As we are winding up the Midwest state fairs, there are several things that become very apparent. I don't remember when there has been more interest with junior exhibitors showing purebred barrows and gilts. Breeders, if you haven't realized what an important role these young people and their families play in our industry, you need to step back and see what they are accomplishing. We need to appreciate their interest in exhibiting purebred genetics and their interest in what bloodlines are working. I realize the majority of these juniors and their families are not involved in the production of the commercial swine industry, and they probably have not experienced some of the trials that many of our members have.

It is very apparent to me, by the number of questions these young people and their families ask, they are interested in what has happened in the past and want to hear about your experiences. Most of them hold you, the breeder, with respect, and sometimes they are hesitant to ask about your involvement or experiences over the years. I would encourage each of you to reach out to these junior members and their families and introduce yourself. In fact, make it a point to step up to the plate and be a leader for others in our industry to become acquainted with this new generation.

I have mentioned the following several times in past editorials, but let's talk about your responsibilities as a member of the National Swine Registry (NSR). Whether you are a member of the Duroc, Hampshire, Landrace or Yorkshire association, or maybe you are a member of more than one of these, it is your responsibility to get those litters recorded in a timely manner and process the transfer of your animals to the buyer promptly. The NSR office receives several calls (especially during the fair season) from people needing the registration paper for their son or daughter's pig so they will be able to exhibit their animal in their respective purebred class. Along with providing the registration paper, it is your responsibility to know the breed eligibility requirements, including the sire requirements, of your respective breeds. Don't cheat or disappoint these young people by not providing registration papers or making sure the animal you sold to them meets the breed eligibility requirement. Once again, be a leader in these areas and show you are proud to represent the purebred swine industry.

I am very proud of the NSR team and our ability to process litter registrations and transfers in a very timely manner, but we can't do our part if we don't receive the information from you.

As the NSR is offering more National Junior Swine Association (NJSA) events and shows throughout the year and the number of entries and exhibitors continues to grow, it is imperative we have people step up to the plate to assist during these events and shows. Don't wait to be asked; volunteer to help. It might be as easy as opening a gate or helping a young junior mark their card in a novice judging contest. Each of us has two hands - one to help ourselves, and one to help someone else.



Starting a New Job on the Right Foot: Employers' pet peeves and how to avoid them

DISORGANIZATION

Starting a new job can be overwhelming. You are learning a new company, new role and meeting many new people. Employers don't think you will memorize every new face and task assigned, but they do expect you to take notes and keep track of deadlines. Whether it is a large group or a simple face-to-face meeting with your manager, it is essential to come prepared with a paper and pen for note taking.

Go over your notes and set reminders for yourself when projects are due. Your supervisor won't be sending reminders for deadlines looming. Follow up with your manager on action items and let them know how projects are progressing.

CLINGING TO MOBILE DEVICES

Limit personal interruptions - avoid frequent or prolonged distractions from personal phone calls, text messages, emails, websites and social media usage.

Overusing smart phones at work may have a negative impact on your work; it is best to just put down the device and concentrate on learning your job. In addition, don't post derogatory comments about the organization on social media sites. Even something as simple as posting, "Bored at orientation," as a Facebook status update will be taken negatively.

THE "ME" ATTITUDE

Employers often are discouraged when employees are worried more about, "What's in it for me?" rather than thinking about what they can provide for the organization. "Show us what you are worth first, and the rest will come after," shared an employer.

Don't push too hard and too quickly. Enthusiasm is necessary, but rewards and promotions may take time. Developing competency in a role may take longer than you expect, and you need to have patience.

EXPECTING IMMEDIATE FLEXIBILITY

Don't expect or request flexible work hours in your first months on the job. Unless it was clearly defined in your job offer, flexibility is usually an earned perk and shouldn't be anticipated by a new employee. First, you need to learn about the company and gain insight by spending time in the office or field with coworkers and managers during regular work hours.

Get Ready Now for FDA's New Antibiotic Use Rules on Jan. 1, 2017

With the end of the year nearing, all pork producers, including showpig exhibitors, need to be sure they've checked the boxes to be fully compliant with the Food and Drug Administration's (FDA) new antibiotic regulations that will take effect Jan. 1, 2017. To help be prepared, the Pork Checkoff offers a host of online resources through its Antibiotic Resource Center at www.pork.org/antibiotics.

"For some producers, preparing for the new regulations may mean locking down their veterinary relationship or contacting their feed supplier to prevent any feed delivery issues next January," said Dave Pyburn, vice president of science and technology for the Pork Checkoff. "Everyone may be at a different place as far as preparedness goes, but time is getting close to get the remaining things done."

The Antibiotics Resource Center includes the FDA's frequently asked questions, Pyburn noted. "This is a good place to visit if producers have specific questions about different issues and scenarios related to the new regulations," he said. "These are continually updated and expanded as new information is available."

For producers who may not have a veterinary relationship already established, an online locator tool will be added to the Antibiotics Resource Center, in November, to provide assistance. "In the interim, I'd suggest pork producers ask for referrals from neighbors with pigs or contact their state veterinarian office* for possible assistance," Pyburn said.

"With only months to go, we're urging all producers to go through the Pork Checkoff's checklist one more time to ensure everyone can answer 'Yes!' to the question 'Are you ready?'"



Hampshire-sired class

The 2017 World Pork Expo will include a purebred Hampshire-sired barrow class. Any barrow sired by a purebred Hampshire boar is eligible to participate. The barrow does not have to be marked like a Hampshire to qualify. The exhibitor must show a purebred Hampshire barrow or gilt to participate. All other rules for the crossbred barrow show apply to this class. The champion will receive \$2,500; the reserve champion will receive \$1,000; third overall will receive \$250. The top five will all be checked for DNA match, and the champion and reserve will be eligible to participate for Overall Champion Crossbred Barrow.

Bred and Owned Rule Change

The ownership rules for animals eligible for the National Junior Swine Association (NJSA) bred-and-owned program have changed. This rule change affects animals exhibited at the 2017 NJSS. There now may only be one person listed as the breeder and the owner to be eligible for the bred-and-owned division. The exhibitor's first and last name must be listed on the pedigree as the owner and breeder to be eligible. working in her garden, and most of all, spending time with her family. Hendress' pride and joy was her 4-year-old daughter, Kenzie, and spent every minute possible with her.


On Sept. 25, 2010, at the Jasper County 4-H Fairgrounds, she married Nicholas P. "Nick" Hendress. He survives.

With the showing component of livestock production, it is easy to get swept away in the competitive atmosphere and the hunger to win. But, the true industry leaders are those whose goal is to sell a show barrow or gilt to a 4-H or FFA member and hope it has some form of positive impact. Andy Forehand and his family's operation, Newcastle Genetics, has fit this mold since 1995, when the family moved from Texas to Oklahoma and started raising pigs.

ong before Newcastle Genetics took roots in the red dirt soil of Elgin, Oklahoma, Andy grew up on a ranch in New Mexico, an area surrounded by cattlemen. However, Andy found enjoyment and passion within the swine industry and showing pigs. Currently, this 125-sow operation has produced winning barrows and well-known crossbred boars such as Super Monster and Outta Hand. Newcastle Genetics presently has seven boars on hand they use and also sell semen on.

"We are a confinement operation and for the most part we farrow around 15 to 20 sows per month. In August we will have farrowed about 40 sows. We don't farrow in May and June and use those two months to take a break," Andy laughs.

If you ask Andy how the operation, functions, he'll laugh and say his son, Taylor, does all the work, and he just watches. As an operation that farrows 10 months out of the year, it is all hands on deck for the family members. Each member plays an important role with Newcastle Genetics. Andy takes responsibility for the breeding and looks after the sows, while Taylor is in charge of the finishing hogs, nursery as well as maintenance and marketing. The farrowing sector of the operation is maintained by Andy's wife, Zoe, and their daughter, Emily. Their son, Ory, helps on the family operation and can been seen in the show ring exhibiting pigs from Newcastle Genetics. Ory had the Reserve Champion Duroc Barrow at the 2015 Tulsa State Fair.

As a total confinement operation, structure and skeletal correctness are held to a high standard when gilts are being selected to be part of the breeding program at Newcastle Genetics.

"Of course we want to produce hogs that are really well balanced with a lot of eye appeal; it still takes a pretty one to win," Andy says. "We want to produce a hog that is sound, functional and worthy of being exhibited. We want kids to come here and get an animal that is of some value to them, and one they can actually show and be successful."

Andy believes that over the years they have been able to find the right balance

of maintaining correct skeletal design, while adding enough muscle shape to be competitive in the show ring. He says they aren't necessarily breeding hogs to have the most wow factor; they breed hogs to make good hogs.

"In the years I have been here helping my dad raise pigs, obviously trends are always changing, but to me there are two that never go out of style, which are balance and soundness," Taylor says. "If you can get hogs that are very sound and proportional in how they are put together, then it makes things pretty easy to have success down the road."

Once it is time to sell the pigs, Taylor utilizes a variety of platforms to market showpigs or breeding gilts to customers.

"We do a bit of everything. We try to sell off the farm, through online sales, and we hit up some live sales too," Taylor says. "This allows us to get them out in front of a different audience or group of people and build relationships."

If there are any challenges Taylor faces with his responsibility of marketing, it is making sure they have the right type of pigs available at the right time for certain customers to purchase.

"We have different groups of hogs targeting different shows. When we try to sell hogs for early spring, or ones that were born in December or January, we don't have a very big market for those down here," Taylor says. "So most of those pigs that time of year we have to picture and sell in online sales, and try to establish contacts with people 15 hours away from us."

Currently, Taylor is working on selling Newcastle's fall pig crop, which will mainly go to Texas and Oklahoma.

"It's a challenge, I guess, to be able to sell pigs across the country but it allows you to have more contacts that way," Taylor says.

As Taylor concentrates on overcoming barriers such as distance when building strong clientele relationships, Andy finds challenges in hiring help to assist on the operation.

"For the most part, our family is confined to the farm all the time. It is very difficult to find people to help anymore, especially down here where this is more cattle and farming area," Andy says.

With a family-run operation, Andy hopes his kids learn good work ethic through the challenges that can be faced when raising livestock, whether it's staying productive during the Oklahoma summer months when temperatures reach more than 100 degrees or working through times of difficulty.

"You can get a bout of PRRS or disease that goes through your herd; it's difficult on the hogs, difficult on the people and difficult financially. You have to be able to overcome it and work through it," Andy says. "I always tell my kids if you continue to work hard and overcome adversity you will always have a place, there will be something for you to do."


But, the positive times outweigh the negatives for Andy and his family, and Andy's favorite part of running Newcastle Genetics is his time spent on the operation with his wife and kids.

"This is where Taylor and I differ. I love the days of working on the farm. I enjoy breeding the sows and the genetics side of it," Andy says. "I went to graduate school and actually studied beef cattle breeding genetics. I enjoy breeding livestock period, no matter what kind it is. The effort it takes to try to make them better and improve your own herd to make progress is the part I enjoy."

Taylor enjoys the networking side of being involved in the show industry and building relationships with people and customers.

"Being able to see these pigs at eight or nine weeks old, then to see the transformation of those pigs and to see how kids work with the hogs are the things I always look back on," Taylor says.

One thing this father and son do



agree on is the person who has had a big influence on them in the industry – Jerry McLemore. McLemore is someone Andy noticed always produces hogs that bred on, which Andy made sure to emulate in his own breeding program.

"I would have to agree with my dad quite a bit. I guess one of the things I have learned from Jerry, and a lot of people would agree with me on this, Jerry doesn't sugar coat anything," Taylor says. "He will tell you exactly what he thinks about your hogs or his hogs. He isn't trying to offend you; he is just very honest in his opinion.

As Newcastle Genetics looks toward the future, Andy and Taylor hope to stabilize around their current number of sows and continue to improve and focus more on their purebred sows. While Andy dedicates his time to the operation, he also buys and sells stocker and feeder cattle, which keeps him busy, at times. He has handed the operation reigns over to Taylor, who recently graduated from Texas Tech University. Andy continues to support his son, Taylor, as he carries on the integrity of Newcastle Genetics.

"The reason we are in business and the business we are in is because we have customers. We try to produce a product that will be successful for our customers, whether it's with breeding animals or show animals," Andy says. "We want them to have success."

FATURE RAISED ON A IEVALERATION

ON JULY 4, 2016, FAMILIES ACROSS THE COUNTRY WERE MAKING THEIR WAY TO THE KENTUCKY **EXPOSITION CENTER** IN LOUISVILLE FOR THE NATIONAL JUNIOR SUMMER SPECTACULAR (NJSS) AND SUMMER TYPE CONFERENCE (STC). NOT TOO MANY YEARS AGO, THE MURPHY FAMILY FROM NEW PARIS, OHIO, WOULD HAVE BEEN AMONG THEM. THIS YEAR, THEY FOUND THEMSELVES IN A DIFFERENT ARENA. INSTEAD OF SHOWING HOGS ON THE GREEN SHAVINGS, MARK MURPHY WAS WATCHING HIS SON, CLAYTON, COMPETE IN SALEM, OREGON, AT THE 2016 U.S. OLYMPIC TRACK & FIELD TRIALS.



Before he began his running career, Clayton developed his competitive spirit showing hogs. He showed Durocs at the Darke County Fair, Ohio State Fair and national shows, including the STC and NJSS. One of the things he enjoyed most about the show ring was the competition.

"Competition is always great in the show ring, no matter where you are showing, whether it be the county fair, state fair or national shows. That feeling when the judge holds up number one to you or you are handed the purple banner is a great feeling and shows that hard work pays off," he says.

When Clayton got to junior high, he started running cross country with his friends. They thought it would be fun and easy. Clayton says, it turned out to be fun, but not all that easy. That's where his farm background kicked in.

"I had to get up each morning to complete chores, feed pigs, clean pens or mow the yard. They were simple chores, but I was expected to complete them before my parents returned from work," Clayton says. "I think that sort of responsibility and learning to work hard on the farm translates to being successful in running."

Clayton found he had to have the same drive to succeed on the track field as he did in the hog show ring. In high school, he joined the track team. He spent hours doing extra exercises and work outs on his own. He pushed himself to get better and better to reach the next level of achievement.

His hard work earned him a scholarship to the University of Akron to study engineering and run on the track team. After several NCAA champion titles, he forfeited his NCAA eligibility to turn pro. This summer, he competed in the 800-meter dash at the U.S. Olympic Track & Field Trials.

In order to compete in the Olympic Games in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, Clayton had to be one of the top three runners with a time of 1:46.00 or less. When the dust settled at the trials in Oregon, Clayton had a time of 1:44.76, making him the winner and an Olympic qualifier.

"My favorite part is the opportunity to represent the U.S. in the ultimate competition," Clayton says. "To be able to wear the USA jersey and the Red, White and Blue is an honor, and I am super excited about it."

On August 15, Clayton stepped onto the track in Rio wearing red, white and blue. After running the two 400 meter laps of the track, he found only two other men ahead of him. His running time of 1:42.93 earned him a bronze medal at the 2016 Olympic Games. That is the first medal the U.S. has earned in the men's 800 meter since 1992. Clayton's 800 meter time is also the third-fastest time in American history.

To some, running in the Olympics and showing pigs would have nothing to do with one another. But for Clayton, they aren't really all that different.

"You spend so much time preparing your pig for the show, for that one opportunity to show off all your hard work in the show ring. I think running is similar to the show ring – you have one opportunity to really show off your hard work," he says. "You get one chance on the track to really compete,



Many exhibitors have a checklist of items that need to be completed before heading to a hog show. Showbox packed – check; trailer cleaned – check; health papers and blood work done – check. Before loading hogs for a pedigreed show, it is also important to make sure they meet the respective breed eligibility requirements. Breeders also need to be sure the requirements are met before registering and selling a purebred animal. The breed standards and eligibility requirements for National Swine Registry (NSR) hogs are outlined here as a reference.

- Wide forehead and good width between eyes
- Upright ears
- Long neck
- Slope and cushion to pasterns with even toes and a large foot (front and rear)
- 5. Long, lean, semi-level top line
- 6. Wide chest floor with uniform width from front to rear. Forerib with more width at bottom of rib than at the point of shoulder.
- At least 12 evenly spaced, prominent teats (six on a side minimum; three in front of sheath on boars.)
- Long, level rump with a high tail
- Length, depth and natural width of ham. Muscle appropriate to the width of skeleton.

Duroc Breed Eligibility Requirements

- 1. Duroc barrows or gilts exhibited as market animals:
 - a. Must be red in color and possess Duroc breed character. Ears must be down.
 - b. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
 - c. Must NOT have any white hair located on the animal.
 - d. Must NOT have any black hair located on the animal.
 - e. Must NOT have more than three black spots on the skin, and none of these spots can be larger than two inches in diameter.
 - f. Must NOT have any shading or indication of a belt.
 - g. Must have no evidence of an extra dewclaw.
 - h. Must be stress negative.
 - i. There are no underline requirements to exhibit Duroc barrows or gilts as market animals.

- 2. Duroc boars and gilts intended for breeding:
 - Must meet the above requirements (except item 1.i.), along with the following to be eligible for recording and exhibition in a breeding animal class:
 - i. The United Duroc Swine Registry (UDSR) will allow Durocs to be **recorded** with less than 12 teats. However, to be **exhibited** at breeding stock shows, Durocs must possess six or more functional teats on each side of the underline. Pin teats and inverted nipples are not considered functional.
 - ii. A boar must not have a physical defect (including but not limited to an adhered or tied penis, limp penis, infantile penis and coiling of the penis in the diverticulum), which would hinder proper delivery of semen, and the boar must extend his penis without physical manipulation excluding the expression of the sheath fluid; if a boar cannot meet the above requirements, his pedigree will be canceled.


Hampshire Breed Eligibility Requirements

- Hampshire barrows or gilts exhibited as market animals:
 - a. Must be black in color with a white belt starting on the front leg. The belt may partially or totally encircle the body. Animal is eligible if it has a black head and the body is totally white.
 - b. Must possess Hampshire breed character (ears must be erect and not rounded).
 - c. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
 - d. Must NOT have any white hair or indications of streaking on the forehead.
 - e. Must NOT have any red hair.
 - f. Must NOT have any evidence of an extra dewclaw.
 - g. Must be stress negative.
 - h. There are no underline requirements to exhibit Hampshire barrows or gilts as market animals.
- 2. Hampshire boars and gilts intended for breeding:
 - a. Must meet the above requirements (except item 1.a.), along with the following to be eligible for recording and exhibition in a breeding animal class:
 - i. Black in color with a white belt totally encircling the body, including both front legs and feet.

- ii. Animal can have white on its nose as long as the white does not break the rim of the nose, and when its mouth is closed, the white under the chin can NOT exceed what a U.S. minted quarter will cover.
- iii. White is allowed on the rear legs as long as it does NOT extend above the tuber calis bone (knob of the hock).
- iv. Hampshire swine classified as off-belts may be used for breeding purposes, with offspring eligible for registration with the NSR. Off-belts will continue to be eligible to be shown in market hog classes, but will not be eligible for exhibition in breeding swine shows. This policy is retroactive and will allow litters to be **registered** that were not eligible previously, due to the Hampshire Swine Registry off-belt requirements.
- v. Hampshire breeding animals may be recorded with less than 12 teats. However, to be **exhibited** at breeding stock shows, Hampshires must possess six or more functional teats on each side of the underline. Pin teats and inverted nipples are not considered functional.



Landrace Breed Eligibility Requirements

- 1. Landrace barrows and gilts exhibited as market animals:
 - a. Must be white in color and possess Landrace breed character (ears must be down). Refer to ideal Landrace photo.
 - b. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
 - c. Must NOT allow any color hair other than white.
 - d. Must NOT allow more than three spots of skin pigmentation.
 - e. Must NOT allow any spot of skin pigmentation larger than one U.S. minted quarter.
 - f. Must have no evidence of an extra dewclaw.
 - g. Must be stress negative.
 - h. Must not have hernia or rupture both scrotal and abdominal.
 - i. Must not have hermaphroditism.
 - j. Must not have cryptorchidism.

Yorkshire Breed Eligibility Requirements


- 1. Yorkshire barrows or gilts exhibited as market animals:
 - a. Must be white in color and possess Yorkshire breed character (ears must be erect).
 - b. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
 - c. Must NOT have any color hair except for white.
 - d. Must NOT have more than two pigmentation spots larger than a U.S. minted dime or one pigmentation spot larger than a U.S. minted quarter. These pigmentation spots (combined) can NOT exceed a U.S. minted silver dollar.
 - e. Must have no evidence of an extra dewclaw.
 - f. Must be stress negative.
 - g. There are no underline requirements to record and exhibit Yorkshire barrows or gilts as market animals.

- k. Barrows must not have one testicle or any pronounced abdominal condition of the testicles.
- Must have at least six functional udder sections on each side of the underline. Pin teats and inverted nipples are not considered functional.
- 2. Landrace boars and gilts intended for breeding:
 - a. Must meet the above requirements along with the following to be eligible for recording and exhibition in a breeding animal class:
 - i. A boar must not have a physical defect (including but not limited to an adhered or tied penis, limp penis, infantile penis and coiling of the penis in the diverticulum), which would hinder proper delivery of semen, and the boar must extend his penis without physical manipulation excluding the expression of the sheath fluid; if a boar cannot meet the above requirements, his pedigree will be canceled.
- 2. Yorkshire boars and gilts intended for breeding:
 - a. Must meet the above requirements (except item 1.g.), along with the following to be eligible for recording and exhibition in a breeding animal class:
 - i. Must possess six or more functional teats on each side of the underline to be recorded and exhibited. Pin teats and inverted nipples are not considered functional.
 - ii. A boar must not have a physical defect (including but not limited to an adhered or tied penis, limp penis, infantile penis and coiling of the penis in the diverticulum), which would hinder proper delivery of semen, and the boar must extend his penis without physical manipulation excluding the expression of the sheath fluid; if a boar cannot meet the above requirements, his pedigree will be canceled.

ENTRY INFORMATION

- » Entry fees for all entries must accompany the respective entry form.
- » All entries must be postmarked by Oct. 6, 2016.
- » All late entries will be charged double the regular entry fees. All entry fees are non-refundable.
- The NSR reserves the right to close entries due to pen space limitations any time after the printed deadline.
- All senior exhibitors must be active members of the NSR or must pay the \$75 non-member exhibitor fee. An active senior member is age 22 and OVER, paid annual dues and recorded at least one litter in the 2016 fiscal year.
- » Participants age 21 and UNDER of age are required to pay a \$15 junior participation fee.
- » All pedigrees for purebred breeding animal entries must be recorded by Nov. 4, 2016, or an additional rush fee will be charged.
- » Breeding hogs only: Berkshire, Chester, Poland and Spot breeding hog entries can be submitted through the ABA and CPS offices.

EXHIBITOR REQUIREMENTS

- » If an exhibitor has an NSR account that is past due, funds from the sale of their animals will be applied to their past-due account.
- » Only exhibitors consigning animals to the Fall Classic are allowed to bring additional animals onto the Stephens County Expo and Fair. Additional animals MUST abide by the same health requirements as Fall Classic entries.

ARRIVAL & DEPARTURE

- » All hogs must arrive on the grounds between 8 a.m., Wednesday, Nov. 16, and 9 a.m., Thursday, Nov. 17.
- » All weanling pig entries must be checked in by 11 a.m. on Thursday, Nov. 17.
- » Exhibitors transporting additional animals (deliveries/ parking lot sales) will be required to obtain official "Sale Permit" from the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture staff when entering the Stephens County Expo and Fair.
- » Before leaving the Stephens County Expo and Fair, this permit must be returned to agents of the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, with a detailed buyers list documenting the destination of each animal (including pre-purchased deliveries, parking lot sales and sifted weanling pigs).

DNA STRESS STATEMENT

- » No known stress positive or stress carrier Duroc, Hampshire, Landrace or Yorkshire animals will be allowed to be exhibited or sold at any NSR-sponsored event.
- » Such warranty is, however, solely that of the seller and not that of the American Landrace Association (ALA), American Yorkshire Club (AYC), Hampshire Swine Registry (HSR) or the United Duroc Swine Registry (UDSR).

- The ALA, AYC, HSR and UDSR assume no responsibility or liability in connection with such warranty by the seller.
- » If any NSR purebred animal sold at this conference is found to be a carrier of the stress gene, the purchaser has the right to receive full refund of the purchase price from the seller.
- » DNA testing for the stress gene must be done within 60 days of the sale date and all costs associated with testing for stress must be paid by the purchaser. The seller has the right to review the test results and the right to re-test the animal at a laboratory of his/her choice.
- » Cost associated with re-test by the seller is at the seller's expense. There will be no refund of NSR commission from stress-carrier animals.

BREEDING ANIMAL SALE

- A minimum of 60% of the number of each sex (boars and gilts) shown will be selected for the sale. These animals will be selected with no set number selling from any single class. Animals not selected for the sale can be consigned to the sale for an additional fee of \$20 per head; this must be done by the conclusion of the respective breed show. If the animal sells, the fee will be applied toward the sale commission. If the animal does not sell, the fee is forfeited.
- All animals selected and cataloged for the sale MUST go through the auction. Sale commission will be 15% for all animals. If an animal that is selected and cataloged for sale does not go through the sale ring, the exhibitor will be banned from exhibiting at NSR events for one year and will be charged 15% of the average selling price of their respective breed sale. This amount must be paid before reinstatement will be allowed. The exception to this rule will be if an animal has become injured or ill and is inspected by an NSR staff member prior to the sale.
- The NSR acts only as the agent between buyer and seller. If proper payment is made by the buyer in a timely manner, the NSR will make settlement with the seller in approximately 30 days after the sale.

PUREBRED ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- » By entering any purebred hog (breeding or weanling) in the Fall Classic, the owner warrants that the hog meets specific breed requirements.
- » Such warranty, however, is solely that of the seller and not that of the HSR, ALA, AYC and UDSR and the HSR, ALA, AYC and UDSR assumes no responsibility or liability in connection with such warranty by the seller.

- If any Hampshire, Landrace or Yorkshire animal sold at the Fall Classic is found to be a carrier of the color gene after being tested through the procedures approved by the HSR, ALA and AYC, the seller agrees that he/she will promptly refund the full purchase price to the buyer. There will be no refund of NSR commission from animals that are carriers of the color gene.

HEALTH REGULATIONS

- 1. EACH ANIMAL ENTERING THE STEPHENS COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS MUST BE LISTED ON AN OFFICIAL INTERSTATE CERTIFICATE OF VETERINARY INSPECTION (CVI) ISSUED BY A LICENSED, ACCREDITED VETERINARIAN. THIS INCLUDES DELIVERIES AND PARKING LOT PURCHASES. LOADS CONTAINING ANY SWINE WITHOUT ALL THE BELOW MENTIONED REQUIREMENTS WILL NOT BE GRANTED ACCESS TO THE STEPHENS COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS.
 - A. All animals and CVIs will be inspected by state officials prior to unloading.
 - B. Multiple animals may be listed on the same original CVI. However, breeding stock and weanling pigs must be entered on separate original CVIs.
 - **C.** All entries coming from outside of Oklahoma MUST obtain an interstate permit number. Only your accredited veterinarian may obtain this permit number by calling the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture at 405.522.6141.
 - D. CVIs are not required to be stamped by the state of origin.
- 2. CVIs MUST BE ISSUED ON OR AFTER FRIDAY, OCT. 21, 2016, WITH THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - A. Name and address of consignor; consigned to the Fall Classic, Stephens County Expo and Fair, 2002 South 13th Street, Duncan, OK 73533.
 - B. ALL animals (including deliveries and parking lot purchases) MUST be officially identified with a federally-approved, permanently-numbered ear tag.
 - For more information on federally-approved ear tags, please visit http://www.nationalswine.com/shows/ear_tags.php.
 - C. Ear notches and ear tag ID number of each animal MUST be listed on the CVI.
 - D. Health status of animal, including dates of required tests and vaccinations MUST be listed.
 - E. A premise ID number MUST be included on the CVI.
 - F. Your veterinarian's cell phone number MUST be included on the CVI.
 - G. ALL CVIs MUST CARRY THE FOLLOWING STATEMENTS "Farm or origin of swine":
 - i. Has not had pseudorabies or swine dysentery in the last 12 months
 - ii. Has not had any clinical signs or diagnosis of TGE or PEDv in the last 60 days
 - iii. Feeds no raw garbage and uses no PRV vaccine
 - iv. Is not under quarantine for any disease condition
 - v. Has not had vesicular stomatitis diagnosed within 10 miles of farm or origin in the last 30 days

3. REQUIRED TESTS:

A. PSEUDORABIES (PRV) TESTING:

- 1. ALL ANIMALS MUST be individually tested for PRV on or after Friday, Oct. 21, 2016, UNLESS animals come from a PRV-qualified herd.
 - i. Swine tested must have all official identification (sex, ear tag and ear notch) along with date blood sample was drawn (month, day and year) listed on CVI.
 - ii. Animals must test PRV-negative with all results on the dated CVI.
 - iii. Either the ELISA (gB ELISA), ALA or S/N tests are acceptable. Differentiable ELISA (g1 ELISA) test will NOT be accepted.
 - iv. If the herd of origin is PRV qualified, individual testing of each animal is not required. In this case, the PRV qualification number must appear on the CVI and the most recent quarterly herd test date (month, day and year) must be stated on the CVI.

B. BRUCELLOSIS TESTING:

- 1. ALL ANIMALS MUST be individually tested for brucellosis on or after Friday, Oct. 21, 2016, <u>UNLESS</u> animals originate from a validated brucellosis-free herd.
 - i. Swine tested must have all official identification (sex, ear tag and ear notch) along with date blood sample was drawn (month, day and year) listed on CVI.
 - ii. Animals must test brucellosis negative with all results on the dated CVI.
 - iii. The RAP, Standard Plate, Standard Tube or BAPA brucellosis tests are all accepted.
 - iv. If the herd of origin is brucellosis validated, individual testing of each animal is not required. In this case, the validation numbers must appear on the CVI and the most recent quarterly herd test date (month, day and year) must be stated on the CVI.
- 4. VACCINATIONS:
 - A. ALL animals being exhibited in the breeding shows MUST be vaccinated against Leptospirosis (6-way) including Bratislava and Erysipelas on or after Oct. 21, 2016. The complete date of vaccination MUST be listed on the CVI. This is not a requirement for weanling pigs.
 - B. All WEANLING animals MUST be vaccinated against mycoplasma and circovirus. This is a sale requirement for weanling pigs only.
 - C. It is strongly recommended that all animals are vaccinated against influenza. This is not a requirement.
- In some instances, these rules are in addition to Oklahoma regulations, but are necessary to sell animals into other states to meet interstate transport and entry requirements for swine.
- The rules above are the same for breeding stock and weanling pigs, unless specified otherwise.

RW Genetics is founded with Rick Whitman as the RWG herdsman, by his sister, Connie Rule, and her husband, Spence Rule, in Palmyra, Nebraska. The herd begins with 47 ISO weaned Duroc gilts from Guy Jackson along with 84 breeding-age Hampshire gilts from John Penner. Penner and Jackson were selected by RWG because of their reputation for superior herd health along with the ability of putting together females that could serve as a foundation for any herd.

83/84 of the purchased Hampshire gilts make it through the farrowing barn allowing RWG to begin selling commercial terminal boars.

At the WPX, RWG exhibits the world record setting Duroc gilt that is sold for \$14,200 and is derived from 44-2, one of the 47 Duroc gilts purchased from Guy Jackson. The following year, the record-setting gilt then produces the \$31,000 Duroc boar that is sold to SGI.

As hog prices plunge to \$8/cwt, RWG's commercial boar clientele begins to dwindle. The bankers advise Spence and Connie to get out of the commercial boar industry, so the entire RWG operation is sold to Rick Whitman at an extremely discounted price.

RWG continues to sell commercial terminal boars. During the peak of the commercial boar industry RW Genetics sells close to 350 boars a year.

Philosophies from seasoned hog breeders and evaluators describing how visual conformation impacts production.



Power of a feed bucket

Body condition and fleshing ability of hogs is certainly important, but not rocket science. If it was, I for sure would not be the one asked to write about it. Please realize, my thoughts and statements reflect 40 plus years of mostly observed education. However, I was taught in my college human sociology class about fecundity. My professor lectured one day (and it was on his test) that females with a slightly higher degree of fat also tended to have a higher degree of fecundity. Now, for those who think fecundity sounds dirty, which I did at the time, it means the ability to produce offspring, especially in large numbers. If we want our sows and gilts to have high fecundity, then they need some flesh, cover, or simply put, fat on them to achieve high reproductive efficiency. Now, please do not read into this statement and think I believe we need overly fat gilts and sows. We just need some fat on them, because without any fat, they will go into anestrous.

Let's back up a bit with regard to developing replacement gilts to be bred. Not much is discussed these days about flushing gilts prior to breeding, resulting in larger litters. Quite frankly, not much needs to be said, except you should have your gilts gaining weight prior to and at breeding. After breeding, start decreasing feed slightly so your gilts are not too fleshy at farrowing time. Ideally, your gilts should be on the slightly thin side at farrowing. Dystocia will be reduced, and gilts will recover and milk better if they are slightly thin and hungry after farrowing. It's really important to feed gilts through lactation so they have enough condition to show estrous and rebreed. Some extra-heavy milking gilts and sows with large litters are so skinny they do not cycle right after weaning and need to be on full feed to kick start their cycle again. That also happens with some beef cows and has led some cattlemen to select for cows more moderate in milking in order to get them to rebreed more readily. I believe we hogmen could do better by adopting some of that moderate milking

philosophy. Have you ever noticed the fattest pigs weaned don't start on feed as quickly as the average-fleshed, hungry pigs? Maybe too much is made of 21-day litter weights rather than rebreeding interval and longevity of the udder?

Even though I believe skeletal correctness is the most important genetic trait influencing longevity, the degree of flesh or fat is the most important thing hogmen can control that impacts longevity. Females that are too fat will have a shorter productive life, while females that are too skinny might live longer, but will have less reproductive efficiency. Breaking news (not): balance is best.

So far, my comments on body condition have solely related to the reproductive aspect. Now, what about the showpig side? Quite frankly, leanness or fat, genetically, has little to do with the showpig world today. Over the years, genetically, we've changed fat on the hog rapidly because it's one of the highly heritable traits. Several years ago, when the Pietrain breed was introduced to the showpig world, it was common to have pigs shown with fat barely measureable. I remember being asked to judge a major market hog show and was told to try to put a stop to the madness of these .2 - .4 backfat hogs. I wasn't able to stop that trend then, but now we desire hogs neither too fat or too lean.

Selecting a prospect pig for the correct amount of flesh at it's desired show weight is more genetic selection than phenotypic. You need to study fleshing tendencies of the genetic lines represented. If you do it by phenotype alone, make sure the pig is heavy structured and has plenty of width. You will also need lots of luck. As long as you start with a prospect pig that has a heavy, wide enough skeleton with a good appetite, you, as a feeder, should be able to control the flesh and condition desired. In summary, your feed bucket, which can control the fat or lean body condition, has a great deal to do with your success not only in the show ring, but in your sow herd.
