



Start with Why

For many of you reading this editorial, this is you and I's official and first introduction. While we might have met at World Pork Expo, it is more than likey you have learned about me for the first time in last month's *Seedstock EDGE*. So let's "Start with Why." I believe there is no better place or environment to raise youth and grow a family than the agriculture industry, more specifically the livestock sector. I am deeply committed to helping grow the next generation of agricultural leaders, enhancing our members' knowledge and opportunities of the purebred swine business, and challenging the status quo. Start with why.

In my previous career, I had a mentor that got me hooked on an app called Audible. I love to learn and acquire new knowledge, but I often find that my time and attention are in a deficit. Audible allows listeners to hear thousands of books in a digital format they can take anywhere. I have found more often than not, when I'm driving, I listen to Audible. He argues that we all spend way too much time on "what?" and "how?" and not on "why?" A person's why is, "Why did I get out of bed this morning?" or broader, "What is your organization's purpose?" This idea really challenged my mode of communication and how I approach life. Why am I the way I am? Why am I excited about the opportunity to work at the National Swine Registry? To answer this, you can refer back to the last half of my first paragraph.

So what is NSR's why? Many of you may think it is to put on shows or transfer pedigrees. However, our why is clear in our mission statement: "Enhance the value of pedigreed swine, maintain breed integrity, and provide relevant member education and youth development experiences." That's our why. Yes, we host shows and keep purebred records organized through pedigree management. That's only our means to the why. You have seen in the past few issues of the Seedstock EDGE a number of discussions involving the Long Range Strategic Plan. This plan is the roadmap to future whys for the NSR. Many of these whys are focused on youth development, building a sustainable future of the purebred swine industry and continuing the legacy of many great stockmen and women.

So why did I pursue a career with the NSR? Yes, it's been a dream and a goal of mine since I purchased my first Hampshire gilt from my great uncle as a first year 4-H'er. Indeed, I was in awe of the field staff in my early show career who I immediately identified from the Seedstock EDGE that actually said hello to me. It may be because I was so intrigued by those "famous breeders" conversations standing along the rail at the WPX. And maybe even a little bit of nostalgia to write my first editorial in the magazine that I have kept every issue of from 20 years ago. However, on the most fundamental level, I believe our whys are aligned. Regardless of your age, career status or achievements on your operations, when you find someone or something that aligns with your why, you must pursue it with all your energy and passion.

You might be asking yourself, "What is my why? Why do you show livestock? Why do you raise purebred seedstock? Why do you give to and support the National Junior Swine Association?" Each one of us has a why, and I encourage you to start with it. I very much look forward to meeting each of you and learning more about your why in the coming months and show season.



National Pork Board Elects New Officers



Terry O'Neel, a pork producer from Friend, Nebraska, was elected as president of the National Pork Board at the organization's June board meeting in Des Moines, Iowa. The National Pork Board is comprised of 15 farmer-directors representing America's pig farmers.

O'Neel and his wife Diane own and operate O'Neel Farms in Friend, Nebraska, a farrow-to-finish pig farm that markets 12,000 pigs annually. In addition to pigs, O'Neel Farms also grows corn and soybeans on 700 acres.

Serving with O'Neel on the executive officer team of the Pork Checkoff is Vice President Steve Rommereim, a pork producer from Alcester, South Dakota, and, as treasurer, Brett Kaysen, a pig farmer from Nunn, Colorado. Jan Archer, a pork producer from Goldsboro, North Carolina, will serve as immediate past president. The four-executive officers will serve one-year terms in their positions effective at the close of the June board meeting.

Hampshire Swine Registry Honors Mark Peter

The Hampshire Swine Registry Board of Directors honored Mark Peter of Mendon, Illinois, with the 2017 Meritorious Service Award. Mark has been involved with Hampshires all his life. Mark and his brother Kirk became partners with their father, Don, therefore creating Peter Farms in 1974.

In 1962, Mark's father,

Don, purchased their first Hampshires from A. Ruben Edwards (HampAn Farms) and Ted Sloan from Missouri. In 1972, the Peter Farms began to hold production sales. The Peters continually bred sows to the best boars available to make the next generation of Hampshires better. Herdsires like Cadet, Freightliner, Positive and recently Frozen in Time and Buried Alive. Known for producing great Hampshires, Peter Farms bred two Champion Hampshire

barrows sired by Buried Alive. Later as the industry evolved, they became part of the Premier Swine Breeding System producing Hampshire, Duroc and T-Max boars.

Mark and his wife, Jill, have two sons, Tad and Wes.

Mark has been very involved in their community, serving as a member of the John Wood College Ag Advisory, the Adams Electrical Co-op Board, Illinois Purebred Council and the Illinois Hampshire Board. Mark served as the vice-moderator of the Mendon Congregational Church and was a 4-H leader for the Mendon Mustangs.

Mark served as president and vice president on the Hampshire Swine Registry Board of Directors, was a member of the National Swine Registry Executive Committee during the previous Long Range Strategic Plan and was a big proponent of the formation of the National Junior Swine Association. Mark has also served as a judge at many Hampshire events.

A few years ago, Mark reached back into the frozen semen tank and bred one of the best Quiet Giant sows at Peter Farms to a John Soorholtz boar SOO0 Dynamite 37-7 and DMP0 Frozen in Time 31-2 was farrowed May 11, 2010. This boar was exhibited at the 2010 Fall Classic and was purchased by Wes Barone. The Peter's firm utilized the genetic power of this boar and bred several sows to him, and many of the current Hampshire lines have these genetics in their pedigrees.

We are proud to recognize Mark Peter with the Hampshire Meritorious Service Award. Congratulations!


Sue was born September 9, 1946, in Brownwood to the late Rance



In an era where many restaurant chains proudly tout they only source free-range chicken, pork not raised in confinement, and GMO-free foods, some major restaurant companies not only show appreciation for all types of agriculture, but also educate themselves about the benefits of conventional farming practices. These companies also give back to agriculture and its future leaders both locally and on the national levels.

appreciate all types of farmers and agriculture," said Jessie Corning, senior marketing manager at Culver's. "We are part of the agricultural industry because we are so reliant on ag for our products. We want to turn our gratitude into support for the beef, poultry and dairy industries."

One way the Wisconsin-based chain best known for its ButterBurgers® and frozen custard shows its support of agriculture is through the Thank You Farmers™ program. The campaign was created in 2013 to raise awareness of the importance of the agriculture industry and to support future ag leaders. Perhaps the most notable icons of the Thank You Farmers™ program are the big blue barns that travelers see across the country side with the "Thank You Farmers™" message painted on their sides.

The first big blue thank you was painted near Beaver Dam, Wis. This specific barn is functional but needed some rehabilitation. Due to the highway beautification act, local and state approval must be met before these big blue thank you notes can be completed.

Another way Culver's advocates for agriculture is by supporting Thank You Farmers™ corn mazes. In 2016, 19 mazes were created in 19 states with the "thank you" message including a sunflower maze in Florida. The first maze was created in Tracy, Minn., as a fundraiser for an FFA chapter. This year, they will likely have 10-12 corn mazes in various states with their message of gratitude.

Culver's engages in social media as a way to communicate with its guests the stories of those who raise the food it sells in its restaurants. Culver's identifies ag advocates to share their ag story on social media with the hashtag #FarmingFridays. In 2017, Culver's has set aside five Fridays for agricultural advocates to share what life on the farm is



like for them. In April, Katie Pratt, a fourth-generation farmer and writer of the Illinois Farm Girl blog shared some of her family farm experiences. Watch for other #FarmingFridays this year on July 9, July 21, Sept. 22 and Nov. 3.

Perhaps the most significant way that Culver's contributes to agriculture is through its partnership with the National FFA Organization.
To date, Culver's and Thank You Farmers™ has raised more than \$1 million in support of the National FFA Organization and Foundation, local FFA chapters, and a variety of local agricultural organizations.

Just this spring Culver's donated \$30,000 to the Blue Jacket Program, which provides the official blue, corduroy jacket to FFA members who might not otherwise be able to afford one. Their donation will ensure that 238 young agricultural enthusiasts will now have the blue FFA jacket to wear with pride.

"For FFA members who have such a passion for agriculture, wearing the blue jacket is a sign of their commitment to the future of agriculture," Corning said. "We're proud to provide jackets to these deserving students."

Following student nominations made by FFA advisors, Culver's worked with the National FFA Foundation to match deserving members with local restaurants. Currently the blue jackets are being presented to select students.

Culver's also sponsors the Milk Quality & Products Career Development Event (CDE) at the National FFA Convention. As sponsors, they present scholarships to the winning teams and individuals.

And just another way that Culver's supports future agricultural leaders is by sponsoring an essay contest. This was the third year for the contest, where FFA students are encouraged to write about a specific topic. Three monetary awards are presented to students writing the winning essays and their chapters to help offset travel to the National FFA Convention.

Since Culver's restaurants are independently owned and operated, many of the fundraisers and much of the support is given at the local level. Local stores are typically willing to work with local FFA groups by donating a percent of sales on a particular day or participating in national initiatives like "Scoops of Thanks" day, where for every \$1 donated to FFA, a customer will receive a scoop of fresh frozen custard.

In addition to giving back, Culver's works to stay educated on the latest trends. Corning says they communicate with members of the FFA, National Cattlemen's Beef Association (NCBA), Wisconsin Farm Bureau, and other industry groups to stay on top of what is important to farmers. They even take their research so far as to make sure their coloring sheets for their kids are current. They used guidance from Katie Pratt to update the pictures of their mascot Scoopie in overalls to a button down shirt and using iPads in the field.

"We want to portray agriculture in a modern way," Corning said.

Another company that is staying educated on production agriculture and the sources of its food products is Michigan-based Domino's Pizza.

The well-known pizza maker has taken some heat from activist groups because they source conventionally produced animals. However, Tim McIntyre, Executive Vice President of Communications for Domino's, said the company has done its research and knows that farmers and ranchers take great care when raising their animals to treat them humanely and produce a safe and healthy product.

"We have done our research. We have talked to farmers." McIntyre said. He said the company had received multiple phone calls from extremist groups demanding they use "cage-free eggs" so he did more research, even though they don't buy eggs, the research and understanding is important to them.

"I started talking to farmers and researchers and found pecking order is an actual thing. If chickens are cage-free or free-range, their mortality increases, air quality decreases causing workers to get sick and ultimately egg production goes down," McIntyre said.

He said that it is unfortunate there is a lack of knowledge between food consumers and farmers, and that extends into the restaurant business. Domino's realizes where its food comes from and wants its consumers to know that all food sourced by its company is raised safely and humanely by farmers who care for their animals every day.

In fact, Domino's is so interested in agricultural endeavors, the company has become involved with Dairy Management Inc. (DMI) and



the Dairy Check-off. McIntyre is a member of a DMI subcommittee that ensures that dairy cattle are treated humanely. The partnership between DMI and Domino's started in 2008. Domino's worked with DMI to change its 50-year-old pizza recipe to one that included more cheese.

"We buy more dairy products to put more cheese on our pizza, and promote that our pizza tastes better. More pizza sells more milk to make cheese. It's a win-win," McIntyre said.

Domino's also worked with DMI to develop pizzas that meet the

you the food. We believe farmers know best, and must be vested in their interest," McIntyre said.

Because of the importance of improving a product that is so important to Domino's success—cheese on pizza—Domino's invests dollars in DMI for product development and research as well as marketing. However, they also know that sustaining the future of agriculture is important too.

"This year marks the first of a five-year, \$1 million investment in FFA. We'll be providing scholarships for educational fund \$2.7 million for nearly 1,900 scholarships in 2017. Those scholarships are as varied as the career opportunities that are out there for young people and include awards to 4-year schools, 2-year schools and for vocational training.

"One out of four FFA members received a scholarship this year thanks to our partnerships," Meyer said. "The great thing about our members is they are the future of agriculture, and there are more than 235 unique career opportunities from food science to agricultural communications and

USDA regulations for school lunch programs. This recipe must contain a specified amount of dairy, once again helping boost dairy sales.

When asked if Domino's plans to make any sourcing changes in the future, McIntyre said they will continue to read, do research, talk to producers and rely on their partners at DMI to make any sourcing decisions. He said some brands change their ways because they fall in love with words or get scared by the groups who contact them.

"Any time you imply 'blank'—free is bad, dangerous or harmful you are doing a disservice to your consumers and the industry that provides opportunities for young people interested in careers in agriculture. This partnership is very new. We hope this will cement our conviction about standing up and supporting farmers and ranchers," McIntyre said.

The National FFA Organization relies on partnerships like those with Culver's and Domino's to help fund programs and scholarships for its members—current and future agricultural leaders. According to Kristy Meyer, Communications Manager for National FFA, sponsors help the organization achieve the vision of growing leaders, building communities and strengthening agriculture in various ways. For example, 115 partners helped

wildlife management, in addition to production agriculture. These students are learning leadership skills and giving back to their communities and their communities are giving back to FFA."

And that is how the chain of gratitude works. A farmer takes his family to the local Culver's for dinner, and donates a dollar toward FFA. Culver's gives that farmer a scoop of his favorite custard. The farmer's daughter win's a scholarship to pursue her education and works in research and development at Domino's pizza where they update their recipe to make it taste better for the consumer. Its advocates like Domino's and Culver's that literally feed the country and support those who feed the world.

PLEASE GIVE A BRIEF BACKGROUND OF YOUR

AGRICULTURAL INVOLVEMENT: I'm originally from Pemberville, Ohio, where my family runs a diversified livestock and crop operation with cattle and hogs.

My father, Dan, raised Duroc sows as a kid and served as a Yorkshire fieldman in the 1980s, as well as managed the Ohio State University Boar Test Station during his master's degree. His swine background got me interested in being active in the purebred swine industry and initially sparked my interest in commercial production.

I was involved in NJSA (since 1998), 4-H, FFA and livestock judging from a young age until graduating high school, in 2005. I served on the NJSA Junior Board as vice president from

2006 to 2008. I got to Kansas by competing on the collegiate livestock judging team at Butler Community College from 2005 to 2007. I then transferred to Kansas State University where I judged on the 2008 Reserve National Champion Livestock Judging Team and the 2009 Meats Judging Team.

I was offered the opportunity to pursue a master's degree in swine nutrition at K-State, while also coaching the Livestock and Meat Animal Evaluation Team from 2010 to 2012.

I served as the U.S. Fulbright Ambassador to Australia in 2011, where I studied at the University of Melbourne on the effects of immunocastration on swine performance, welfare and meat quality.

I returned to K-State for a Ph.D. in swine nutrition and management and continued to help coach the Livestock Judging Team. I finished my Ph.D. in 2015.

PLEASE DESCRIBE YOUR CURRENT AGRICULTURAL

INVOLVEMENT: I joined JYGA Technologies after using their feeding equipment for part of my Ph.D. research at K-State. Seeing the writing on the wall for the inevitable transition to grouphousing in sow farms in the U.S. (and also being a closet behavior

and management person). I accepted the opportunity to lead our product development from the nutrition side, as well as manage and develop the U.S. market. We currently have nearly 100,000 sows using our system in the U.S., and we feed sows in 23 countries.

Brandi and I also own and operate a small commercial cow-calf operation at our home in Greeley, Kansas.

I coach our District 4-H Livestock Judging Team where I work with about 25 kids.

I still judge livestock shows, across the nation each year, particularly pigs and cattle.

TELL ABOUT YOUR EXPERIENCE AND

INVOLVEMENT AS A NJSA MEMBER: I went to the first NJSA summer event, in 1998, in West Lafayette, Indiana, and competed in the skillathon and judging contest. After that I decided to get involved, and I began exhibiting purebred Yorkshire, Duroc and Hampshire gilts each year at the National Junior Summer Spectacular, as well as at regional events such as the National Barrow Show® and NJSA Eastern Regional. When I was old enough to start attending the leadership conferences, I attended those and got to know the NJSA staff and board members at a closer level.

I was always inspired by Jennifer Shike and her dedication and work ethic to make the NJSA program a success in its early days. I appreciated (and sometimes feared) her tenacity then, but I appreciate it even more today when I can reflect on the challenges she encountered.

The junior board members were always role models and mentors for me, so when the time came I was excited to be able to represent the Eastern Region as a board member myself. It was a lot of work but an incredible opportunity.

HOW DID BEING INVOLVED IN NJSA HELP YOU IN YOUR CURRENT POSITION? Many relationships that were created in my NJSA days have turned into lifelong friendships and business connections. For example, Doug Albright (recently featured) and I first met at a young age in NJSA, then we went on to K-State together, and he was in my wedding. Furthermore, Josh Flohr (NJSA member from Maryland) and I first met at a NJSA Leadership Conference, and we went to graduate school together

and both got our Ph.D. in swine nutrition. These are just two examples of the many relationships that were forged during my NJSA time.

Just as importantly, NJSA exposed me to the career opportunities that existed in the purebred and commercial swine industry and led me to where I am today. Our family primarily raised beef cattle, so NJSA was a doorway for me into the swine industry and I firmly believe this is the greatest value that the NJSA program can deliver to the broader swine industry. As U.S. commercial swine organizations continue to grow, the greatest challenge in most of them is finding good people with swine backgrounds. The NJSA provides that basic training and love for pigs that can lead many people to successful careers.

WHAT IS YOUR FAVORITE NJSA
MEMORY? That's a tough one. I had to sit
and sift through many good memories. If I
had to select just one, I'd say it was the times I

got to work with my the eight-year-old NJSA protégé, Drew Tucker, from Georgia. We got paired up as mentor and protégé one year, and it was such a pleasure to get to know him and his family over several years and help him get more involved in the NJSA program.

DO YOU FEEL LIKE ORGANIZATIONS, SUCH AS THE NSR AND NJSA, ARE IMPORTANT TO THE AGRICULTURAL INDUSTRY? IF SO, WHY?

I absolutely do. I will say that I think it remains critical that the National Swine Registry and NJSA focus on keeping purebred and showpigs relevant to the commercial industry in order to preserve this linkage.

IF YOU COULD GIVE NJSA MEMBERS ONE PIECE OF ADVICE, WHAT WOULD IT BE? Enjoy

your time in NJSA, it flies by and before you know it you'll have kids of your own. Keep learning, stay curious and have fun, but remember that you are building a reputation and relationships that will stay with you for the rest of your life.

WHAT DO YOU HOPE TO SEE FOR THE NJSA IN THE NEXT FIVE YEARS, 10 YEARS, ETC.? Continued growth of course! I hope the NJSA continues to build linkages with employers and groups within the broader swine industry. Truly, finding good people who want to work with pigs is the biggest challenge in the commercial swine industry today. There are tremendous opportunities for advancement for young people who are willing to work hard and love working with pigs. The NJSA has the opportunity to cement these links and continue to expand them.

WHERE DO YOU SEE YOURSELF IN THE NEXT FIVE YEARS, 10 YEARS, ETC.? I am proud to work for a family-owned Canadian company. I truly enjoy helping producers with the transition to group-housing during gestation, which can be frustrating and challenging, but new technology allows group-housing situations that can improve sow welfare and performance.

In the next five to 10 years, I hope that my wife and I have grown our livestock operation at home, and I hope my daughter, Oakley, is showing some purebred hogs of her own and is getting her own experiences in NJSA and 4-H. Hopefully there will be one or two more besides Oakley running around!



TOUT Promotion



While many during the 2017
World Pork Expo were busy preparing to exhibit their entries in the show ring, not everyone had the opportunity to venture to the Varied Industries Building and stop by two tents that hold significance to both the showpig and commercial swine industry.

To pork producers all across the country, the National Pork Board and the National Pork Producer Council have been two staples of the swine industry and continue to serve as voices for America's 60,000 pork producers. Whether it is fighting for reasonable legislation and regulations on Capitol Hill, or through the Pork Checkoff providing research, promotion and education, both entities strive to ensure a positive future for the industry.

Although they both have the same goal, their umbrellas of responsibilities within the pork industry are different.

History

NPPC was formed in May 1966, when 90 pork producers gathered for a meeting in Moline, Illinois. In the 10 years prior to this meeting, the pork industry had suffered several failed attempts to achieve the list of goals set by industry leaders. They didn't have the money or staff, but their one driving force was enthusiasm.

During that meeting, which is known as the Moline 90, Roy Keppy, an eventual NPPC president, decided something was going to be accomplished. Keppy showed his support for the industry by laying down a \$100 check, and the other attendees followed suit.

This movement sparked the voluntary checkoff era, and the program saw growth in state and county level pork organizations. In 1968, NPPC was the largest dues paying commodity organization in the U.S.

In the 1980s, the voluntary program underwent restructuring and working with Congress, producers established a program to ensure that everyone was paying for the benefits the voluntary program was providing.

The Pork Act of 1985, which was included in the 1985 Farm Bill, set up the mandatory pork checkoff; the law also established that National Pork Board would oversee and execute research, consumer information and promotion programs. From 1985 to 1998, NPPC acted as the general contractor for the checkoff program.

Although the mandatory checkoff program experienced highs during the early years of its life, in 1998, the hog market experienced an oversupply of pigs. Too many pigs and significantly lower processing capacity, sent prices plummeting to 8 cents a pound. Some producers whose livelihoods had been jeopardized thought eliminating the checkoff program was the solution, and a petition to discontinue the Pork Checkoff program was launched.

In 2000, the Pork Checkoff Referendum Vote saw 14,396 producers elect to keep the program while 15,951 selected to end it. Then-Secretary of Agriculture Glickman, January 2001 declared the end of the program, Ann Veneman was sworn in as Secretary of Agriculture and she rescinded the order after questions about the accuracy of the ballot counts and other irregularities to the petition process surfaced. Veneman, NPPC and NPB worked to separate the two entities' activities involving the Pork Checkoff program. NPB became its own general contractor and took over NPPC's duties of handling the checkoff program.

National Pork Board

The National Pork Board is the catalyst that unites pork producers with key stakeholders focused on building a bright future for the pork industry through research, promotion and education.

NPB is funded by the mandatory Pork Checkoff program. Currently, the rate U.S. pork producers and importers pay into the Pork Checkoff is 40 cents per \$100 of value when pigs are marketed or when pigs and pork products are brought into the U.S. The mandatory checkoff dollars are then applied to programs that support research, promotion and education related to the pork industry. The 15-elected members of the National Pork Board and the Pork Checkoff staff oversee the collection, distribution and program accountability of the program. No funds are delegated for the use of lobbying or to impact government policy.

Everett Forkner, former NPB president and long-time innovator in the swine industry, says the great aspect about

NPB is the type of people the organization attracts to employ.

"With National Pork Board being involved in promotion, education and research, they tend to have the type of people and producers that are more driven by planning, producing, research and look to the bigger picture of pork production," Forkner says.

The promotion sector is designed to increase domestic pork sales through consumer, retail and food service outreach. Under the research field, collected dollars are used to study all areas of pork production, processing and human nutrition to ensure development of high quality and more profitable products. The education portion is comprised of two sections that include producer and consumer education. The producer side is to make sure growers are updated on the latest technologies in order to allow them to be competitive in the industry through seminars, workshops, videos and other instruction materials. Consumer education focuses on educating individuals outside of the industry on how pork fits into a healthy diet. Forkner says it's important to understand that every pig that is raised, is marketed somewhere and sometime into the food chain, and this is the basis of the whole U.S. pork industry.

One significant promotional campaign NPB is responsible for is The Other White Meat®, which was launched to position pork as versatile, nutritious meat that is easy to prepare. To continue the efforts, porkbeinspired.com provides consumers with countless recipes and facts on pork cuts and nutrition.

"Basically that is our call and what we do," Forkner says. "Because of NPPC and NPB working hand in hand along with our grassroots producers and state organizations is the primary reason that today we are the world's best provider of safe, nutritional pork."

National Pork Producers Council

On behalf of America's 60,000 pork producers, NPPC advocates for reasonable federal legislation and regulations, maintains and develops export market opportunities, and protects producers' livelihoods. Public-policy issues on which it focuses are in the areas of agriculture

and industry, animal well-being and food safety, environment and energy, and international trade.

The NPPC is funded by voluntary dollars and gives the organization the ability to function into the political arena.

NPPC focuses on the national legislative and regulatory side of the industry, which is why one of the two offices is housed in D.C. The office in Des Moines allows the organization to complete administrative work in a central fashion and works on projects such as planning the World Pork Expo says NPPC Chief Executive Officer Neil Dierks.

"NPPC is funding in part with the Strategic Investment Program and that is a voluntary contribution to NPPC by producers," Chief Exectuive Officer for NPPC Neil Dierks says.

The voluntary checkoff rate is equivalent to 10 cents per \$100 value when pigs are sold.

"The charge of NPPC is to work in the areas of regulatory legislation and trade policy. For us, the trade policy work isn't the promotion of pork in foreign markets but getting it possible to get pork in foreign markets, and the last thing is to work for the freedom to operate."

The organization is governed by a 15-member board of directors that are elected by delegated producers, who are selected by members of their corresponding state.

Aside from acting on legislative, regulatory and trade initiatives, NPPC's political action committee, PorkPAC, is committed to educating and supporting federal lawmakers and candidates who support pork producers.

"Although we are separate entities, there is an importance of communicating back a forth because there are things that the Pork Board does on a scientific basis that have ramifications in the policy, legislative or lobbying area," Dierks says. "There are issues in Washington that can impact the promotion, research and consumer education side."

Ties with National Swine Registry and National Junior Swine Association

NPB takes on many tasks within the NJSA and its events, not only are they Visionary sponsors but during Expo, Pork Board staff members assist with junior Pork Quality Assurance Plus check in and volunteer their services at numerous shows throughout the year.

NPPC not only gives swine producers a voice on Capitol Hill but the Des Moines office is also responsible for the planning and implementing of the World Pork Expo and has done so since 1987, says Craig Boelling, vice president of resource development for NPPC.

NPPC works closely with the NSR, an alliance member, and the NJSA in order to ensure the junior and open shows are executed.

"Through the junior show is where our future of the industry is and their understanding of the food chain is important," Boelling says. "As this industry is changing we also have a new wave of folks coming up."


Dierks says making sure that there is a place for NSR events during Expo has been an imperative factor for him as well. To Dierks, there is no better opportunity for young people to learn about the industry than by raising and showing their own hogs.

"Keeping everybody a part of Expo, including the showpig business is important because it also turns out to be an excellent opportunity to expose young people to the industry," Dierks says. "At some point in the future, those junior members may want to seek other employment in the pork industry."

Both organizations provide internships for young individuals to gain experience inside the U.S. pork industry.

NPPC offers a communications and international trade internship program designed to gain real-world experience in the political area. While NPB provides the opportunity for internship positions in communications, producer services, science and technology, domestic marketing, and information technology.

"I personally am a strong advocate for the youth development such as internships and the programs in place by the NSR," Forkner says. "During my tenure at NPB one thing I worked diligently at was to help our producers understand that some of the brightest and the best recruits they can employ will probably be coming out of the showpig program."

Col. Kevin Wendt did another outstanding job, on the block, on sale day, and as our announcer, on show day. Always enjoyable to work with you, Colonel!

We started the Duroc sale with the presentation of the Premier and Reserve Premier Sire awards. The 2017 WPX Premier Sire was RWWF6 Attention 37-1. The record-selling boar from last year's Summer Type Conference. His siring career is off to a good start. Congratulations, Upperhand Genetics, Indiana. The Reserve Premier Sire was NBRP5 He's the One 15-6. In the last calendar year, he has been the Premier or Reserve Premier sire at every single national event. I guess that would explain why he was the 2016 Duroc Sire of the Year. Congratulations to Hi Point Genetics, Illinois!

We began the sale with the winner of Class 5 and this year's Champion Duroc Boar. He was exhibited by Stein and Stewart, Missouri and Kelly Sheets, Iowa. This one was truly special. Sired by NBRP5 He's the One 15-6, this boar was one that was able to combine all the basics with plenty of bells and whistles. He was unique in his ability to have an extreme amount of mass and muscle and still be comfortable on the move with an extra heavy duty skeleton. Congratulations to the firms that put this one together. He topped the Duroc sale at \$60,000 and is headed to Indiana to go to work for Upperhand Genetics. Thanks, Travis and Sam!

The reserve champion was shown by Mallory Liles, Ohio. He is sired by SDF5 Mr. Right 60-7, and won Class 3. This one was really stout skulled, tall fronted and really good in all his angles. Another plus for this guy was his two outstanding sisters that were first and second in the gilt show. He will also be making his way to Indiana to go to work for Southern Gold Sires at the second-high selling price of \$14,500. Good buy, Bill!

Malcolm Farms came in next with their Class 4 winner. Sired by RWWF6 Attention 37-1, he was one that

combined a big rib cage and blade with extra stoutness and body mass. Russell Whewell made one of the best buys of the day with his \$800 purchase.

Newcastle Genetics' of Oklahoma, Class 6 winner was an extra heavy duty boar with really good shape and muscle. Sired by MMDS4 Backdraft 52-3, he will make his way back home to go to work in their growing boar stud.

David Martin's winner of the youngest class was next up. Sired by DCM6 Dirty Grandpa 8-1, this one was super flexible, really good looking and extremely shapely. He got a good home in Missouri with Paul and Lance Martin.

She will be going to Kansas with young breeders, Briggs and Brooklyn Kerr, at the price of \$4,500. Great buy!

Hunter Frobose was next up with her reserve champion. The winner of Class 9 was sired by LD5 At Ease 9-2. She was really square made and bigger outlined with really good feet and legs and a big, square chest floor. All this made her a really good buy at \$1,700, She's headed south to Texas to go to work at Schenken Genetics.

Bridget Halat's winner of Class 7 was an extra attractive female with impeccable feet and legs. She was up headed and long fronted and floated around the ring. Sired by IZF6 Cheap Money 2-5, she will go to work for Jordan Nisly, Kansas, for \$1,750.

Class 6 winner, Kylie Sellers, came next. A daughter of DRS5 Bear Claw 1-1, she was one of the most problem free gilts of the show. She was so good on the move, and yet had a ton of chest, rib and bone. She was Jordan Nisly's second purchase of the day, for \$1,200.

Braden Holt's winner of Class 2 was in the ring next. Sired by NBRP5 He's the One 15-6, she was quite popular. This young gilt had the look and combined it with stoutness, muscle and a really loose skeleton. She went to Greg Holt, Oklahoma, at the second top figure of \$5,000.

Nikayla Boose, Illinois, had the Class 5 winner. Sired by RWWF6 Attention 37-1, she was as stout in her feature as any gilt shown. Big footed, correct in her angles and really square chested, she made a long-ride west with Lance Sheehan to California, for \$1,050.

Mallory Liles, Ohio, was next with a littermate sister to her Reserve Champion Duroc Boar. From the profile, this SDF6 Mr. Right 60-7 daughter was one of the most attractive females in the barn. Extra extension and reach up front with a really square build made her popular on sale day She went to Big Papa Showpigs, Kansas, for \$1,500. Her littermate sister that was second behind her had the same general build. While not quite as extended up front, she was a bit heavier structured with a bit more body mass. She stayed in lowa with the Weisinger family at the price of \$3,200.

Kaylynn Cross Kieschnick's winner of Class 3 was sired by NBRP5 He's the One 15-6. Wide chested, shapely and really flexible describes this one to a tee. She is also headed to California with No Limit Genetics, for \$1,750.

The Class 1 winner was shown by Kelly Koenig, Texas. This young gilt was level, correct and good built. Sired by ALBD5 Inevitable 1-2 she has a really bright future ahead of her.

Another gilt that needs mentioning was the Lar-

issa Becker entry that stood second to the Champion Duroc Gilt. Sired by CDO5 He's It 276-8, this gal had a bunch of friends sale day. Immensely big chested, ribbed and topped, she ran uphill with an extended front end and had a really good set of feet and legs under her. After a very spirited bidding, the high-selling Duroc gilt is headed to Kansas for \$13,000. Alyana Franz is the new owner of this one. Good luck!

The red gilt show was really deep and the sale stayed steady throughout. I encourage you to look at the sale reports and see where all the different ones landed. It was an extra good set and it will be interesting to follow some of these and see what they can accomplish in the future.

All in all, the 2017 WPX was a tremendous success. The demand for good breeding stock was excellent, and the NJSA portion of this event continues to grow every year. 

Over the past several years the World Pork Expo has quickly become one of the most anticipated events. It seems like every year WPX grows in terms of numbers, and the quality continues to amaze me. With great numbers in the junior show and an awesome turn out for the open show, I think it's safe to say this industry has a bright future. The Hampshire portion of the open show was what you would expect; a good number of hogs and some very high quality boars and gilts that have a real shot to make an impact on the breed. First off, I want to thank John Huinker, Iowa, for stepping in and judging the belted breed. John needs no introduction to the swine business, and he has made his living raising hogs, for many years. John has also served on several of the National Swine Registry boards and is a great voice for what we do. Thank you again, John, for your professional and efficient job judging and lining up the sale order.

The Premier Hampshire Sire for the 2017 WPX was JGR5 Lethal 58-7. Lethal was the popular Jim Grimm, lowa, boar that was shown at the 2016 Summer Type Conference. This boar was purchased by Premium Blend Genetics, Indiana, and is doing a great job with his first pig crop. The Reserve Premier Sire award goes to JMJG5 Carry Out 7-8. Carry Out was the Jerry McLemore, Oklahoma, entry at the 2015 National Barrow Show®. He was purchased by Cain Super Sires, lowa, and has really been doing a good job for people all across the country.

The Grand Champion Hampshire Boar this year was exhibited by Cook Family Livestock, Indiana. Their son of KORB4 All Eyes 23-7 took the show by storm; this boar looked to me like one that has a real chance to make an impact in the Hampshire business. The Cook boar had the kind of look and proportions it takes to make competitive showpigs for the future. As equally important to me, he still had the stoutness of feature, skull, bone and forearm that it takes to keep grow and real power in hogs. The boar was sure impressive but what gives me the most confidence in this guy are the sows stacked behind him. His mother is the CFLK3 No Debate 14-5 sow that seems to hit every time; this sow is one impressive female to look at and the list of boars she has put in stud continues to grow. Congratulations to the entire Cook Family for the job they have done and for bringing out a boar of this quality. On Saturday, the Cook boar was not only the high-selling Hamp at the price of \$80,000, but he also got a great Hampshire home at Shaffer's Gold Rush, Indiana. Be sure to check this guy out when you are making your breeding decisions.

The Reserve Champion Hampshire Boar title went to Austin Joostberns, Michigan. This is another great Hampshire family that has had a great deal of success, in recent years, not only winning junior shows but putting together boars that have been working for people. This time their boar was a NAJO6 IR 6-5 and out of a NAJO9 BIG GULP 2-8 sow. The sire, NAJO6 IR, is a boar they have at their place that is a full sib to The Game the

high seller from the 2016 Winter Type Confenece. The Big Gulp sow on the bottom side of the pedigree has a whole page full of accomplishments and is really one of the cornerstones in their program. Austin's boar looked similar to that line of hogs; awesome built from the side with angles and structure that are on point. The boar had a trendy look up front with still plenty of power and dimension behind. Russell Whewell, Illinois, was paying attention and got this guy gathered up during the sale.

The Class 1 winner was entry 233-1 from Scott and Jayme Sieren, Iowa. The Sieren boar was out of TPSP5 Believe The Hype 69-1 and an old SJSF0 Tulsa 5-5 sow. Jayme drove a boar that puts a lot of positives together. His balance and proportions were unmatched; he was tall shouldered, good looking and so loose and flexible in his skeleton. His practicality, design and structure read to me like one that can make an impact when put back on some powered-up sows. Upperhand Genetics, Indiana, bought the Sieren boar and will put him in their stud. I think this is a boar that should be on the short list for many.

Devin Goehring's, Wisconsin, Class 3 winner is a son of the Reserve Premier Sire, JMJG5 Carry Out 7-8. The Goehring boar was one that I call bold everywhere with huge feet and bone. He scanned with a big eye and looked like a rugged breeding hog. His body shape and turn to his rib was good, and for as much bone and mass as he had the boar had a good look and some extension up front. He made his way to California and will go to work for the Donald Roy Naves Jr. and Family.

The second high-seller, of the Hampshire breed, came out of Class 3 and was shown by Ron Iverson, Iowa. Ron's boar was a KGBF3 Judge 8-1 on a EC3 Mudslide 85-1 sow. The Iverson boar did a lot of things right and put together some parts and pieces that are hard to make. The dimension and power this hog possessed was incredible. He was a big ribbed, huge bodied boar that still worked plenty of muscle shape up high. I especially like the way he was able to handle all that power with a good set of running gear, while being naturally high headed and attractive at the same time. Congrats to the Iverson Family, Shipley Swine Genetics and Sharrett Family Farms for partnering on this guy. I'm sure he will see heavy use.

As always we had a high quality gilt show. The number of double-entered junior gilts that also show in the open show continues to grow and they make for a really high quality set of females, from breeders all over the country. This has become a great way for juniors to get a return on their investment and also allows breeders' programs to be showcased.

This year's Grand Champion Hampshire Gilt was shown by Christopher Contessa, Arizonia. Christopher's gilt was BOLN4 Man Amongst Boys 23-3 x JLM3 Carry On 21-10 and was bred by Taylor Wood, Arizona. The Contessa's gilt was one that hit John hard in class and he elected to use her for grand. This gilt sure looked like what you

picture when you think of a good Hampshire female that has the potential to make showpigs and breeding stock alike. She was tall sholdered, attractive from the side and still had tons of extras in terms of bulk, mass and bone. I liked the way she was able to handle what she had on a flexible skeleton and had the feminine bases covered. Congrats to the Contessa family on bringing a great female, and good luck to Tangeman Family Farm, Ohio, on their purchase of the grand champion.

The reserve champion gilt was exhibited by Sydney Cain, Iowa, with a daughter of JMJG5 Carry Out 7-8 and out of a FSF3 Clydesdale 12-2 sow. The Cain gilt was another one that demanded some attention. She is out of the Reserve Premier Sire and, on the dam side, a sow that is making a name for herself by putting boars into stud. I liked the Cain's gilt build and dimension; she was so bold in her rib shape and that laid the foundation for her to work lots of shape and power up high. I call her a moderate, heavy boned gilt that looks like she has as good of a chance as any to make the next generation better. Congrats to the Cain Family on bringing another great female. Good luck to South Platte Genetics, Colorado, on their purchase.

Brady Littlefield, Michigan, won Class 3 with a JGR Lethal 58-7 gilt bred by Riley Klingenberg, Michigan. Brady's gilt was one that hit me hard when she came out of the pen. She was opened up, wide underneath, had a huge forearm and a stout head. When you studied her from there back, she was as good in her rib shape and fore rib as any. She looked like the kind of gilt that will be easy to mate many different boars to. Schenken Genetics, Texas, are the new own-

ers. Be sure to watch what they get done with her.

Kayne Johnson, Indiana, won Class 2 with a GRUS5 GRUS Prison Break gilt that was bred by Young and Guard, Indiana. This gilt is packed by genetics and considering she is out of a good Young and Guard sow that has already put some boars back in the boar barn, she is well on her way to becoming a cornerstone for them. Kayne's gilt was one of the most complete gilts to hit the ring. She was so basic in her build and functional on her feet and legs. Her skeleton read like she would be around in the long run and her added look sure lets me say you can have confidence in her no matter what your goal is. Mike Thode, Minnesota, will put her to work in his herd.

Parker Holt, Oklahoma, drove his GRUS5 GRUS Here I Am 28-2 gilt to win Class 1, a gilt bred by Kent Brattain and Family, Indiana. Parker's gilt was one that the more I studied her the more I liked her. Talk about a heads-up, tall-shouldered female who was trendy in her look. She was just a January 1 gilt and still looked like it. She read with a shot of immaturity, but the pieces she had were on the right track. Ken Bauer, Maryland, will put her in his herd and see what he can do with her.

I can't comment enough about what a good sale we had. No we didn't set any records, but we sold every Hampshire gilt we offered and almost all the boars. It just goes to show that when the quality is there the demand for Hampshires is still strong. As always, thank you to Col. Kevin Wednt, Ohio, for doing a great job auctioneering the Hampshires. It's always a pleasure to work with you. We look forward to another great event in Louisville with you all, and the best of luck as we round out the summer.





The Premier Yorkshire Sire was awarded to RIY5 Capital Gain 72-1 owned by Moyer Genetic Edge and Kevin Ricker, both of Ohio. The Reserve Premier Yorkshire Sire was awarded to RIY4 Gain Control 87-5 who is also owned by Moyer Genetic Edge and Kevin Ricker, of Ohio. Great set of hogs out of both of these sires!

Ryan Stohlquist of Illinois, drove the next boar into the sale ring, his boar won Class 3. This son of RSY6 Amped Up 4-1 has the potential to be a barrow sire deluxe. If you are looking for a power boar that also has a great look, is loaded with muscle and still midsize in frame, then he is for you. He will go to work for Price Family Showpigs, Ohio, for \$5,000.

Hope, Gracie and Reagan Flashpohler, Indiana, were back in the ring with their Class 4 winner. This one is wide chested, deep bodied and heavy muscled. This great designed boar is sired by RIY4 Gain Control 87-5 and will make his way to lowa

If you like your brood sows big bodied and powerful, then this lady was for you! She is huge middled, deep in her fore rib and flank and has big feet and even toes. This lady combines all that power into an attractive profile and still looks like a modern show hog. She will go to work for Adam Beck and Crossroads Genetics, Indiana, for \$2,000.

Britney and Craig Wischmer, Indiana, drove their Class 7 winnerto the ring next. This daughter of RIY4 Gain Control 87-5 is tall fronted good looking and square on both ends of her skeleton. Austin Thompson, Indiana, decided to add to the herd at the price of \$4,500.



From the Field

The first week in June can mean only one thing, World Pork Expo, in Des Moines, Iowa! Great weather greeted us at the Iowa State Fairgrounds. If you have never had the chance to enjoy Des Moines in early June, you need to make the trip because you're missing a historic show.

The Crossbred show ended the day on Friday, and Ryan Stohlquist, Illinois, had the task of sorting through the boar show. Thank you, Ryan, for your honest thoughts on the hogs and for efficiently sorting through a large number of boars in record time.

There was a lot of talk in the barn Friday night about the Champion Crossbred Boar that was exhibited by Austin and Cody Cox, Oklahoma. Their boar is sired by Renegade and out of a Tweet This sow. I am not sure you could draw a picture of a more correct boar, for the times. This guy is wide in his chest floor, square at his knee and opened up through the lower third of his rib cage. He is great in his hip structure, square and correct from hock to ground. Plus, he is moderate in size, heavy muscled and runs up hill. When the dust settled, in the auction ring, Hi Point Genetics, Illinois, had the winning bid of \$225,000.

The Reserve Champion Crossbred Boar also came from Oklahoma and was exhibited by Sites Family Livestock. Ryan's boar was as trendy and correct in his build as any hog in the barn. This one is killer from the profile, tall at the point of his shoulder, long necked and great headed. He is square and still inside his skeleton from behind and still has plenty of muscle to sire champion offspring. This son of Boned Up will make his way to Indiana with Crossroads Genetics at the price of \$42,500.

Next up was the entry from S&K Showpigs, Ohio, with a son of Above the Law. He is wide and expressive down his top, deep bodied and square at the ground. Plus, this one is sound. This one is unique in his ability to combine the modern look that everyone is chasing, while still being wide and having enough muscle to move you in a positive direction. He sold to Top Cut Genetics, Indiana, for \$21,000.

Next in the ring was Korb Farms Inc., Ohio, with their winning entry from Class 2. This son of Slug was tall fronted, attractive and has a great showpig look. As we continue to make them taller shouldered and more correct from the side, this guy is for you if you need one to add look and make them more trendy! Upperhand Genetics, Indiana, paid \$65,000 to take this young sire home.

Next up was the entry from AJ Lewis, Iowa, that placed second in Class 3. AJ's boar is sired by Lock It Up and he is stout, wide chested, huge middled, has a big square top and is wide in his upper hip and center ham. Crossroads Genetics, Indiana, took him home for the price of \$18,000.

Brinning Farms, Iowa, drove the second place entry from Class 4 to the ring next. Shane's boar is sired by Hurricane. This guy is level designed, square at the ground, is good in his toe size and spread and is heavy structured. He sold to Maverick Squires, Oklahoma, for \$9,000.

The Class 6 winner was exhibited by Justin Hardin,

Illinois. Justin's boar was sired by Lone Survivor. This young sire is wide in his build, big shouldered, good ribbed and heavy muscled. He sold to Nathan Ray, Illinois, for \$3,500.

Next in the ring was the winning entry from the lightest class of the day, exhibited by Mason Garner, Texas. Mason's boar is sired by White Man and out of a No Fare sow. If you are looking for a heavy muscled power hog that still has look and design then you need to look this one up. He sold to Greg and Susan Gonzales, Oregon, for \$2,000.

We had an amazing Crossbred boar show and sale at the 2017 WPX. This event takes a lot of work from different people who are behind the scenes, and I thank them all. Ronnie Kreis, great job as always – it's always a pleasure to work with you! Safe travels to all, we will see you in Kentucky!

The 2017 WPX Crossbred Gilt sale certainly didn't disappoint. With 12 extremely high quality classes, many breeders and buyers were excited about the offering on Saturday afternoon. We would like to thank Ryan Watje, California, for doing an exceptional job sorting through the gilts. Despite the long week and heat, the crowd and enthusiasm stuck around for the sale of this elite set of females.

The Champion Crossbred Gilt was exhibited by Holden Bell, Oklahoma. This Blurred Vision x Visionary gilt commanded a great deal of attention from everyone, including judge Ryan Watje. He commented on her impeccable build and look and her ability to drive and flex all day. This was only backed by her impressive width and stoutness of feature. This impressive female represented the futuristic look and kind that many progressive breeders are discussing. She garnered \$25,000 and heads back to Oklahoma with Mr. Bell. Congrats to all involved with this gilt.

The Reserve Champion Crossbred Gilt was exhibited by WinMor Farms, Iowa. This Visionary x Triple Crown gilt was truly unique. Not only did this gilt come out of a competitive Class 4, but she earned the title of high selling gilt at \$26,500. Her moderate frame, extremely heavy and durable structure, along with that look and height of shoulder that it takes to win today make her an exciting breeding piece. She heads west to Colorado to join the sow battery at Crane Farms.

Nash Stoller's Reserve Grand Champion Crossbred Gilt, in the junior show, came next. This Fortune Cookie x American Bad Boy gilt took advantage of entering the sale and had a lot of friends. This gilt is flat out massive. She is huge in terms of her rib cage, deep bodied and still combines this with a functional skeletal base. She garnered \$11,000 during the sale and headed back to Illinois.

Colt Wolf's Class 5 winner hit the sale ring next. This Exclusive x Zig Zag is very futuristic in her look and design. She was extremely tall shouldered and attractive through her head and neck, yet she still hit the surface with a ton of bone and foot. This was only complimented by her maternal feature and quality build. Colt's exceptional entry brought \$6,500 and

should become a staple in the Hamby Haven Show Pig Herd, Maryland. Best of luck with this female!

Up next came Reagan Rogers' Pinnacle x Swagger x Big Finish gilt that won Class 10. This young lady had an excellent week at the Expo and has garnered a great deal of attention as an exceptional showman. Her gilt was very bold framed, stout featured and still offers the look, balance and presence that so many breeders are striving for today. This gilt brought a lot of attention to the sale ring and heads back to California with a price tag of \$22,000.

Lainey Dyer, Oklahoma, brought an intriguing genetic piece to win class 4-B. Her gilt is sired by Wedding Night on Blurred Vision's dam. This gilt was wide chested, deep ribbed and stout featured, along with having an excellent look enhanced by Lainey's showmanship skills. This gilt finds a home in Missouri with Dave Dickmeyer. This female should have a bright future.

Brendan Gross drove in the ring next with an Anytime x Colt 45 female. A quality gilt from the side, this gal is problem free and offers a lot of potential. She makes the long haul back to California to join the firm at Ottenwalter Showpigs.

Riley Clinard drove an impressive gilt out of Class 2. A high quality gilt from the side that has the stoutness and power to match. She offers a lot of breeding versatility and should make a nice sow for Country Girls Show Pigs, Minnesota.

Next came Hunter Langholff's Class 3 winner. She struck me as one that you could do a lot of different things with. This Fireball x Stingray gilt has an incredible design and structural integrity. She should maintain her look and skeletal quality into future gen-

erations without sacrificing power and stoutness. She stays in Iowa and will reside at Jim Gibson's place.

Austin Puschel's big Class 11 gilt had a lot of friends ring side. Her popular blue color drew many in, and her extension and length make her a great breeding piece. She goes home with Peter's Hamps and Showpigs.

Shilo Thompson Dumos brought another blue gilt to the mix that was sired by Sky Wire and out of Limitless sow. A really moderate, heavy duty type of gilt should prove to be a great barrow and boar maker. She headed to Kansas to G&B Showpigs.

Peyton Hill, Oklahoma, brought us another quality gilt that offers a great deal of look and stoutness. This Blurred Vision x Bone Chill gilt was exceptionally stout and square made. She heads to a cooler climate in Minnesota at Chris Green's farm.

Another sale highlight came from Wyatt Debusk. This belted gilt is huge topped, big chested and stout boned. She has an intruiging pedigree with Pinnacle x Ante Up x Hillbilly Bone. This \$15,000 female heads home to lowa to join the elite sows at Nathan Weisingers.





NSR Chief Executive Officer NSR Governance Common Questions

Q: Who are the members of the NSR?

A: The members of the National Swine Registry are the American Landrace Association, American Yorkshire Club, Hampshire Swine Registry and United Duroc Swine Registry.

Q: How are these members represented?

A: Members are represented by a Board of Directors consisting of seven members who set policies for their respective breed. These Board of Directors shall serve a term of three years. No director may serve a term of more than two consecutive three-year terms and must be off the board for three years before being reelected to the board. The members of the Board of Directors must be active members of their respective breed associations in good standing. The respective breed Board of Directors usually meet once a year at the NSR Annual Meeting in March. However, special meetings may be called or a conference call may be held to discuss a specific item or issue.

Q: Who gets to vote for Breed Board of Directors?

A: Ballots are mailed to all eligible active members of their respective breed. An active member must have registered a litter during the fiscal year and must

have paid their maintenance fee for that respective breed for that same period.

Q: What if I am interested in running for the Breed Board of Directors?

A: You may contact the president of that respective Breed Board of Directors to express your interest in serving as a director.

Q: How are the NSR Executive Committee members selected?

A: The NSR Executive Committee members are selected by the respective Breed Board of Directors. This is based on the percentage of ownership in the NSR, the American Yorkshire Club, Hampshire Swine Registry and United Duroc Swine Registry respectively select three members to serve on the NSR **Executive Committee and the American** Landrace Association selects one member to serve on the NSR Executive Committee. These members may or may not come from the respective Breed Board of Directors and will serve staggered three year terms. These members may serve two terms of three years and must be off the NSR Executive Committee for three consecutive years before being eligible for reelection. The NSR Executive Committee meets at least three times a year.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Entries must be postmarked by Aug. 16, 2017. Entry
 fees must accompany the entry form and all late entries
 will be charged double the regular fee. NSR reserves
 the right to close entries any time after the printed
 deadline. All entry fees are non-refundable.
- All breeding animals entered at the NBS® must have been owned by Aug. 16, 2017, by the exhibitor.
- Crossbred boars: A documented stress test must be presented at check-in. Stress status of your entry will be placed in the show and sale catalog (this is a show and sale requirement).
- All entries must be ear notched using the official NSR system. All entries must be recorded by Aug. 16, 2017, or they will be charged a rush fee.
- No purebred animals will be allowed to show or sell without a registration certificate. Purebred entries will be divided into classes, as equal as possible, by farrowing date. Crossbred classes will be broken by weights.

- All hogs must arrive on the grounds between 8 a.m. on Saturday, Sept. 9, and noon on Sunday, Sept. 10. All animals must meet NBS® health requirements to remain on the fairgrounds. This includes animals in transit.
- If all hogs meet show requirements, NBS® entries may be unloaded and non-entries may stay in your vehicle at the south end of the fairgrounds. There is some shade, but no utilities.
- If non-show animals meet Minnesota import requirements, but not NBS® requirements, show animals may be unloaded and remaining animals must be immediately removed from the fairgrounds. A parking lot is available south of the fairgrounds across the street. The welfare and care of these animals is the owner's responsibility.
- If any animals arriving on trailers do not meet Minnesota import requirements, all animals will be refused entry, including NBS® animals.
- No clipping is allowed in the barns.

EXHIBITORS & ELIGIBILITY

- All senior exhibitors must be active members of the NSR or must pay the \$75 non-member exhibitor fee. An active senior member is age 22 and OVER, paid annual dues and recorded at least one litter in the 2017 fiscal year.
- Participants age 21 and UNDER are required to pay a \$15 junior participation fee.
- Entries are limited to four purebred boars and four purebred open gilts per breed (Duroc, Hampshire, Landrace and
- Yorkshire), and two crossbred boars per exhibitor.
- Breeding animals must be farrowed on Jan. 15, 2017, or after, and must have at least six functional teats on each side.
- Market animals must be farrowed on Feb. 1, 2017, or after.
- All entries must meet their respective breed requirements.
 Entries that do not meet these requirements will not be allowed to show or sell within their respective breed shows or sales at the conference.

BREEDING ANIMAL SALE

- A minimum of 60 percent of the number of each sex (boars and gilts) shown will be selected for the sale. These animals will be selected with no set number selling from any single class. Animals not selected for the sale can be consigned to the sale for an additional fee of \$20 per head. If the animal sells, the fee will be applied toward the sale commission. If the animal does not sell, the fee is forfeited.
- All animals selected and cataloged for the sale must go through the auction. Sale commission will be 15 percent for all animals. If an animal that is selected and cataloged for the sale does not go through the sale ring, the exhibitor will be banned from exhibiting at NSR events for one year
- and will be charged 15 percent of the average selling price of their respective breed sale. This amount must be paid before reinstatement will be allowed. The exception to this rule will be if the animal has become injured or ill, and the animal is inspected by a NSR staff member prior to the sale.
- The NSR acts only as the agent between the buyer and seller. If proper payment is made by the buyer in a timely manner, the NSR will make settlement with the seller in approximately 30 days after the sale.
- If an exhibitor has an account that is past due, funds from the sale of their animals will be applied to their NSR account.

DNA STRESS STATEMENT

- No known stress-positive or stress-carrier Duroc, Hampshire, Landrace or Yorkshire animals will be allowed to be exhibited or sold at any NSR-sponsored event.
- Such warranty, however, is solely that of the seller and not that of the ALA, AYC, HSR or UDSR.
- The ALA, AYC, HSR and UDSR assume no responsibility or liability in connection with such warranty by the seller.
- If any purebred animal sold at this conference is found to be a carrier of the stress gene, the purchaser has the right
- to receive full refund of the purchase price from the seller.
- DNA testing for the stress gene must be done within 60 days of the sale date and all costs associated with the testing for the stress gene must be paid by the purchaser. The seller has the right to review the test results and the right to re-test the animal at a laboratory of his/her choice.
- Cost associated with re-test by the seller is at the seller's expense. There will be no refund of NSR commission from stress-carrier animals.

COLOR GENE/SPECIAL BREED REQUIREMENTS

- By entering any animal in this conference, the owner warrants that the animal meets specific breed requirements.
- Such warranty, however, is solely that of the seller and not that of the American Landrace Association (ALA), American Yorkshire Club (AYC), Hampshire Swine Registry (HSR) or United Duroc Swine Registry (UDSR), and the ALA, AYC, HSR and UDSR assume no responsibility or
- liability in connection with such warranty by the seller.
- If any purebred Hampshire, Landrace or Yorkshire breeding animal sold at the NBS® is found to be a carrier of the color gene after being tested through the procedures approved by the HSR, ALA and AYC, the seller agrees that he/she will promptly refund the full purchase price to the buyer.
- There will be no refund of NSR commission from

animals that are carriers of the color gene.

INDIVIDUAL OPEN MARKET HOG SHOW

- The individual open market hog show is open to barrows and gilts. Purebreds and crossbreds are eligible and will be shown separately.
- Animals must be born Feb. 1, 2017, or after.
- Hogs must weigh between 230 and 280 lbs.
- All purebreds must have pedigrees from their respective breed associations.

- Individual barrows and gilts from the Truckload Contest are eligible.
- Entry fee is \$30 per head.
- Market animals do not need to be tested for pseudorabies or brucellosis but must meet all items under rules #1 and #2 in the show health regulations.

QUALITY ASSURANCE TRAINING

- It is mandatory that individual market barrow and truckload exhibitors complete instruction (and have certification valid through this calendar year) in either a PQA PlusTM, Youth PQA PlusTM and YQCATM certification program.
- State-sponsored youth training programs such as 4-H/Extension Livestock Quality Assurance

- and Ethics training will be accepted.
- Hogs must always be raised in accordance with the Good Production Practices outlined in the PQA Plus™ programs.
- A copy of each exhibitor's Quality Training (as listed above) must be attached to the Swine Affidavit and submitted to Hormel Foods at the time of or prior to shipment of animals.

TRUCKLOAD CONTEST

- The Truckload Contest consists of purebred and crossbred divisions. No individual hogs in a truckload may weigh less than 230 lbs. or more than 280 lbs.
- Truckloads consist of six market hogs, of which, at least three must be barrows. All must have been farrowed on or after Feb. 1, 2017.
- The entry fee is \$30 per truckload.

- Truckload entries do not need to be tested for pseudorabies or brucellosis, but must meet all items under #1 and #2 in the show health regulations.
- Carcass requirements: 160 lbs. minimum weight; 220 lbs. maximum weight and a minimum quality score of 2. (Minolta and pH values will be used to verify visual quality scores).

NBS® JUDGING CONTEST

- The NBS® Judging Contest will be held Monday, Sept. 11. All hogs entered in the NBS® are subject to selection for use in the NBS® Judging Contest on Monday, Sept. 11, at 8 a.m. in Crane Pavilion.
- Junior and senior college participants will judge nine classes. 4-H and FFA contestants will place four classes of market hogs, two classes of breeding gilts and one truckload market hog class.

HEALTH REGULATIONS

- EACH ANIMAL ENTERING THE MOWER COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS MUST BE LISTED ON AN OFFICIAL, INTERSTATE
 CERTIFICATE OF VETERINARY INSPECTION (CVI) ISSUED BY A LICENSED, ACCREDITED VETERINARIAN.
 - A. Multiple animals may be listed on one original CVI. Two photocopies of the original CVI must be provided for each animal.
- CVIs MUST BE ISSUED ON OR AFTER TUESDAY, AUGUST 15, 2017 WITH THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - A. Name and address of consignor; consigned to the NBS®, Mower County Fairgrounds, 700 12th Street SW, Austin, MN 55912.
 - B. ALL SWINE being exhibited at the National Barrow Show MUST be officially identified with an official, federally approved ear tag. The animal's ear tag ID must be listed on CVI. For more information on federally recognized ear tags, visit *nationalswine*. com/shows/ear_tags.php.
 - C. Each animal shall be individually identified by ear notch.
 - D. Health status of animal, including dates of required tests and vaccinations must be listed.
 - E. A premise ID number MUST be included on CVI.
 - F. The cell phone number of your veterinarian who issued the CVI MUST be included on the CVI.
 - G. ALL CVIs MUST CARRY THE FOLLOWING STATEMENTS "Farm or origin of swine:
 - i. Has not had pseudorabies or swine dysentery in the last 12 months
 - ii. Has not had any clinical signs or diagnosis of TGE, PEDv or Seneca Valley Virus in the last 60 days
 - iii. Feeds no raw garbage and uses no PRV vaccine
 - iv. Is not under quarantine for any disease condition
 - v. Has not had vesicular stomatitis diagnosed within 10 miles of farm or origin in the last 30 days

3. REQUIRED TESTS:

A. BREEDING ANIMALS (NBS JR. SHOW BREEDING GILTS AND OPEN SHOW BOARS & BREEDING GILTS):

- i. PSEUDORABIES (PRV) TESTING: ALL BREEDING SHOW ANIMALS ENTERED IN THE NBS MUST be individually tested for PRV ON OR AFTER TUESDAY, AUGUST 15, 2017 UNLESS animals come from a PRV-qualified herd.
 - a. All official identification of animal (sex, ear tag and ear notch) needs to be included on the pseudorabies test chart.
 - b. Animals must test PRV-negative with all results on the dated CVI.
 - c. The official PRV test chart must be provided along with your CVI.
 - d. Either the ELISA (gB ELISA), ALA or S/N tests are acceptable. Differentiable ELISA (g1 ELISA) test will NOT be accepted.
 - e. If BREEDING SHOW ANIMALS come from a PRV qualified herd, individual testing of each animal is not required. In this case, the PRV qualification numbers must appear on the health certificate and the most recent quarterly herd test date (month, day and year) must be stated on health certificate.
- ii. BRUCELLOSIS TESTING: ALL BREEDING ANIMALS ENTERED IN THE NBS MUST be individually tested for brucellosis ON OR AFTER TUESDAY, AUG. 15, 2017 <u>UNLESS</u> animals originate from a validated brucellosis free herd.
 - a. Animals must test brucellosis negative with all results on the dated CVI.
 - b. If the herd of origin is brucellosis validated, the validation numbers must appear on the CVI and the most recent quarterly herd test date (month, day and year) must be stated on the CVI.
- iii. MARKET HOGS (JR. SHOW, OPEN SHOW AND TRUCKLOADS) ARE NOT REQUIRED TO BE INDIVIDUALLY TESTED FOR PRV AND BRUCELLOSIS

B. VACCINATIONS:

- i. All breeding swine coming to the show MUST be vaccinated against leptospirosis (6-way) including bratislava and erysipelas.
 - The complete date of vaccination MUST be listed on the health certificate. Market animals should not be vaccinated.
 - b. It is strongly recommended that breeding animals are vaccinated for swine influenza.
- In some instances, these requirements are in addition to the state of Minnesota regulations. However, they are necessary in meeting other state requirements for purchasers of open show animals through sales as animals are reconsigned to new destinations.


