



# ED Open Mike AL

### The business of doing business.

As we enter the New Year, many litters are on the ground for upcoming events throughout the country. If you are connected to social media, you are aware that many producers have placed pictures and the information on these prospects that will be available to many junior members and their families. In this issue, many of the National Swine Registry members will be showcasing their breeding programs and the prospects available to the buying public.

The promise of a great year for exhibiting animals is in the minds of NJSA members, along with 4-H and FFA members from the east coast to the west coast and from the northern states to the southern states. Never in history have there been more opportunities for purebred Duroc, Hampshire, Landrace and Yorkshire barrows and gilts to be exhibited at NJSA events or NJSA affiliated events. These young people along with their parents, 4-H leaders and FFA advisors make their buying decisions from pedigree information that you advertise. Don't disappoint them by not taking care of business.

When I refer to 'The Business of Doing Business' I am talking about your responsibility as a breeder and seller of registered animals. It is your responsibility to get the needed DNA tests completed on any boars that you breed your gilts and sows to or if you are in the business of selling semen on the boars in your Al stud, please become familiar with the rules and eligibility requirements for each of the herd sires in their respective breed. If you have any questions please refer to nationalswine.com and click on the NSR Library in the lower right hand corner and then check under the Resources section and you can locate the sire DNA testing requirements. The NSR continues to research new DNA technologies to offer you the most accurate and efficient manner to allow you to provide AI certificates on the semen you sell or litters you are registering. Folks, these tests take an average of six weeks to get completed. Make it your business to get your young sires tested as soon as they arrive on your farm. I know six weeks seems like a long time, but it is relatively short turn around compared to the old physical test mating requirement of three months, three weeks and three days waiting for a litter to be farrowed to qualify your sire for their respective breed requirements.

I strongly encourage all breeders to make the business of recording your litters a monthly activity. Mark it on your calendar for the same day every month and create a great habit. Please don't wait until the call comes from the young people that you sold animals to and request the pedigree on the animal you sold to them 60-90 days prior. The NSR pedigree staff spends considerable time on the phone filling rush orders for members who don't take care of business. Get your litters recorded promptly so you provide these young people the pedigree to look at when they viewed the prospects you are offering.

Once these prospects are sold, get those animals transferred promptly. You can't believe the number of calls I receive from disgruntled parents stating, we have called the breeder several times and we still don't have the pedigree for our son or daughter and they have a show coming up in two weeks and can't show in their respective breed class without the pedigree. I hear this comment from these parents, "we are never buying pigs from that firm again!" Get them the pedigree!!!

Folks, you are in a business. Treat your buyers as you want to be treated.

### **Scholarships**

The National Junior Swine Association (NJSA) is dedicated to providing as many opportunities and programs for our members as possible. One of the ways that we constantly strive to improve is through our scholarship program, which often doesn't get the recognition that it deserves. Each year, the NJSA awards upwards of \$14,000 in scholarships at the National Junior Summer Spectacular to our outstanding youth. With the scholarship deadline rapidly approaching, I wanted to give an overview of each scholarship. If you know junior members, or you are a junior member that would like some help paying for college, make sure you complete the application and get it sent in to the National Swine Registry by March 1, 2017!

First and foremost, the NJSA works with several outstanding families to award memorial scholarships in recognition of their loved ones. Each of these scholarships are unique and are awarded to members that share the same passions as the scholarships' namesake. These memorial scholarships are the Claude Robinson Memorial Scholarship, the Jason Shipley Memorial Scholarship, the Gregory D. Johnson Memorial Scholarship, and the Mike Cox Memorial Scholarship.

- The Claude Robinson Memorial Scholarship was established by Eddie and Tammy Robinson and family of Wellsville, Missouri. This scholarship is awarded to NJSA members that are members of collegiate livestock judging teams, either junior or senior college. Mr. Robinson had a great passion for livestock judging and his family has chosen to honor his memory by creating a scholarship for a junior member that shares that same passion.
- The Jason Shipley Memorial Scholarship is awarded to NJSA members that are actively involved in both showing livestock and athletics. The Shipley family created this scholarship in memory of their son, and they play an active role in selecting a recipient of this scholarship who embodies and shares the same passion Jason had for livestock and athletics.
- The **Gregory D. Johnson Memorial Scholarship** was established by Marv and Helen Johnson of New York in honor of their late son, Gregory. This scholarship is awarded to current and past NJSA members that are pursuing an advance degree in swine genetics, swine reproduction or swine nutrition.
- The Mike Cox Memorial Scholarship was established by the Cox family in honor of Mike Cox. This scholarship is awarded to a past or present NJSA member who is an incoming freshman, sophomore or junior for the upcoming fall semester enrolled in an agriculturally related field.


If you don't meet the requirements for the scholarships listed above, don't fret because the NJSA provides several more scholarship opportunities through the Outstanding NJSA Member Scholarship, the Juniors Helping Juniors Scholarship, the American Yorkshire Club Scholarship, the TC Trailer Sales Scholarship, and the Maschhoff's Inc. Pork Production Scholarship.

- The Outstanding NJSA Member Scholarship is awarded to one novice member, one junior member, one intermediate member, and two senior members. These scholarships are awarded on the basis of demonstrated NJSA or livestock industry leadership, scholastic excellence, youth leadership activities and interest in the swine industry.
- The Juniors Helping Juniors Scholarship is awarded to one NJSA member and is unique in that the funds are derived solely from NJSA members donating their show premiums to this scholarship.



COMMONLY ASKED QUESTIONS THE NSR STAFF RECEIVES AND THEIR ANSWERS

# Q: How do I schedule sale service?

ne of the many questions I get this time of year is, "How do I schedule sale service from the National Swine Registry?" I generally respond to that question with several questions of my own. But before I describe the process of booking sale service, I would like explain the different types of sale service that the NSR offers.

Historically, the NSR has offered sale service for live auctions. Many of you have fond memories of attending production sales and seeing a fieldman in attendance visiting with breeders, taking phone bids, working the ring and filling orders for interested parties that could not be in attendance. As times have changed, so has the way our membership markets their stock. We still have live auctions, but a larger percentage of our members choose to market their stock online through internet sales. Now from the comfort of your home, office, car or tractor you can surf the web for your next herd boar, bred gilt, or project for NJSA members.

Back to the original question, "How do I schedule sale service?" My first question is what type of sale are you having?

#### **Live Auctions:**

For a live auction, the process is pretty simple. First, contact your fieldman or the NSR office with the date you have selected and check to see if that date is available. The NSR staff try and accommodate all requests, but inevitably there will be some requests we cannot schedule. Once you have the date scheduled and cleared with the NSR office, you will need to run a one page, full-color advertisement in the *Seedstock EDGE*. The Marketing and Communications department can assist with the design and

development of your ad at no additional cost or you can send the ad in camera-ready.

#### **Live Auction Sale Service Details:**

- \$300 sale service fee for breeders that have recorded less than 100 litters in the previous year OR;
- \$200 sale service fee for breeders that have recorded 100 or more litters in the previous year
- Must also run a one page, full-color sale advertisement in the *Seedstock EDGE*

#### **Online Auctions:**

For online auctions the process is even easier. Simply contact your fieldman with your sale date and check to see if they are available. I would highly encourage you to do this a month or so in advance of the sale. For online sales we work more as a consultant or third party. We schedule a farm visit, look over the offering, take notes, and ask you questions about your program. After the visit you contact your sale manager and have them list that a NSR fieldman has viewed the sale offering and is available to answer questions that you may have.

#### **Online Auction Sale Service Details:**

- \$300 sale service fee for breeders that have recorded less than 100 litters in the previous year OR;
- \$200 sale service fee for breeders that have recorded 100 or more litters in the previous year
- Must also forward the NSR field representative's contact information to the site hosting your online sale.

#### NSR Leadership Meeting highlights

<u>NSR NEWS</u>

The National Swine Registry Youth Advisory Board and National Swine Registry Executive Committee held meetings in San Antonio, Texas, from Dec. 12-14, 2016. The NSR Youth Advisory Board worked through an agenda of items on Monday, Dec. 12, prior to a joint meeting with the NSR Executive Committee the morning of Tuesday, Dec. 13. Recommendations from the NSR Youth Advisory Board were presented to the NSR Executive Committee during this joint meeting and the NSR Executive Committee voted on proposed recommendations. Below are action items of interest resulting from these meetings.

#### YOUTH ADVISORY BOARD UPDATES

- Barrow Weight Requirement Change for NJSA Southwest Regional, Eastern Regional and Western Regional Shows:
  - » The NSR Youth Advisory Board recommended the bottom weight limit for barrows be removed at the NJSA Southwest, Eastern and Western Regional shows. The goal of this recommendation was to allow exhibitors more opportunities to show lighter weight barrows that may be heading to additional state and national events following these specified NJSA regional shows. This recommendation was passed by the NSR Executive Committee. The bottom weight limit for barrows has been removed at the following shows, effective August 1, 2017: Southwest Regional, Woodward, Okla.; Eastern Regional, Hamburg, N.Y.; and Western Regional, Paso Robles, Calif.
- NJSA Sweepstakes Rule Change:
  - » The NSR Youth Advisory Board recommended to remove the following rule regarding NJSA Sweepstakes tabulation from the NJSA Handbook: "For shows with a judging contest, sweepstakes points are only awarded to those that are exhibiting at the show." The NSR Executive Committee voted to accept the recommendation, which will become effective August 1, 2017.



# BROJHERS WAR

Seven years and more than 1,000 miles separate brothers Brett and Todd Beyers. With those kind of statistics, it would be easy to lose touch or have minimal contact. But, both Beyers brothers agree their relationship is stronger today than ever because of 35 Duroc sows in Sibley, Illinois.

Brett the county fair, but it wasn't until the end of his 4-H career and the early years of Todd's that they became aware of the showpig world. Showing Duroc hogs bridged the age gap between the brothers and gave them a connection to each other. In 2002, when Todd was graduating high school, they decided the best way for them to maintain their relationship was to form an official partnership and raise showpigs.

"When we first started, we just had a vision of doing this deal together. We thought we could get to about 10 to 15 sows and sell barrows and gilts for show projects," Todd says. They knew it could work, because they had watched their dad farm in partnership with his brothers. So, that year Brett left his job at Somerset Farms, in Indiana, and moved home to Illinois. He brought with him two bred Duroc sows and an open gilt to officially start Beyers Farms.

What the brothers didn't anticipate was the offer Todd received when he graduated from Lake Land Community College. Texas A&M would waive his out-of-state tuition if he would join their livestock judging team. With some encouragement from Brett, Todd accepted the offer, then stayed to earn his master's degree. While at Texas A&M, he met and fell in love with a Texas native.

They married, in 2007, and decided to stay in the Lone Star State.

Todd and his wife, Moriah, now make their home in Abernathy, Texas, with their children, Bryleigh and Zane. The direction Todd's life took was not in the original partnership plan, but it has turned out to be a blessing in disquise. His location has broadened the clientele base for Beyers Farms and opened the Texas showpig market for them. He is responsible for 90 percent of the hogs they sell to Texas by taking orders, making deliveries and being available to answer customer questions. He has also been able to find a few different breeding pieces from the Southwest to add to their program.

Back in Sibley, Illinois, Brett, his wife, Jodi, and their children, Brooke, Lane, Kinley and Keaton, are in charge of breeding, farrowing and marketing the pigs for Beyers Farms. Brett's location allows him to evaluate current popular red boars at several major boar studs in the

They maintain a loyal customer base that keeps their hogs in high demand.

"It's kind of a partnership," Brett says. "I'll do my job six months out of the year, our customers do their job four or five months out of the year, and hopefully we'll be successful."

2016 Illinois State Fair Junior Show. Todd will always remember Beyers Farms being selected to offer the National Junior Swine Association (NJSA) Foundation Female, in 2014.

Making the hogs that meet the Beyers Farms standards requires a

Midwest, which helps the brothers make their mating decisions.

The brothers' vision of working together has remained the same, but the scope of the operation has surpassed their initial expectations. Today, the partnership includes about 35 sows and three to four breeding-age boars they use on their own sows and sell semen to other breeders. Youth showpig projects are still the bread and butter of their operation, but they are also making a name for themselves on the breeding stock side.

Brett will be the first to admit the way they sell their stock may be seen as a bit unconventional for today's showpig market. Most of the pigs are marketed off the farm, and several are sold sight unseen, at certain times of the year.

Their success started the year after they officially began Beyers Farms, when Todd showed the Reserve Champion Bred-and-Owned Duroc Gilt at the 2003 National Junior Summer Spectacular (NJSS). Several hogs with the BEYE herdmark have made their way to the winner's circle at the World Pork Expo (WPX) Jr. National and NJSS since then, including the Reserve Grand Champion Overall Purebred Barrow at the 2010 WPX Jr. National, the Reserve Grand Champion Overall Purebred Gilt at the 2010 NJSS and Reserve Grand Champion Overall Purebred Barrow at the 2012 NJSS. One of the highlights for Brett was when a barrow they raised was named Grand Champion Land of Lincoln and a littermate gilt was named Grand Champion Gilt at the

lot of research and planning before the pigs hit the ground. The brothers believe each sow should have the best mating they can give her. They don't just select one boar to use on a group of sows. Instead, they spend hours considering each individual sow on the farm and choosing a boar they think will do the best job for her. They also do a lot of repeat matings. If the brothers decide on a mating and the first litter is good, 90 percent of the time that same mating will be done the next breeding season.

The Beyers' mindset is to make every litter count. With their relatively small sow herd and growing customer base, each litter has to yield more than one or two of the elite ones Beyers Farms has built a reputation for.

"Our goal is, if we've got eight or 10 pigs in a litter, we want that litter to yield six or eight marketable pigs," Brett says. "We built our program by trying to have as consistent of a product as we possibly can, not focusing on trying to make that one extreme animal. We want to make sure our hogs have an impact through depth and quality."

With as many hours put into making breeding decisions, it should be no surprise genetics would be at the top of the list when it comes to selecting replacement females. Gilts from the deepest litters and most consistent sows get kept. They will be the ones to produce the next deep set of pigs and keep Beyers Farms where they need to be for their customers.

"Our goal is not necessarily to be the biggest herd, but to be as deep in quality as anyone to supply our customer base. Maybe our hogs aren't as extreme as some people would like from a breeding perspective, but if we stick with the females that work for us we will hopefully hit the pendulum when it swings both ways. You have to be able to adjust to what the industry is demanding, but I like for our sows to be in a spot where we're one mating away from where we need to be," Brett says.

Phenotypically, both brothers agree structure and balance are top priorities for their hogs.

"It doesn't matter if it's the show ring or the breeding pen, our philosophy has always been to build them right at the ground first. Then we want them to be balanced and look like a showpig," Todd says. "With our number one marketing opportunity being the show ring and youth projects, we really have to focus and make sure our animals are able to diversify themselves from the rest of the population through their extra drive and balance."

The Beyers brothers' love for red hogs falls shortly below their love for God and their families. They spend hours on the phone with each other discussing Duroc hogs. That connection, along with a lot of trust in each other, has been able to keep their partnership and relationship going despite the long distance.

"Our partnership has honestly probably made our relationship that much better, because if we didn't trust each other we wouldn't be able to make it work. We're probably as close now as we've ever been," Todd says.

Todd also appreciates the relationships and friendships he and Brett have developed throughout their years in the showpig business. Several members of the industry including Jon Althaus, Bruce Engnell, Scott Hardman, Lyle Dorjahn, Carl Stein and Doug

Stewart have made an impact on the brothers' lives and their business.

"It's amazing the number of people we've had the opportunity to come in contact with. That's something about this business, until you're in it, I don't think you can really understand where those relationships can take you and how they impact and shape your life," Todd says. "That's why we decided to raise our kids the way we have and provide them the same opportunities we had to develop relationships that will last them a long time."

When it comes to the future of Beyers Farms, Brett knows the long-distance partnership may need to be reevaluated, especially as the next generation of Beyers gets more involved. But, for now, he sees no need to change the good thing they have going.

"All in all, it works very well for us. I like being able to call Todd and bounce ideas off of him, and he does the same with me. At the end of the day, it keeps us closer as brothers than if we were on our own," Brett says. "I'd like to stay partners as long as we can simply because I like being in business with my brother."

One of the primary responsibilities of any purebred livestock association is to uphold established breed eligibility standards. It is the responsibility of breeders and exhibitors of purebred swine to make sure each animal meets it's respective breed eligibility standards.

In the case of the National Swine Registry, different breed standards apply for the recording and exhibition of Duroc, Hampshire, Landrace and Yorkshire breeding and market animals. The following scenarios and pictures highlight instances of breed or show eligibility issues. Travis Johnson has purchased a Duroc barrow to show at the NJSA Southeast Regional in Perry, Ga. While at the show, an NSR Fieldman informs Travis that his Duroc barrow does not meet breed eligibility standards and will have to be exhibited as a crossbred barrow. What do you see in the picture that makes this Duroc barrow ineligible for registration and exhibition as a purebred?

Sara Taylor is
10 years old



While viewing a set of online sale pigs from a local breeder, Jason Martin finds a Yorkshire barrow that catches his eye. Upon asking about this Yorkshire barrow's pedigree, the breeder informs Jason that this barrow does not meet breed eligibility requirements and he will not be offered for sale. What did the breeder identify that would prevent this barrow from keeping a pedigree and showing as a purebred Yorkshire barrow?

While at a pig sale on March 18, Tom Lewis finds a Yorkshire gilt he'd like to purchase to show at the National Junior Summer Spectacular. Visually, she meets all breed eligibility requirements to show as a purebred Yorkshire female. He looks at the gilt's pedigree and realizes that he would be eligible to show her at the World Pork Expo Jr. National, but not the National Junior Summer Spectacular. What did Tom identify on this gilt's pedigree that would prevent her from showing in Louisville in July?



#### DUROC BARROW Travis' Duroc barrow had his pedigreed cancelled and was ineligible to show as a purebred Duroc because he was found to have white hair above the hoof line of his front foot. This violates the following rule for Duroc registration: "Must NOT have any white hair located on the animal" DUROC GILT After identifying the black spot on her gilt, Sara measured the spot and realized it was larger than what is acceptable to be registered. This gilt violated the following rule for Duroc registration: "Must NOT have more than three black spots on the skin, and none of these spots can be larger than two inches in diameter." HAMPSHIRE BARROW Justin's barrow was determined to have a white spot on it's forehead, therefore,


violating the following rule for Hampshire registration: "Must NOT have any white hair or indications of streaking on the


#### HAMPSHIRE GILT


Not only was Katie's gilt determined to be an off-belt, as her belt did not fully encircle her body, but she also had too much white hair above her right hock. Based on breed eligibility rules, her gilt is not eligible to show as a Hampshire breeding gilt, but may keep her pedigree. The following rules for breeding gilt exhibition apply in this case: "Must be black in color with a white belt totally encircling the body, including both front legs and feet" AND "white is allowed on the rear legs as long as it does NOT

#### LANDRACE GILT

When Meg's gilt laid on her side, Meg noticed that her gilt did not have six "functional" teats on both sides of her underline. Therefore, the following requirement was not met: "Must have at least six functional udder sections on each side of the underline. Pin teats and inverted nipples are not considered functional."

#### LANDRACE BARROW

After having access to the sun, it's likely that the dark pigmentation shown in the picture appeared on Beth's barrow. The following Landrace eligibility requirements would prevent this barrow from keeping a pedigree and showing as a Landrace barrow: "Must NOT allow more than three spots of skin pigmentation OR Must NOT allow any spot of skin pigmentation larger than one U.S. minted quarter."

#### YORKSHIRE BARROW

The breeder of this Yorkshire barrow made the right call by not offering him for sale to Jason or other buyers because the barrow was born with an extra dewclaw. This violates the following requirement for any of the NSR breeds: "Must have no evidence of an extra dewclaw."

#### YORKSHIRE GILT

Although this gilt has no issues that would affect her breed eligibility, Tom has identified that the farrowing date of November 28, 2016 is outside of the farrowing date requirement: "Must be farrowed on or after December 1, 2016 to be shown at the National Junior Summer Spectacular."



#### **Q&A: STOCK SHOWS**

#### Why do shows drug test animals?

The National Junior Swine Association (NJSA) has two primary goals for our drug testing program. First and foremost, we focus on maintaining food chain integrity and upholding a strong commitment to protecting the pork industry. Secondly, we want to hold our exhibitors to a high ethical standard to ensure a fair and level playing field at our competitive events. We always say our goal is not to "catch cheaters," but rather protect the long-term sustainability of our organization and the industry.

### What are the consequences if an animal test positive for drugs?

It's important to remember that drug testing policies will vary from one show to the next. Examples of violation penalties may include the revoking of an exhibitor's awards and premiums, suspension from future participation over an assigned period of time or even expulsion from all future participation at an event. However, the consequences don't stop there. If an animal is harvested and is found to have a substance that violates the tolerance levels established by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) or is not approved for food animal use, food chain integrity is compromised, packer and consumer confidence may be affected and this jeopardizes the future of the show industry.

### What are some key issues with drug testing programs?

I firmly believe one of the real issues with drug testing at youth stock shows stems from a disconnect between show managers, exhibitors and the animal protein industry's established standards. For example, the majority of shows use urine samples to test for the presence of drugs. Yet, the FDA sets allowable tolerance levels for a drug based on edible tissue. For livestock shows, it's unfair to obtain the quantitative levels of a drug in urine and compare that to the drug's threshold set by the FDA for edible tissue due to the variance in how a drug is metabolized in the animal. This makes it hard for show managers that would like to avoid a "zero-tolerance" policy when there are no accurate thresholds set for a drug when testing urine samples.

# Do you think drug testing will continue to be a challenging topic? If so, why?

I think that testing will continue to be a challenge for stock shows due to the advancement in testing technology and the wide range of variables that come into play when a drug screening finds a positive test. How did the substance get there? Was the drug a performance enhancer or could it have been administered for animal welfare?

### Please explain the differences in testing programs for different shows.

One of the big challenges exhibitors face is the variance in testing policies from one show to the next. Some shows may apply a "zero-tolerance" policy. In most cases, under a zero tolerance program, any substance

found in the animal's sample will likely result in some form of penalty for the exhibitor and possibly additional family members. Other shows may have policies that are specific to classes of drugs. Violations of these policies may occur when a drug is found in a sample that was used off-label or is not intended for use in food animals. Keep in mind that some shows also test breeding animals and market animals. Some shows are non-terminal while others may be terminal. This may also determine why the show has chosen to implement specific testing policies.

# How do you think drug testing programs could be improved across all shows?

Having open dialogue between all industry stakeholders in regards to drug testing at youth stock shows is important. Stock show managers need to work to educate themselves on testing technology and industry standards. Shows need to continuously educate exhibitors on the purpose of testing and clearly outline testing policies. Exhibitors need to embrace a culture of doing things right while becoming educated on best practices for animal care. I know some research is currently being done regarding variances in levels of a specific drug's presence in urine compared to other tissues. Initiatives like this will help stock show managers implement more effective testing programs in the future.

# If you have any additional information or comments that you feel would be beneficial please add those.

I hope our exhibitors understand that the rules we put in place are for the best interest of all exhibitors, the NJSA and the industry. We really want to work with our exhibitors and have hog shows for a long time. I feel that drug testing is just one example of our continued emphasis on understanding the bigger picture of food animal production and doing things right.

#### **Q&A: VETERINARIAN**

# What are some of the different categories of drugs that a show might test for?

Antibiotics, steroids, pain killers, cortisones and antihistamines.

#### Please explain the differences in the type of drugs (drugs approved for food animals, swine, etc.).

#### Approved for food animal:

Of the drugs that are approved by the FDA for food animals, there are some that are approved for just one specie and others that are approved for multiple species. If there is no drug approved for that specie or the drugs used that are approved for that specie have not worked than the veterinarian can use another drug that is approved for food animals to treat that disease or condition.

#### Unapproved for food animal:

There are many drugs out there for other types of animals but are not approved for food animals. At times, we might be able to use these drugs but many are illegal to be used in food animals. Serious repercussions can be brought down on the person that made the decision and the person who administrated the drug.

#### Some shows have different requirements:

Typically, the shows that test for drugs that are not approved for food animals are non-terminal shows and shows that are not 4-H or FFA affiliated. These shows will allow positive tests for food animal approved drugs. The shows that usually have zero-tolerance testing rules that don't allow any type of drug are terminal shows or are a part of 4-H or FFA.

### Please explain drug labels, withdrawal times and how drugs should be used.

The label on a drug bottle is approved by the FDA. They contain many different things. The most relevant items that the veterinarian and the owner need to pay attention to that would affect drug testing are the following:

- The withdrawal time: This is the amount of time that it takes after an approved drug is given for the drug to clear from the animal and be below a maximum residue limit.
- 2. Indications: This is a statement on the bottle that says how the medicine is to be used and what diseases or conditions that the drug is approved to treat.
- 3. Dosage and Administration: Dosage is the amount of the drug that is supposed to be administered per body weight. For example: 1cc per 50 pounds. This is very important to follow because there has been a lot of research done to determine the proper level in the body for it to work the best. The administration tells the user how to give it. For example: intramuscular, subcutaneously, orally, etc. This is also extremely important, if given the wrong way than some drugs will not

work properly. If the dosage and administration is not followed correctly this can extend the withdrawal time and/or increase the amount of time an animal may test positive at a show.

# What are some of the main issues regarding zero-tolerance testing programs?

Even though zero-tolerance keeps the testing program for a show very black and white, I feel it also has some flaws. There are certain drugs that are not approved for food animals that absolutely should be zero-tolerance. The issue with zero-tolerance testing is that many times the drugs can still be found in the urine even though the proper withdrawal times have been followed. The withdrawal times are set so the amount of the drug in the meat is below a maximum residue limit and not when the drug can no longer be tested in the animal. Testing today compared to when most of the withdrawal times were determined have become so much more precise that we can find levels that we have never been able to find before.

## How do you think drug testing programs could be improved across all shows?

The reason that showing started in the beginning was for breeders to display their animals to prospective clients that may buy their genetics to produce market animals. Even though this has changed over the years it is still very important that we keep this in the back of our minds. The sole reason that these animals are produced is for meat production. The reason that I bring all this up is that when we make these shows zero-tolerance we are holding these exhibitors to a higher level than we are the close to 150 million market hogs that are sold each year. Again, there are many drugs that are not approved for food animals that must be zero-tolerance to protect the consumer. I feel that their needs to be major research done to determine levels in the animal that will be tolerated at a show. These levels should be near the maximum residue limit set by the FDA that determine withdrawal times. At these levels, it is obvious that the exhibitor did not use that drug for performance enhancement, but for treatment of that animal for a certain condition. Zero-tolerance is pushing exhibitors to a point that many animals are not being medicated the way they should because they are so afraid of the test finding something. As the show industry moves forward, I feel that testing for the terminal shows must become more standardized around the country. As a veterinarian, we get a large

amount of phone calls asking what shows will test for and what can they use to treat a sick or lame animal that will not get them in trouble. With all the different testing that happens at the different shows it is very difficult to

make decisions we know are the best thing for the animal because of the fear of getting the exhibitor in trouble.

#### **Q&A: TESTING LAB**

# Please explain the differences between qualitative and quantitative testing.

A qualitative test refers to the confirmation that a drug is present in an animal's system at an unknown concentration (i.e. "presence or absence"). Certain drugs are not allowed to be present in a show animal's system. A qualitative test is adequate to detect these drugs because concentration is irrelevant.

A quantitative test uses known calibrators to measure how much of a drug is present in an animal's system. Certain drugs have therapeutic advantages and may be used to treat an illness or other medical ailments, and therefore may be allowed in a show animal, up to a certain concentration. However, at certain levels these drugs can be considered performance-enhancing. Quantitative testing can distinguish if the presence of a drug is in the therapeutic range or if the quantity exceeds the show's limitations.

#### Please explain the differences in how a substance may appear in an animal's system from muscle tissue compared to urine.

When a drug is administered to an animal it is distributed to the body's tissues, which includes the muscle. Muscle tissue can have a high affinity for certain drugs which can cause the drug to accumulate. Additionally, drug accumulation in muscle tissue can occur as a result of intramuscular injection at or near the injection site. The primary route of elimination for many drugs is via the kidney. Therefore, drug residues detected in urine are those that are being removed from the animal's body.

# Please explain how the FDA creates MAT levels for tissue but not urine samples.

In order to protect the consumer, the FDA establishes tolerances for many drug residues in edible products of food producing animals. Because drug residues in urine are not a food safety concern, tolerances have not been

established by the FDA, for urine samples. Many shows adopt a "zero-tolerance" policy for drug residues in urine. Certainly this type of policy is warranted for illicit drugs and drug residues detected in unapproved animal species. Scientific research needs to be conducted to better understand drug residues in urine so that livestock shows can make informed decisions with regards to creating policies and how to interpret drug testing results.

# How do you think drug testing programs could be improved across all shows?

One important area that can be improved across all shows is maintaining chain of custody and sample integrity from the time the sample is collected until it is received by the testing laboratory. Shows need to minimize opportunities for sample contamination. Improper chain of custody can nullify a positive test result. Shows should make every effort to ensure samples are received by the laboratory in the best condition possible. Samples should arrive chilled, labeled and properly sealed with evidence tape.

# If you have any additional information or comments that you feel would be beneficial please add those.

Drug testing, whether in animals or humans, is an ever-changing field. Advances in science and drug testing platforms are continuous. It is imperative that the drug testing laboratories and livestock shows work together to develop and maintain a sound and effective program. Communication and education are the primary components that create a successful drug testing program.

#### **Q&A: MEATS INDUSTRY**

# From a food safety and quality standpoint, why is it important to drug test animals?

Food safety is critically important and top of mind for many consumers. Today, people are much more cognizant of making healthy decisions based on their own knowledge and/or interpretation of the meat industry. Because of this, food safety ends up the main driver behind the Veterinary Feed Directive (VFD), which

requires veterinarians to write a prescription for many antibiotics we utilize through feed. Our commercial hog producers in the United States are scrutinized daily, in regards to animal husbandry and health practices. They are required to meet standards based off The Pork Quality Assurance (PQA) Program and The Common Swine Industry Audit. Families who own and show livestock that never enter a commercial scenario are held to the same standards as our commercial counterparts.

# From a food safety and quality standpoint, what are the consequences if an animal that tested positive for drugs enters the food chain?

The consequences can be dire. Depending on where in the food chain a tainted carcass is found can result in a multitude of issues, from packer/retailer relations to impacting trade with foreign countries. One thing the show industry does not want to be responsible for is affecting our export relationships negatively. The export market is a major key to the sustainability of U.S. hog production. Although the industry primarily focuses on the domestic market, exports will continue to be a focus as production increases and new packing plants come online.

# Please explain the food chain process and the importance of food chain integrity.

The food chain process is incredibly sophisticated, relying on efficiency from receiving hogs to boxing product. The industry, on average, harvests 2.3 million hogs per week. Quick math indicates little room for error as many plants have the capacity to harvest upwards of 1,000 head every hour. Upon harvest, pigs enter the cooler and are boxed for delivery. The end product will enter the United States food chain or will be exported to other markets. When a consumer sees "fresh pork" at a meat counter, it is just that. Farm to fork turnaround time can be very quick.

#### How do you think drug testing programs could be improved across all shows?

From what I understand, drug testing procedures differ from one show to another. While it isn't necessary to create an identical testing platform for all shows, it is important for both show committees and show families to work toward clean and wholesome family events that exemplify the true intentions of traditional livestock exhibition. A high quality testing policy should maintain clarity through:

 Identification of clear and transparent testing process and procedures. Show committees need to be clear on all testing requirements. Show families need to make sure they understand clearly, the requirements set forth.

- Identification of test methodology and whether test is based on qualitative or quantitative analysis. A qualitative test specifies whether or not a substance is present. Quantitative testing indicates the level in which the substance is present in the animal's blood or urine.
- 3. Transparency in approach taken if a positive test occurs.
- A clear justification period for both testing officials and show families on further processing of positive test, with time to acclimate around developments brought forward by show officials.

That being said, one area of improvement would be to reconfigure how to handle animals which get sick at the show. From an animal husbandry standpoint, the animal needs to be treated by the show veterinarian as quickly as there is evidence of sickness. At that point, the animal would not be allowed to show because it wouldn't meet the withdrawal period. I think that within this scenario is a teachable moment exists where the exhibitor can show, yet treat their animal. I believe there may be a way to drug test the animal before it is treated, then treat the animal and allow the show to move forward.


# If you have any additional information or comments that you feel would be beneficial please add those.

Levels of microbial residues and other analytes in livestock are monitored through maximum residue limits. This list of MRLs, for veterinary drugs in foods, sets out the level of residue that could safely remain in the tissue from a food-producing animal that has been treated with drug. The levels that are considered safe differ between countries with Japan being the most stringent. The MRLs coincide with withdrawal times that need to be followed and understood before marketing all swine including retired show pigs.

Livestock that have been subjected to extra label use of products without a veterinarian prescription, that fail to meet MRL requirements or fail to meet zero-tolerance rules lead to negative press and allow consumers to draw inadequate conclusions to our industry's integrity. The bottom line is every single person that raises a pig, be it for commercial production or show is considered an American swine producer. And every producer is responsible for producing safe, nutritious and high quality pork. Even though there is a despairingly large difference between the show industry and commercial swine industry, both business entities are held to the same stringent guidelines. We are all one in the eye of the consumer.

# NSR Extravaganza **RULES & REGULATIONS\***April 19, 2017 Entry deadline: March 23, 2017

#### **ENTRY INFORMATION**

- All entries must be postmarked by March 23, 2017. Entry fees for all entries must accompany the respective entry form.
- Entries are limited to a maximum of six head per exhibitor.
- All late entries will be charged double the regular entry fees. All entry fees are non-refundable.

#### **EXHIBITOR REQUIREMENTS**

- All senior exhibitors must be active members of the NSR or must pay the \$75 non-member exhibitor fee. An active senior member is age 22 and OVER, paid annual dues and recorded at least one litter in the 2017 fiscal year.
- Participants age 21 and UNDER of age are required
- to pay a \$15 junior participation fee.
- If an exhibitor has an NSR account that is past due, funds from the sale of their animals will be applied to their past-due account.

#### ANIMAL REQUIREMENTS

- Recommended farrowing date for Extravaganza pigs is Jan. 1, and after.
- All purebred weanling pigs shown in purebred classes must have a pedigree which accompanies each entry or they will show as a crossbred. Purebred pedigrees will be transferred to buyers by respective breed associations.
- All pedigrees for purebred entries must be recorded by April
- 7, 2017, or an additional \$25 rush fee will be charged.
- All entries must be ear notched using the official NSR system (starting with number 1 in January and again in July of each year).
- Barrows, boars and gilts are eligible for entry. Barrows and boars may sifted in the same classes, depending on number of entries. Gilts will be sifted in separate classes.

#### **DNA STRESS STATEMENT**

- No known stress positive or stress carrier Duroc, Hampshire, Landrace or Yorkshire animals will be allowed to be exhibited or sold at any NSR-sponsored event.
- Such warranty is, however, solely that of the seller and not that of the American Landrace Association (ALA), American Yorkshire Club (AYC), Hampshire Swine Registry (HSR) or the United Duroc Swine Registry (UDSR).
- The ALA, AYC, HSR and USDR assume no responsibility or liability in connection with such warranty by the seller.
- If any NSR purebred animal sold at this event is found to be

- a carrier of the stress gene, the purchaser has the right to receive full refund of the purchase price from the seller.
- DNA testing for the stress gene must be done within 60 days of the sale date and all costs associated with testing for stress must be paid by the purchaser. The seller has the right to review the test results and the right to retest the animal at a laboratory of his/her choice.
- Cost associated with re-test by the seller is at the seller's expense. There will be no refund of NSR commission from stress-carrier animals.

#### WEANLING SALE INFORMATION

- A minimum of 50% of the pigs in each breed will be selected for the sale.
- All animals selected and cataloged for the sale MUST go through the auction. Sale commission will be 15% for all animals. If an animal that is selected and cataloged for sale does not go through the sale ring, the exhibitor will be banned from exhibiting at NSR events for one year and will be charged 15% of the average selling price of their respective breed sale. This amount must be paid before reinstatement will be allowed. The exception to this rule will be if an animal has become injured or ill and
- is inspected by a NSR staff member prior to the sale.
- The NSR acts only as the agent between buyer and seller. If proper payment is made by the buyer in a timely manner, the NSR will make settlement with the seller in approximately 30 days after the sale. In the event of non-payment and/or insufficient funds by the buyer, settlement with the seller will be delayed until collection is secured. If an exhibitor has an NSR account that is past due, funds from the sale of their animals will be applied to past-due accounts.
- This event is sponsored by, and will be managed by, the NSR #AC303D000727.

#### PUREBRED BREED ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- The Hampshire Sired Crossbred Barrow Division is a NEW division being added to the existing crossbred barrow show at the 2017 World Pork Expo Jr. National.
- The Hampshire Sired Crossbred Barrow Division is sponsored by the Hampshire Swine Registry.
- Participating barrows must be sired by a registered Hampshire boar. There are no regulations on the pedigree of a barrow's dam.
- \$5,000 in additional premiums, sponsored by the Hampshire Swine Registry, will be awarded to exhibitors of the top five Hampshire Sired Crossbred Barrows.

- Division Champion: \$2,500
   » Reserve Champion: \$1,000
  - Third Overall: \$750Fourth Overall: \$500
  - » Fifth Overall \$250
- The Champion Hampshire Sired Crossbred Barrow division winner will also compete against crossbred barrow division winners for Overall Champion Crossbred Barrow honors.
- The top five Hampshire Sired Crossbred Barrows will be DNA parentage tested against their declared sire and must pass parentage testing.

#### BREEDER INFORMATION:

- IMPORTANT: Breeders MUST provide purchasers of Hampshire Sired Crossbred Barrows with the sire's registration number.
- All Hampshire Sired Crossbred Barrows MUST be sired by a registered Hampshire boar. Boars must be registered and have met all DNA testing requirements with a valid DNA sample on file at the National Swine Registry.


