female! Not only was she named Champion Yorkshire Gilt in

She is wide skeletoned, has a great shape to her rib and rear flank. Plus, she's ideal in her frame size, long bodied and has a great underline. This foundation female will make her new home with Ronnie Allen of Midway, Texas. He paid \$6,000 for this champion.

Blake Danner of Chalmers, Ind., drove his Reserve Champion Gilt into the ring next, after she won the oldest class of the day. This daughter of NBD1 Building Block 146-6 is a stout-made, tall-fronted gilt who is wide from front to rear. Warren and Joe Coyne of Pontiac, Ill., decided to add this lady to their herd for \$1,600.

Kari & Kristin Boyum and Zach & Katie Loppnow of BOLO Showpigs, in Lake City, Minn., had the Class 4 winner. Their daughter of ARK1 Final Drive 130-10 is a littermate to the Reserve Champion and high-selling boar. She is wide in her skeleton and sets her hind legs out on the corners. But she is still tall fronted, level designed and has tons of muscle. She will make hogs better for Adam Beck and Family Show Pigs of Clayton, Ind., who paid \$5,500 to own this female.

Next in the ring was the judge's consignment from Wayne J. Huinker of Decorah, Iowa. Wayne brought you a true Yorkshire female. This daughter of WJH1 Roughneck 50-5 looks like a lady; she is feminine in her build, tall fronted, level designed and perfect in her length of body. She has a great underline and shape to her vulva. Mark Cross of Pardeeville, Wis., paid \$2,500 to load her on his trailer.

Cierra Dickerson of Bryan, Texas, drove her Class 3 winning gilt into ring next. Cierra's gilt is sired by WGW2 King George 61-1. This lady looks like a show gilt – tall at the point of her shoulder, level down her top line and wide underneath. She will go home with Rodney Hart of Perry, Mich., for \$450.

Daniel R. Burzlaff of Delmar, Iowa, had the Class 2 winner. Dan's gilt is sired by JRSP0 TCG Committed 44-1. This brood sow prospect is feminine featured, big centered and really complete when studied on the profile. Plus, she has a great underline. From the Field by Ralph Doak, NSR Field Representative

A great set of boars and gilts with extreme breeding pieces for the future were unloaded in Des Moines, Iowa, for the crossbred show at the 2013 World Pork Expo. Kirk Swanson had the responsibility of lining up these hogs on Friday into a workable sale order. I hope everyone listened to Kirk and his reasons for lining up the hogs. It is always a learning experience to hear any judge's comments. It is especially educational for me to hear someone like Kirk, who uses his same reasoning, in the ring, as he would in his breeding barn in Red Oak, Iowa.

Saturday, Col. Ron Kreis of Adamsville, Ohio, did his usual outstanding job of selling this good set of hogs. I really appreciate Ron's masterful job.

The Grand Champion Crossbred Boar was the entry from Jennifer Livermore of Springfield, Ill. This boar was huge with a big top and solid, sound structure. He was mature in his muscle and had a big, wide chest floor. This was the first time a sandy-colored, belted boar won an NSR event, that I remember, but I am sure it won't be the last. His new owner is Showtime Sires of Newark, Ill., for \$9,000.

Mark and Sandy Ottenwalter of Colusa, Calif., were the exhibitors of the Reserve Champion Crossbred Boar. He was a Twin Turbo son that was sound footed, clean boned and had great top shape. Crossroads Genetics of Clayton, Ind., made a buy here at \$5,500.

Great fronted, perfect height of shoulder, excellent bone and foot, with overall good body shape, is how I describe the boar from Chad Hill of Hereford, Texas. This one certainly looked like a breeding hog and should make an extra good addition at Purple Power Boar Stud of Chalmers, Ind. Danners got him bought for \$11,000.

Curry Allen of Orvalo, Texas, won Class 1. This son of Hillbilly Bone was thick, level and had a bunch of muscle. He should make really easy-to-sell, 50 pounders, that will be heard of in the future. Warren Lee Ploeger of Schaller, Iowa, got him to his house to breed sows for \$27,000.

A Cut Above of Benedict, Neb., bought the second, Class 3 boar from Brinning Farms of Keota, Iowa. This boar had a medium frame, a good chest and plenty of muscle. That one needs to make showpigs; \$23,000 took this young prospect to Nebraska.

W.D. Swine Farm of Turlock, Calif., had the next boar in the ring for his appraisal. He had balance, flexibility and that blue color we all like. If Ryan didn't bring one really good blue boar, when he came out, we would think something was wrong. Next Level Genetics made the buy here at \$10,000 and will have him in Wilderado, Texas, for all to sample.

Curry Allen was back in with his second boar of the day. This one was sired by Swagger. He was ultra wide, with huge muscles and a plenty of bone. At \$30,000, this boar went to Lean Value Sires. He was one of the extreme boars here at Expo.

The boar that was the different hog of the show was from Ryan DeBusk of Paso Robles, Calif. He was sired by Killer Instinct. He was extra wide, extra level, extra heavy muscled and very moderate in frame size. He was top-selling boar and sold to Top Cut Genetics for \$47,000. A real extreme one here.

24 boars brought \$195,700 to average \$8,154.

The gilts this year were also extremely good.

The Grand Champion Crossbred Gilt was a Billy Bob daughter from Austin Pueschel of Sturgis, Mich. She looked like a sow, yet had beautiful muscle shape with style and balance. She's a tall-fronted gilt that hit the ground with correct feet and had immature, flat, heavy bone. Rockin' G Swine, Bob and Cindy Graham, made the first of their purchases of the day and will use her in their herd in Sentinel, Okla., for \$16,000.

Thirty of the 46 gilts in the sale brought more than \$1,000 and five brought more than \$10,000.

The Reserve Champion Crossbred Gilt was sired by No Fare and was another one of the popular gilts in the sale. She was massive in her rib cage and really square and on the corners with her feet and legs. Bailey Russell of Lewisville, Ind., got her in the sow herd for \$11,500. A real foundation female here.

Another of the crowd favorites was the gilt sired by Johnny Monster out of Class 6, exhibited by Blake Holmes of Kansas. She was designed as well as you could even hope, with a big, wide center rib and a high and stout, yet feminine head carriage. This lady, bred to the right boar could make that litter you've always hoped for. She was purchased by Winmor Farms of Johnston, Iowa, for \$12,500.

Balance, width, soundness, muscle and design are all terms to describe Jaci Baker's daughter of Maine Man. Though not as pounds heavy as some, this lady did not have any excuses to make when it comes to quality. This square made female found a new home for \$15,000, with Heimer Hampshires of Taylor, Mo.. Watch for this litter!

Cody Wolf gilt from Class 6 had the honor of being the top-selling gilt of the 2013 World Pork Expo crossbred gilt show. This was a daughter of Swagger and a way good female. Squareness, shape and mobility, made this gal an awesome lady. Bob and Cindy Graham of Rockin' G Swine picked out another elite lady here for \$17,000.

Forty-six crossbred gilts averaged \$3,255.43 to total \$149,750. That might be a record average.

Thanks to all who made the 2013 WPX such a great success. It is a great business we are in and with hard work it will keep getting better. See you at the "pig show" this summer.



General Information

Entry fees must accompany the entry form and all late entries will be charged double the regular fee. NSR reserves the right to close entries any time after the printed deadline. All entry fees are non-refundable. Entries must be postmarked by Aug. 10, 2013. Such warrant vis.

All breeding animals entered at the NBS® must have been owned by Aug. 10, 2013, by the exhibitor.

Crossbred boars: Stress status of your entry will be placed in the show and sale catalog (this is a show and sale requirement). A documented stress test must be presented at check-in.

All entries must be ear notched using the official NSR system. All entries must be recorded by Aug. 10, 2013, or they will be charged a rush fee. All exhibitors must be NSR junior or senior members.

No entry or substitute entry will be allowed to show or sell without a registration certificate. Entries will be divided into classes, as equal as possible, by farrowing date.

All hogs must arrive on the grounds between 8 a.m. on Saturday, Sept. 7, and noon on Sunday, Sept. 8. All animals must meet NBS® health requirements to remain on the fairgrounds. This includes animals in transit.

If all hogs meet show requirements, NBS® entries may be unloaded and non-entries may stay in your vehicle at the south end of the fairgrounds. There is some shade, but no utilities.

If non-show animals meet Minnesota import requirements, but not NBS® requirements, show animals may be unloaded and remaining animals must be immediately removed from the fairgrounds. A parking lot is available south of the fairgrounds across the street. The welfare and care of these animals is the owner's responsibility. There is some shade, but no utilities.

If any animals in your vehicle do not meet Minnesota import requirements, all animals will be refused entry, including NBS[®] animals.

No clipping is allowed in the barns.

Exhibitors & Eligibility

Exhibitors must be an active member of the NSR, or they will be required to pay the \$75 NSR maintenance fee.

Entries are limited to four Duroc, Hampshire, Landrace, Yorkshire boars, four Duroc, Hampshire, Landrace, Yorkshire open gilts and two crossbred boars per exhibitor. **NEW: All breeding stock** entries must be farrowed on or after Jan. 15, 2013, and must have at least six teats on each side.

All entries must meet their respective breed requirements. Entries that do not meet these requirements will not be allowed to show or sell at the NBS®.

Breeding Animal Sale

A minimum of 60 percent of the number of each sex (boars and gilts) shown will be selected for the sale. These animals will be selected with no set number selling from any single class. Animals not selected for the sale can be consigned to the sale for an additional fee of \$20 per head. If the animal sells, the fee will be applied toward the sale commission. If the animal does not sell, the fee is forfeited.

All animals selected and cataloged for the sale must go through the auction. Sale commission will be 15 percent for all animals. If an animal that is selected and cataloged for the sale does not go through the sale ring, the exhibitor will be banned from exhibiting at NSR events for one year and will be charged 15 percent of the average selling price of their respective breed sale. This amount must be paid before reinstatement will be allowed. The exception to this rule will be if the animal has become injured or ill and the animal is inspected by a NSR staff member prior to the sale.

The NSR acts only as the agent between the buyer and seller. If proper payment is made by the buyer in a timely manner, the NSR will make settlement with the seller in approximately 30 days after the sale.

If an exhibitor has an account that is past due, funds from the sale of their animals will be applied to their NSR account.

Special Breed Requirements

By entering any hog in the NBS[®], the owner warrants that the hog meets specific breed requirements.

Such warranty is, however, solely that of the seller and not that of the Hampshire Swine Registry, American Landrace Association and American Yorkshire Club, and the Hampshire Swine Registry, American Landrace Association and American Yorkshire Club assume no responsibility or liability in connection with such warranty by the seller.

If any animal sold at the NBS[®] is found to be a carrier of the color gene after being tested through the procedures approved by the Hampshire Swine Registry, American Landrace Association and American Yorkshire Club, the seller agrees that he will promptly refund the full purchase price to the buyer.

There will be no NSR commission refunded from hogs that are color-gene carriers.

DNA Stress Statement

No known stress positive or stress-carrier Duroc, Hampshire, Landrace or Yorkshire animals will be allowed to be exhibited or sold at any NSR-sponsored event.

Such warranty is, however, solely that of the seller and not that of the American Landrace Association, American Yorkshire Club, Hampshire Swine Registry or United Duroc Swine Registry.

The American Landrace Association, American Yorkshire Club, Hampshire Swine Registry and United Duroc Swine Registry assume no responsibility or liability in connection with such warranty by the seller.

If any animal sold at the NBS® is found to be a carrier of the stress gene, the purchaser has the right to receive full refund of the purchase price from the seller.

DNA testing for the stress gene must be done within 60 days of the sale date and all costs associated with the testing for the stress gene must be paid by the purchaser. The seller has the right to review the test results and the right to re-test the animal at a laboratory of his choice.

Cost associated with re-test by the seller is at the seller's expense. There will be no NSR commission refunded from hogs that are stress-carriers.

Health Regulations

- 1. Each animal must be accompanied by TWO COPIES of an official interstate health certificate issued by a licensed, accredited veterinarian. Certificate must show name and address of consignor; consigned to NBS[®], Mower County Fairgrounds, 700 12th Street SW, Austin, MN 55912; official identification of hog; and health status of hog, including dates and laboratory location of required tests and vaccinations. All swine must have individual health certificates and a duplicate of each certificate. Remember, only one hog per certificate. Include your vet's cell phone number on health certificates. Crossbred animals must be identified by a federally recognized numbered ear tag.
- 2. All certificates must be issued on or after Aug. 14, 2013, with the following information:
 - A. All breeding swine must be tested for Pseudorabies (PRV) and Brucellosis after Aug. 14, 2013, unless they come from a PRV-qualified and Brucellosis-validated herd. Swine tested for PRV and Brucellosis must show the date blood sample was drawn. Either the Elisa, PCFIA, ALA or S/N tests are acceptable. Differentiable Elisa test will not be accepted. If the herd of origin is PRV qualified and Brucellosis validated, individual testing will not be required. In this case, the PRV qualification and Brucellosis validation numbers must appear on the certificate and complete date must be stated.
 - B. All breeding swine coming to the show MUST be vaccinated against Leptospirosis (6-way) including bratislava and erysipelas. The complete date of vaccination MUST be listed on the health certificate. Market animals should not be vaccinated.
 - C. All health certificates must carry the following statements: Farm or origin of the swine has not had pseudorabies or swine dysentery in the last 12 months, has not had TGE in the last 60 days, feeds no garbage, uses no PRV vaccine, and is not under quarantine for any disease condition; also that vesicular stomatitus has not been diagnosed within 10 miles of the farm of origin within the last 30 days.

3. A premises ID number is required on your health papers.

Individual Market Barrow Show

The specific rules and regulations are as follows:

- Purebreds and crossbreds are eligible and will be shown separately.

- Hogs must weigh between 230 and 280 lbs.
- All purebreds must have pedigrees from their respective breed associations.
- Individual barrows from the Truckload Contest are eligible.
- Entry fee is \$30 per head.
- Market barrows do not need to be tested for pseudorabies or brucellosis. Must meet #1 and #2 and item C under Health Regulations.

Quality Assurance Training

It is mandatory that individual market barrow and truckload exhibitors complete instruction (and have certification valid through this calendar year) in either a PQA Plus™ or Youth PQA Plus™ certification program. State-sponsored youth training programs such as 4-H/Extension Livestock Quality Assurance and Ethics training will be accepted. Hogs must always be raised in accordance with the ten Good Production Practices outlined in the PQA Plus™ programs. A copy of each exhibitor's Quality Training (as listed above) must be attached to the Swine Affidavit and submitted to Hormel Foods at the time of or prior to shipment of animals.

Truckload Contest

- The popular Truckload Contest consists of two categories purebred and crossbred. No individual hogs in a truckload may weigh less than 230 lbs. or more than 280 lbs.
- Truckloads consist of six market hogs, at least three of which must be barrows. All must have been farrowed on or after Feb. 1, 2013.
- The entry fee is \$30 per load.
- Truckload entries do not need to be tested for pseudorabies or brucellosis. Must meet #1 and #2 and item C under health regulations.
- Carcass requirements: 160 lbs. minimum weight; 220 lbs. maximum weight and a minimum quality score of 2. (Minolta and pH values will be used to verify visual quality scores).

Dave Kilmer grew up on his family farm in Monticello, Ind., where he showed pigs. When he was a teenager, he claimed top honors with his Grand Champion Market Litter at the Indiana State Fair. Capturing the banner instilled a passion for livestock in Kilmer. It was also in the ring, where the swine industry would fully capture his heart and lead to his future career.

"I was 7-years-old, in 4-H, when my dad bought some Poland China pigs for my older brother to show, and I just took a liking to them. That's when it started," Kilmer says.

Showing in 4-H, helped broaden Kilmer's interest and competitiveness in the livestock industry. He exhibited numerous champions at the White County Fair in northwestern Indiana.

"I won showmanship my first year, my second I won showmanship again and champion barrow. That was what got me fired up just as much as anything," Kilmer says.

After he graduated from Purdue and received a bachelor's in animal science, he went to work for a Hampshire breeder named Denny Shoup in Michigantown, Ind.

"He helped form a lot of my mindset on hogs and raising breeding stock," Kilmer says.

Kilmer worked for Shoup just a year then he returned home to begin a partnership with his father, Parker. Kilmer and his father had already been raising hogs, but after spending time with Shoup, Kilmer had a new perspective of the industry. He bought 10 Hampshire gilts. This would serve as the foundation of their operation as they began to focus primarily on the Belted Breed.

Through the years, the Kilmers carved a living out of the industry as it continued to change around them.

"We've raised commercial boars and sold them to neighbors and farmers when herds around the country used boars for natural services. We've been

company-based and worked with Shoup and Premier Breeding Systems. We have produced thousands of boars a year for commercial use. Now, we have circled back around to the showpig side, and our market stretches from east coast to west, north to south and all places in between," Kilmer says.

Kilmer's son, Jim, returned home to pursue his true love - the showpig industry. The duo combines valuable off-the-farm experience and expertise in a multitude of different areas. Kilmer enjoys sharing the challenge of making decisions within their operation with his son.

"The showpig side allows more of an individual selection process, like what breeds to use, what sow and that sort of thing. Our work is based more on the eyeball and trying to figure out genetics and where we are headed in types," Kilmer says.

Today, they run around 200 sows. Their herd not only consists of what they were founded on, Hampshires, but also, Yorkshires, Durocs, Chesters and crossbreds. They also stay busy with their 12-head boar stud. Kilmer, his son and their herdsman, Kent Bennington, judge open and junior shows on regional and national levels. Also, Kilmer currently serves as the president of the National Swine Registries Executive Board of Directors.

A quick glimpse into how some of our industry's premier producers got their start in the purebred swine business.
